1 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I**
2 ***MINA'TRENTAI OCHO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:***

3 **WHEREAS,** the late Honorable Luis S.N. Herrero, former Mayor of Tamuning,
4 was a distinguished son of Guam, born on April 8, 1929, in the historic village of
5 Hagåtña to Francisco Leon Guerrero Herrero and Josefa Lujan San Nicolas and was the
6 youngest of six (6) children; and

1 **WHEREAS**, his journey of service began in his youth when he answered the call
2 of duty by registering for the United States draft in 1949, a testament to a lifelong spirit
3 of patriotism and readiness to serve his nation and his island; and

4 **WHEREAS**, his fun, loving nature, caught the eye of his wife, Leonila Torre
5 Leon Guerrero, whom he married on September 9, 1950, beginning a lifelong
6 partnership anchored by seven (7) decades of covenant love; and

7 **WHEREAS**, together they raised a devoted family, including their five (5)
8 children: Barbara, Francis, Jeanne, Gary, and Dwayne; and were further blessed with
9 eight (8) grandchildren and six (6) great-grandchildren, all of whom remain a living
10 testament to his guidance; and

11 **WHEREAS**, for over three (3) decades (1954-1986), he faithfully served the
12 United States Civil Service, working as a Maintenance Foreman and Supervisor for the
13 Navy Public Works Center in the Air-Conditioning and Refrigeration Department; and

14 **WHEREAS**, his distinguished career included service at the U.S. Naval Base in
15 Rota, Spain, where he supervised critical operations supporting areas such as: the Naval
16 Hospital, Airport, and Command Center, and where he had the honor of meeting former
17 President Richard Nixon; and

18 **WHEREAS**, upon returning to Guam in 1973, he continued to serve with
19 dedication, overseeing essential facilities across multiple naval and air force
20 installations in areas such as: Radio Barrigada, Naval Communication Stations, Naval
21 Air Station, Naval Hospital and other locations on Navy and Air Force Bases; and

22 **WHEREAS**, between 1980-1985, he transitioned from a master of industry to a
23 master of mentorship, dedicating himself to the training of Government of Guam and
24 Trust Territory personnel until he eventually retired in 1986; and

25 **WHEREAS**, he was a pillar of the Catholic faith, and in 1992, served in
26 leadership roles within St. Anthony Parish, including Vice-President of the Holy Name
27 Society, and as a member of several parish committees; and

1 **WHEREAS**, he served as a Faithful Navigator, Faithful Captain and Faithful
2 Admiral of the St. Jude assembly, serving in numerous leadership positions, and
3 ultimately becoming an honorary lifetime member after more than twenty (20) years of
4 service; and

5 **WHEREAS**, in 1996, he rose to the highest echelons of the Knights of Columbus
6 as a Grand Knight, embodying the virtues of charity and fraternity through decades of
7 honorary lifetime service; and

8 **WHEREAS**, from 1997 to 2001, he transitioned his private-sector discipline into
9 public-sector leadership as the Mayor of Tamuning, Tumon and Harmon, where he
10 championed beautification efforts, tirelessly advocating for the infrastructure and
11 recreational spaces that fueled the village's economic and social vitality; and

12 **WHEREAS**, he also included in his office a community funded computer to
13 assist constituents with access to employment resources; and

14 **WHEREAS**, beyond his professional accolades, Mayor Herrero was known for
15 his joyful spirit, kindness, creativity and sense of humor, often encouraging individuals
16 and seeing their value and encouraging their community involvement; and

17 **WHEREAS**, he was a lifelong teacher and mentor who believed in sharing
18 knowledge, fostering understanding, and creating meaningful, teachable moments for
19 all those around him; and

20 **WHEREAS**, he will be fondly remembered for his signature suspenders, his
21 warm smile, his jokes and his unmistakable presence in the community, often seen
22 driving his beloved yellow Maserati—a symbol of a man who approached life with as
23 much style as he did substance; and

24 **WHEREAS**, his philosophy of leadership was rooted in the "*teachable*
25 *moments*," as he possessed the rare gift of seeing untapped potential in every individual
26 and the patience to cultivate it through kindness and encouragement; now therefore, be
27 it

1 **RESOLVED**, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'trentai Ocho Na*
2 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people
3 of Guam, posthumously recognizing the late Honorable Mayor Luis S.N. Herrero,
4 former Mayor of Tamuning, for his dedication to the island of Guam, and
5 commemorating his legacy of service; and expressing condolence to his family on his
6 passing on behalf of the people of Guam; and be it further

7 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on Rules
8 certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of
9 the same be thereafter transmitted to the family of the late Honorable Luis S.N. Herrero;
10 and to the Honorable Lourdes A. Leon Guerrero, *I Maga'hågan Guåhan*.
