WHEREAS, “Martin Luther King, Jr. Day” is observed on the third (3rd) Monday of January each year, and this year it falls on January 19, 2026; and it is designated as a “National Day of Service” and is an official Guam holiday to commemorate the life and legacy of Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., who was the voice of the American civil rights movement which promoted racial equality and helped to end racial segregation in the United States; and

WHEREAS, the campaign for a federal holiday in Dr. King's honor began soon after his assassination in 1968. President Ronald Reagan signed the holiday into law in 1983, and it was first observed three (3) years later on January 20, 1986; and

WHEREAS, the national “MLK Day of Service” was started by former Pennsylvania U.S. Senator Harris Wofford and Atlanta Congressman John Lewis, who co-authored the “King Holiday and Service Act”; and the federal legislation signed into law by President Bill Clinton on August 23, 1994 challenges Americans to transform the King Holiday into a day of citizen action volunteer service in honor of Dr. King; and
