**Relative to posthumously honoring the life and legacy of †Antonio A. Calvo, former Commissioner of the Municipality of Yigo; and further recognizing his decades of devoted public service, steadfast leadership, and enduring contributions to the people of Guam.**

1 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I**  
2 ***MINA'TRENTAI OCHO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:***

3 **WHEREAS, †Antonio A. Calvo, born on June 5, 1927, to Gregorio Leon**  
4 **Guerrero Calvo and Maria Rosario Acosta Calvo, was the youngest of seven children—**  
5 **Rita Calvo Artero, Maria Calvo Flores, Manuel Calvo, Pedro Calvo, Gregorio Calvo,**

1 Jose Flores, and Antonio Flores, and was raised with an enduring commitment to faith,  
2 family, and service; and

3 **WHEREAS**, Antonio married Celestina Pangelinan on July 23, 1955, and  
4 together they built a strong and loving family, raising eleven (11) children—Elena,  
5 Tina, Juanita, Anthony, Eduardo, Teresa, Patricia, Celena, Corina, Gregorio, and  
6 Manuel, instilling in them the same values of humility, compassion, and dedication to  
7 community that guided his own life; and

8 **WHEREAS**, Antonio began his journey in public service as a File Clerk in the  
9 Governor’s Office from 1951–1952, later commissioned by Governor Carlton Skinner  
10 as a Second Lieutenant to the first regiment of the Guam Militia, where he faithfully  
11 served from 1952 to 1954, demonstrating patriotism and leadership in service to island  
12 and country; and

13 **WHEREAS**, he later served at the Governor’s Office/Passport Office from  
14 1954–1968, contributing to essential government operations during a time of rapid  
15 growth and change for Guam; and

16 **WHEREAS**, Antonio was elected Commissioner of the Village of Yigo, serving  
17 three (3) full terms from 1969 to 1981, where he worked tirelessly to uplift his  
18 community with dignity, quiet strength, and a commitment to improving the quality of  
19 life for every resident; and

20 **WHEREAS**, during his leadership as Commissioner, he spearheaded important  
21 initiatives including the 1969 American Red Cross Fundraising Campaign in Yigo,  
22 demonstrating his dedication to humanitarian causes and community welfare; and

23 **WHEREAS**, beyond local government service, Antonio contributed  
24 significantly to island-wide civic progress, including serving as an Election  
25 Commission Clerk for Yigo in 1956, and participating in Guam’s First Constitutional  
26 Convention from 1969–1970, reviewing the Organic Act of Guam and recommending

1 revisions to the United States Congress during 44 General Sessions, helping shape the  
2 framework of Guam’s governmental identity; and

3       **WHEREAS**, Antonio continued his public service as Deputy Director of Guam  
4 Mass Transit from 1982–1984, and later was honored as Grand Marshal of the 2011  
5 Liberation Day Parade, recognized for his lifetime of community leadership and  
6 service; and

7       **WHEREAS**, during his years of public service, Antonio collaborated and  
8 worked for the Guam Legislature as a Community Service Worker II from 1997 to 2003  
9 under the late Honorable Speaker Antonio Unpingco, prior to that he served under the  
10 late Senator Ernesto Espaldon and late Speaker Tommy Tanaka, forging strong  
11 partnerships to develop programs and resources for the people of Guam; and

12       **WHEREAS**, throughout his life, Antonio Calvo was known not merely for the  
13 positions he held, but for the kindness, humor, humility, and steadiness with which he  
14 carried them—quietly improving lives, leading with integrity, and strengthening the  
15 island through example; and

16       **WHEREAS**, Antonio leaves behind a profound legacy of love, service, and  
17 faith—one that continues to live through his family, the village of Yigo, and the  
18 countless lives touched by his leadership; now therefore, be it

19       **RESOLVED**, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'trentai Ocho Na*  
20 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people  
21 of Guam, honor and recognize the life and legacy of †Antonio A. Calvo for his decades  
22 of faithful and distinguished service to the people of Guam; and be it further

23       **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on Rules  
24 certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of  
25 the same be thereafter transmitted to the Calvo Family, the Municipality of Yigo; and  
26 to the Honorable Lourdes A. Leon Guerrero, *I Maga'hågan Guåhan*.
