

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#### **TESTIMONY ON BILL 41-38 COR**

Good afternoon. My name is Ricardo T. Guerrero, retired electrical contractor and resident of Dededo. My residential address is

Before I begin, I would like to give thanks to the Chairman and the rest of the committee in allowing me to present my testimony on Bill No 41-38 COR.

I'd like to begin my testimony by presenting a brief history of the place called Janom. In 1886, a young man named Jose Aguon Flores bought a piece of property from Don Louis Herrero for 30 pesos. The land was described to be bounded by four mountains. There was no agreement drawn out but just a verbal gentlemen's agreement and an exchange of money, like most transactions done at that time.

When the US took over the island from Spain after the Spanish–American War, a General Order was issued that all landowners must register their land for the purpose of assessment of tax. Mr. Flores recorded his land called Janom to be his own and since he did not have any document to show his ownership, he presented witnesses by the name of Don Juan Mendiola and Joaquin de Rivera. The land was recorded on October 18, 1900, that Jose Aguon Flores was the owner of Janom, a place bounded by four mountains having an area of 10 hectares. (Refer to SK No.1) This property was assigned as Estate No. 832. In October 1, 1926, Mr. Flores sold Janom to Mr. Jesus D. Cruz, his son-in-law, married to his youngest daughter, Juliana for 500.00 Dollars. But, in April 19, 1927, Mr. Flores regained back his land through a Court Order. In February 4, 1930, Mr. Flores sold the major port of Janom to another son-in-law, Juan San Nicolas Taitano, married to his older daughter Rosario, for 350.00 Dollars. This property was described as a parcel of land containing an area of eight hectares and was bounded on North and South by cliffs owned by the Naval Government of Guam, and on the East by the Beach owned by the Naval Government of Guam and on the West by the remaining Part of Estate No.832. This property was assigned Estate No.4138. (Refer to SK No. 2)

In fiscal year 1934, Mr. Juan SN Taitano, being a proud and stubborn man, having heard that someone was claiming ownership of Janom, refused to pay the land tax on the property. As a result, the Naval Government of Guam put a lien on the property and auctioned it. Having no takers, the Naval Government of Guam took possession of estate No. 4138 and recorded the estate as being owned by the US Government. However, on February 11, 1936, Mr. Juan SN Taitano's wife, Rosario, redeemed the property by paying all taxes due with interest. She paid a total of 8.52 Dollars.

The Warranty Deed that conveyed the property to Rosario Flores Taitano, described the property as parcel of land containing an area of about eight hectares, bounded on the North

and South by cliff owned by the Naval Government of Guam, on the East by a beach owned by the Naval Government of Guam and on the West by the property of Jose A Flores, her father. From the time of the conveyance of the property known as Estate no 4138 to the time the family of Juan SN and Rosario F. Taitano had the property surveyed, the family had believed that the entire property was their own. But the research of the property recorded by Surveyor Robert Beam, proved otherwise.

On July 30, 1938, after having three parcels of land surveyed in Janom, the Naval Government of Guam registered the land under the Government of the United States, having acquired it by seccession of Spain by virtue of Article Eight of the Treaty of Peace. These parcels of Land became Lot Nos. 7100, 7102 and 7103. Estate No. 4138 became Lot No. 7099 and the remaining part of Estate No. 832 became Lot No. 7101. (Refer to SK No. 3)

In the land Registration Case No. 57-75 for initial registration of Lot No. 7099NEW by the Taitanos (Refer to SK No. 4) and Land Registration Case No.75-75, initial registration of Lot No. 7146 by the Government of Guam (Refer to SK No. 5), lands were overlapping and overlaying in the maps of both cases. The Taitano's representative objected to the Decree establishing Titles to Lot No.s 7100,7102 and 7103 rendered in August 10, 1938 because they were not served any notice nor did they see or hear any notice of the hearing.

After all the arguments were presented to Judge Benson, the judge decided not to disturb the Decree of Judge Manibusan allowing the United States Government to register Lot No.s 7100, 7102 and 7103. But Judge Benson did allow the Taitanos to register all land in Janom outside Lot No.s 7100, 7102 and 7103. Finally the family was able to register their land after the approval of the map drawn by Surveyor Frank Castro on August 3, 2012.

While I accepted the decision of Judge Benson in his Memorandum of Decision where he stated that the Taitanos cannot claim Lot No.s 7100, 7102 and 7103, I honestly believe that the Naval Government of Guam were in error when they decided that Janom was described by its area rather than its boundaries. It had natural monuments for its boundaries such as cliff and beach. GCA Chapter 8101, Rules For Construing Land Descriptions Item 2 states "When permanent and visible or ascertained boundaries or monuments are inconsistent with measurement, either lines, angles or surfaces, the boundaries and monuments are paramount.

I'd like to further discuss how the United States of America acquired Lot No.s 7100, 7102 and 7103. When the Naval Government took possession of Estate No. 4138 for failure to pay the tax, the government sent their surveyors to Janom to survey. Seeing that the area of the property was much larger than what was indicated in the land record, the Naval Government of Guam decided to confine all private land to only ten hectares as shown in the land record. They first surveyed two parcels of land, Lot No. 7100 and 7103, within the original Estate No. 832. The remainder of Estate No. 832 outside of Lot No.s 7100 and 7103 was then identified as Lot No. 7099 and 7101, an area of approximately 10 hectares, which were bound by the newly surveyed and claimed Naval properties. (Refer to SK No. 3)

It is a known that when the United States Government wants to take something, they would use every means they can and take the best part available, for example, Sumay, Fena, NCS,

Ritidian, the large tract of land on the right side of Route 1 from Dededo to Yigo, etc. In Janom, there is a very valuable resource available in the area, an underground spring that flows out into sea. At one time it was estimated that at its lowest flow, more than a million gallons of water was flowing out into the sea.

When the Naval Government determined that the Janom springs was not included in the two parcels they surveyed, they sent the surveyors back to make sure that the takings included Janom Springs. Hence, they surveyed another Parcel of land, namely Lot No. 7102 and added to their takings. If they only wanted to confine the private properties, the two parcels they originally surveyed were more than adequate.

During the hearing for the registration of Lot Nos. 7100, 7102 and 7103, it was stated that no one appeared to object to the registration of the properties. No doubt, there was no one appearing to object to the registration of these properties, if the government did not make real effort to issue out a notice, especially since the government controlled both the radio wave and printed media.

In dealing with the question of the size of Janom, it was originally guess-timated to be 10 hectares by Mr. Jose Flores when he recorded Janom in 1900. The size remained the same until the Naval Government surveyed Lot No.s 7100 and 7103, boxing in the private properties, namely Lot Nos. 7101 and Lot No. 7099 to the 10 hectares combined. They did this by taking Lot No. 7100 at the North side of the private properties and on the South side, they took Lot No. 7103, the East side was the beach and West side was the Cliff, owned by the Naval Government of Guam.

The area of Janom remained the same from 1938 to the final approved map drawn by Mr. Castro.

Approaching the question of the area of Janom through the tax assessment on the property, from 1930 to the beginning of the Second World War, the property owned by Juan SN Taitano was assessed Tax for the size of the land of eight hectares by the Naval Government of Guam. After the war, in 1953, the family was assessed tax for an area of 100 hectares. In 1954 thru 1956, the property was assessed for an area of 8 hectares. In 1957 thru 1963, the assessments were for 100 hectares. The assessment for 1964 was back to 8 hectares and from 1965 thru 1975, the assessments were for 100 hectares. These assessments from 1976 up thru 2013, based on the payments, the area was estimated to be 131 hectares as a result of the initial Land Registration map submitted, but never approved, by Mr. Robert Beam in 1976. From 2014 to the present, the tax assessments have been for an area of 83.2 hectares, in accordance with the DLM approved map drawn by Mr. Frank Castro. In conclusion, the average size of property being assessed over the years has been 100 hectares.

I have sketches to clearly show the chain of events on Janom. The sketches were drawn on a Goggle map showing the aerial view of the area. It clearly shows the cliff line as well as the beach line.

- Sketch no. 1 shows the area when it was bought by Jose Aguon Flores from Don Louis Herrero.
- Sketch No. 2 shows the area that Juan SN Taitano bought, the major part of Estate 832, from Jose Flores and became Estate No. 4138.
- Sketch No. 3 shows the area when the Naval Government of Guam acquired and registered Lot Nos. 7100, 7102 and 7103.
- Sketch No. 4 shows the area surveyed by Robert Beam, identified as Lot No. 7099 NEW.
- Sketch No. 5 shows the Lot No. 7146 which also claims a portion of Janom, with an overlap.
- Sketch No. 6 shows the most recent survey description approved by Department of Land Management.

We recognize that the government has registered Lot No.s 7100, 7102 and 7103. I hope that I made it clear that these same lots were part of, or rather taken from, the Estate No. 4138 and the remainder of Estate No. 832. Further, these same Lot No.s 7100, 7102 and 7103 are considered excess lands and should be transferred to the Ancestral Lands Commission for their disposition as these were considered private property prior to the registration of properties by the U.S. Naval Government.

This is not the first time for our family to make a claim for the return of our land. We petitioned the return of our land from the Ancestral Lands Commission and placed a claim for the return. This was around 2009, if my memory serves me. At the time of the petition, I felt that we had the support of the Commission and all those present. In fact, the representatives from the Attorney General's Office were present and while they objected to the process for how the lands were transferred to the Ancestral Lands Commission, they did not object to the return of lands to the original landowners. They were the party to advise that the family seek action from the Legislature to legally transfer the property so the family can finally file their claim. As you can imagine, the family has made several attempts with various senators to take corrective measures to transfer the property in the correct and legal manner. And I would like to thank Senator Joe San Agustin for introducing this Bill 41-38 COR and for the committee for hearing this bill, and taking the initial steps to correct the actions that have stalled the proper return of Ancestral Lands

It's been a very long journey for our family to regain our properties which were taken by the U.S. Government. The family would like the opportunity to file a claim to properties which we believe were originally part of the family estate, the estate of my Grandparents, Juan SN and Rosario Flores Taitano.

My name is Francisco Taitano Guerrero, Grandson of John San Nicolas Taitano & Rosario Flores Taitano and Administrator for the Estate of John San Nicolas Taitano and Rosario Flores Taitano.

First, I would like to thank you for Introducing Bill No. 41-38 (COR) to transferring Lots NOS. 7100, 7102, 7103, and 7146 called Janom in the municipality of Yigo Guam, to the Guam Ancestral Land Use Commission, Proposed by Senator Joe San Agustin.

I am here today to testify in full support of Bill 41-38 COR.

Records indicate that the estate of my grandparents, John San Nicolas Taitano and Rosario Flores Taitano, has cultivated and inhabited this land in Yigo for many generations. The Taitano family has been the sole occupants of this property.

My grandmother, Rosario Flores Taitano, tirelessly fought against the naval government's attempts to seize our land through increased land taxes. A quote from my uncle, former Senator Richard F. Taitano, reflects this struggle: "A naval commander, Richard P. Leary, remarked that Guamanians should not own large parcels of land because they are "ignorant and dumb." Consequently, they attempted to take my grandparents' land by raising back taxes. My grandmother promptly paid the exorbitant land taxes to ensure the property would always remain in the Taitano family.

According to Guampedia, in 1899, shortly after his arrival, Captain Richard P. Leary abolished the old Spanish tax system and implemented a new land tax, the Schedule of Tariffs for the Island of Guam. Unlike the Spanish system, which taxed based on the income derived from the property, Leary's tax system was based on the size and type of land. This new taxation proved so burdensome that many CHamorus lost their land to the naval government. Furthermore, this policy led landowners, fearing the loss of their property, to undervalue the size and worth of their land.

Leary also established the "forced labor tax," requiring all males between the ages of 18 and 60 to work for the governor for 15 days a year. This approach was part of an effort to extract funds from the CHamorus to govern the newly acquired territory. Meanwhile, Leary and the other American officials paid no direct taxes, and any goods used by the Navy were exempt from duty.

Leary issued General Order No. 15, warning landowners to register their properties by May 15, 1899, if they wished to have their ownership recognized. Taxes were due in July. This initiated what former Senator Richard F. Taitano termed the "Crown-landization" of CHamoru lands—the conversion of privately-owned lands into Spanish Crown lands. The naval government concluded that any land not registered by the May 15 deadline would be considered Spanish Crown land, which was subsequently acquired by the U.S. through harsh taxation, intimidation, and other means.

General Order No. 15 forced the CHamorus into a dilemma: either register their properties accurately and risk losing them due to unpaid taxes, or avoid registration and lose them due to improper documentation. Many CHamorus who owned parcels in villages or farmland had to decide which lots to protect. As the naval government began discovering

"mistakes" in lot size declarations, they started registering these lands as government property, with some declarations occurring over 35 years after the U.S. took possession of Guam from Spain.

I would like to read a quote from Guampedia's article on land ownership in Guam:

"The Mariana Islands are the ancestral homeland of the CHamoru people. Scientists have shown that CHamorus have lived here for more than 4,000 years, sharing a unique and special relationship with the land and sea. CHamorus are commonly referred to as 'taotao tano' which literally means 'people of the land'; it also indicates that a person is native to these islands. Land is the soul of CHamoru culture. Together with the sea, it gives life to the CHamoru people. The history of the CHamorus amplifies the role land played in the lives of their ancestors. The ancient CHamorus, like their ancestors from Southeast Asia, believed that all of Nature had an essence or spirit that Westerners reserve only for humans. Consequently, the ancient CHamorus—like other native peoples—had a great concern for Nature. They attempted to live in harmony with Nature and integrate their lives with all that is in Nature. In the ancient CHamoru worldview, humans and Nature were interdependent. People felt it was wrong to exploit Nature and that they should take only what they need and leave the rest for others."

Honorable Senators, I hope my testimony will positively influence the Taitano family and lead to a favorable decision on Bill No. 41-38.

To this day, the Taitano family has paid numerous land taxes on the large parcel of land called Janom in question. I would like to yield the floor to my older brother, Ricardo T. Guerrero, whose knowledge of these properties will best illustrate the historical facts.

In closing, we strongly believe that land deserves protection, and it is the responsibility of the Taitano family to safeguard our land.

Regarding Bill No. 41-38 (COR), the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission would like to offer the following points for your consideration.

First, please note that the formal name of our agency is the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission.

Second, concerning line 4 of the bill, we respectfully suggest replacing the phrase "originally owned" with "claimed."

Third, we would appreciate clarification regarding the entity responsible for transferring the properties specified in the bill to the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission. Our agency has identified existing deeds (Instrument numbers 665867, 665872, 665881, and 665875) that appear to have previously transferred these lots to GALC. We wish to understand if this bill is intended to address these existing deeds and, if so, what action should be taken concerning them.

Finally, we wish to bring to your attention written testimony submitted to the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission on June 18, 2009, during a Title Hearing. This testimony, provided by the Government of Guam through AAG Steve Newman, legal counsel for the Department of Land Management, urged the Commission to consider certified documents and Guam Superior Court rulings.

The recommendation at that time was to find that claimants are not entitled to the land, as the Government of Guam maintains that the land should remain under government ownership.

#### **BACKGROUND**

This matter previously came before the commission on April 15, 2009. The Claimants, stating their appearance as representatives of the Estate of John Taitano and Rosario F. Taitano, assert an ownership interest in the subject property based on the alleged payment of taxes.

The Government of Guam, however, respectfully disagrees with claimant's assertion to an ownership interest in the subject property. As noted by undersigned counsel on April 15, 2009, the ownership of property was the issue in Land Registration Case Nos. LR0035-75, and LR0057-75. A certified copy of the Court's March 20, 1979 order was submitted for the Ancestral Land Commission's consideration. As noted, the Court found that:

- (1) The government is entitled to the registration of all of Lot No. 7146 which lies outside of Lot 7099NEW Yigo.
- (2) Tatiano is entitled to the registration of all of Lot 7099NEW, except the portion previously registered to the government and known as Lot Nos. 7100, 7102 and 7103, Yigo.

should be closed, provided that the precise metes and bounds are still to be determined after final survey work is completed in Land Registration Case Nos. LR0035-75 and LR0057-75.

As cited in other proceedings before the Ancestral Lands Commission, "Res Judicata or claim preclusion...is 'the doctrine by which a judgment on the merits in a prior suit bars the second suit involving the parties or their privies based on the same cause of action." (*Zahnen v. Limtiaco*, 2008 Guam 5, ¶10. The *Zahnen* case held that to invoke claim preclusion as a defense, a party must prove the presence of the following elements: (1) a final judgment on the merits in an earlier suit, (2) an identity of the causes of action in both the earlier and the later suit, and (3) an identity by the parties or their privies in the two suits. *Id.* at p. 5-6. (citations omitted). "Res Judicata prevents litigation of all grounds for, or defenses to, recoveries that were previously available to the parties, regardless of whether they were asserted or determined in the prior proceeding." Brown v. Felsen, 442 U.S. 127, 131, 99 S.Ct. 2205 (1979).

A majority of the circuits have adopted the transactional approach test. <u>See</u>, <u>In re International Nutronics</u>, <u>Inc.</u>, 28 F.3d 965, 970-971 (9<sup>th</sup> Cir.). Claims have "identity" if they emerged from the same "core of operative facts." <u>See</u>, <u>Brzostowski v. Laidlaw Waste Systems</u>, <u>Inc.</u>, 49 F.3d 337, 339 (7<sup>th</sup> Cir. 1995). It is to be noted that a judgment in a prior action will preclude another action based on the same facts and asserted injury even though the subsequent action asserts a different legal theory to justify recovery. <u>See</u>, <u>Nevada v. U.S.</u>, 463 U.S. 110, 129-130 (1983); <u>International Union of Operating Engineers v. Carr</u>, 994 F.2d 1426, 1430-1431 (9<sup>th</sup> Cir. 1993) (Union's claim for underpayment of contributions to pension fund precluded by prior action which sought to collect delinquent payments to fund).

The issue of ownership of the subject property in Janom has been decided prior

judicial proceedings. As such, the issue must be closed and can not be re-litigated before the Ancestral Lands Commission or any other tribunal or authority.

The Government of Guam respects the power and authority of the Ancestral Lands Commission with regard to properties entrusted to its stewardship by the Legislature. The Government of Guam respectfully submits, however, that the Janom property is not subject to disbursement to claimants based on the evidence submitted in support of their claim and on the undisputed certified land records that have bee presented for the Ancestral Land Commission's review.

Accordingly, the Government of Guam respectfully requests that the prior decisions with respect to the Janom property be upheld.

### II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

Vice Speaker V. Anthony Ada, Chairman - Committee on Land, Environment, Happiness, Agriculture, Parks and Infrastructure: Håfa adai and good afternoon, everyone. Thank you for

being here at the public hearing for the following bills: Bill No. 41-38 (COR), Bill No. 51-38 (COR) and Bill No. 73-38 (COR).

Good afternoon, ladies and gentlemen. This public hearing conducted by the Committee on Land, Environment, Housing, Agriculture, Parks, and Infrastructure and is called to order at 2 o'clock PM. Today's date is Thursday, May 22nd, 2025. Notice of the hearing was disseminated to all local media outlets on May 15, 2025, with the second notice provide on May 20, 2025. Notice of the hearing was also made known on the Guam Legislature's website and the Government of Guam Public Notice Portal.

This afternoon, the committee will hear testimony on the following bills: Bill No. 41-38 (COR) sponsored by Senator Joe S. San Agustin - AN ACT TO ADD A NEW (j) TO § 80105 OF CHAPTER 80, TITLE 21 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED RELATIVE TO TRANSFERRING LOT NOS. 7100, 7102, 7103 AND 7146 IN JANOM, IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF YIGO, GUAM, TO THE GUAM ANCESTRAL LAND USE COMMISSION.; Bill No. 51-38 (COR) sponsored by Senator Shawn Gumataotao - AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 2 OF PUBLIC LAW 34-61, RELATIVE TO TRANSFERRING THE TITLE OF OWNERSHIP OF LOT NO. 7054-1, MUNICIPALITY OF YIGO, FROM THE CHAMORRO LAND TRUST COMMISSION TO THE GUAM POLICE DEPARTMENT.; and Bill No. 73-38 (COR), also sponsored by Senator Shawn Gumataotao - AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE TRANSFER OF THE TITLE OF OWNERSHIP AND ADMINISTRATIVE JURISDICTION OF LOT 15, BLOCK F, TRACT 9 IN BARRIGADA HEIGHTS FROM THE CHAMORRO LAND TRUST COMMISSION TO THE GUAM POLICE DEPARTMENT FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF A PUBLIC SAFETY EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS CENTER.

I would like to welcome my colleagues joining us, today. On my right is Senator Shawn Gumataotao to my left Senator Joe San Agustin and Senator Therese Terlaje, thank you, colleagues, for joining us here, today. Before we begin, I would like to go over the general rules of conduct. Individuals testifying shall first be recognized by the chair before speaking and shall state their name for recordkeeping purposes. Questions and testimony shall be confined to the substance and nature of the agenda. Personal inference as to the character or motive of any senator or individual testifying is not permitted. The chairperson of the committee may order the removal from the hearing of any member of I 'Liheslaturan Guahan who fails to observe proper decorum pursuant to the 38th Guam Legislature standing rules. Any violation of this rule of conduct will result in the removal from the hearing by the host.

We will now proceed to hear testimony on bill number 41-38 (COR), uh before I do that, what I would like to do is go ahead and read a letter from the uh Chamorro Land Trust Commission and this was uh just delivered today and it subject is the public hearing for bill numbers 51-38 and bill number 73-38 and it reads, "Håfa Adai Vice Speaker Ada, I respectfully request to reschedule the public hearing today, May 22nd, 2025, for bill numbers 51-38 and bill number 73-38 at a later date. The Chamorro Land Trust Commission, the CLTC board meeting is as mandated by law, holds its regular board meeting on the third Thursday of every month, which is today and they are currently in their public in in their board hearing and this was by the chairwoman Arlene P. Bordallo, but with that being said, we will continue to have the public hearing for both bills. However, I will allow additional time for testimony and any uh comments that the Chamorro Land Trust Commission may have on uh pertaining to the two bills uh that were for mentioned. Uh, with that, I'll go ahead and call to the podium. I guess everyone is uh that'll be testifying on uh bill number 41-38 (COR). I'll have the author go ahead and have this opening remarks. Thank you everyone for being here.

**Senator Joe S. San Agustin – Primary Sponsor:** Thank you. Thank you, Mr. Chairman and Buenas Yan Håfa Adai to all my colleagues and everyone attending. Before we start, I will be proposing an amendment to the bill just in the title to cross the word "use." Why? because on the title it says um to

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transfer to the Guam Ancestral Land Use Commission. There's no Guam Ancestral Land "Use," just Guam Ancestral Land Commission. Okay, that's the only amendment, but we're here today to discuss an act on a topic that is essential to Guam's history, culture, and justice for families who have long yearned to restore their ancestral lands. We are specifically dealing with lots transfers of lots number 7100, 7102, 7103 and 7146 which are in the Janom neighborhood of the municipality of Yigo and were formerly owned by the estate of John S.N. Taitano and Rosario F. Taitano. In addition to their legal significance, these land pieces hold great cultural and familial significance. Within 30 days of this act's effective date, the proposed action guarantees that this land be formally transferred to Guam Ancestral Land Commission. The commission will then have 180 days to fulfill its duties which are based on justice reparation. Some of these words excuse me and the proper restoration of land to the original proprietors' descendants. Crucially, the law that safeguards useful and historic access points, all pre condemnation, roads, assessment, and bull cart paths will remain public easement, guaranteeing that community infrastructure and access requirements are met. This goes beyond a simple land deal. It is an ongoing statement of our government's duty to make amends for historical wrongs, restore landowners' families dignity, and respect the history of our forebears. For decades, the descendants of the Taitano family have been working to get these loads transferred properly to the Chamorro Ancestral Land Commission. As designation is required, it will close the door on the work that generations of this family have long endured to seek justice in their lands taking and thank you, Mr. Chair, for hearing this bill and today, we all have participated in today's hearing. Thank you, Mr. Chair.

**Chairman Ada:** Thank you, Senator San Agustin. I'd also like to recognize my colleague Senator Barnett and Senator Taitague for joining us here this afternoon. Thank you, senators. I we'll go ahead and um those that would be providing oral uh testimony. Lillian Guerrero and Ricardo Guerrero and anyone else will be okay because I only have the two of you that will be providing.

**Mr. Francisco Guerrero:** Actually, uh I'm the brother but I have my wife with me and so uh during my portion of the presentation I would like to ask my wife to help me out in this because she's got better vision than I do.

Chairman Ada: Okay, that's fine what we'll do is we'll go ahead and then uh have uh your wife do your testimony for you. Uh if you can just pull the microphones closer to your so that everyone in the audience will be able to hear.

Mr. F. Guerrero: Are you ready? All right.

Chairman Ada: You're going to be, just make your mic closer.

**Mr. F. Guerrero:** Can you hear me? All right. Here we go. Let's start. My name is Francisco Taitano Guerrero, and I belong to this family that we that we're going to be talking about their property up in Yigo, with me is my wife and partner for forever and she helped me put some kind of presentation together in support of the bill that we have. All right. So, at this point, I'd like to introduce my wife, Lillian, and she will then address the uh our writings. Okay.

**Ms. Lillian Guerrero:** Good afternoon, senators. My name is Lilian Opeña Guerrero, spouse of Francisco Taitano Guerrero. [Written testimony prepared by Mr. Francisco Guerrero presented orally.]

**Chairman Ada:** Thank you, ma'am, for that testimony on behalf of your husband uh Francisco. We'll go ahead and uh go with um Ricardo to deliver your testimony, sir.

**Mr. Ricardo Guerrero:** Thank you. I um asked my daughter to sit with me because I have this problem of in speaking to in the public. I tend to freeze, have a panic attack.

**Chairman Ada:** No problem. She can be there for your support as well as if she needs to read it for you.

**Mr. R. Guerrero:** should I falter, I want her to take over.

Chairman Ada: Yes, sir. Not a problem.

**Mr. R. Guerrero:** Thank you, sir. [Written testimony presented orally]

**Chairman Ada:** Thank you, sir, and like thank you for your testimony. Saina, you wanted to provide testimony.

Ms. Rosita Birdwell: May I please have few minutes?

Chairman Ada: Yes.

Ms. Birdwell: I do not have anything written down to read but my name is Rosita Taitano Birdwell. I am one of the administrators for my grandmother. One is in Taitano and Rosario Flores Taitano. I was raised by my great uh grandparents after my parents died. I cannot say that I regretted being there with old people, but I'm going to tell you I am very thankful that I had all of them because I've learned a lot. I have worked for a long time; I got married in 1954. I didn't graduate from George Washington High. However, I did pass eighth grade at the Dededo Elementary School. I was uh noted as the uh the representative from the university that my level in English is 12th grade and my level in math is 11th grade. I did graduate the top of class, and I am very proud of it. Now talking about my grandparents, oh my goodness. I've always said that if there's a heaven, my grandmother's in it, but otherwise, my grandfather's in charge of the other department because he doesn't put up with anybody. Even during the war he was blind in 1934, now the Japanese bombed in 1941. My grandfather was outside cutting the grass by feeling it, sitting on a stool and trimming it with this knife. I learned to do a lot of cooking too and I'm very proud of it because now I do I do a lot of baking by hand. I don't use machine. Don't forget we don't have any machine before then, but my grand, my father the oldest boy in the family is almost like the man that's in charge of the all the labor departments and everything, so if they have anything to do at the ranch, my grandmother will call the meeting and tell my father this is what you guys would have to do and it gets done. There's nothing that we didn't have. I am glad that I we survived at concentration camp, and I am going to say that God has blessed us all to that because we were never hungry. We didn't have any guns, but my brothers were very skilled in slingshots, and we even had uh bird soup or barbecued uh birds and that with their slingshots, so I am very grateful for that. I cannot say that I can criticize anybody here that have gone through any war and even you people are all working very hard. I have attended at some of the meetings here and I have to commend Dr. Terlaje. I was here one time, and I really feel very bad and very sorry for the way that the meeting went, but anyways, that's the way it is. I don't think that everybody is really slow. It's the timing that we have when we're thinking about something. When you think of something that is going to benefit all of us on the island, then you bring it to somebody or that's what the Congress all about and bring it and don't, you know, make up your mind, decide and discuss it. Don't just say you're out of order, you're out of order, you listen to whatever the senator has to say before any of you would tell whoever wants to speak to say you're out of order. You know, I don't like to speak either. I'm not I don't like to like I said, I cannot I could probably I started to write a book in 1952, and I was in Michigan, the state of Michigan. That's where my husband, I married a guy that was in the Navy and he had to take an early discharge because his parents were old people and they needed help, so he had to go home and he did, but anyways, he was very good to me taking care of me and taking care of I had my first baby in Michigan and that was great, so, but I also took upon myself when my husband started working that I cannot just sit at home so, I started working. I worked for the police department in in Michigan, I also work for the school board, I substituted I form a Girl Scout troop, and I work with them, and I also

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work I retired as a branch manager for the Bank of the United States, Bank of America. That's my last job, retired as a bank manager for Bank of America. I was voted into being an administrator in 2006. They had a meeting and everybody, even my cousins, all wondered who I was? Who is that lady? How come she's asking about a certain kind of account? I just retired from a bank, so I'm yes. I want to know what kind of you know account do they have where you can withdraw or do you have enough money for whatever the problem is. So, I finally had to introduce myself to my cousin. I went over and I introduced myself. My name is Rosita Lizama Taitano Birdwell, and I am the oldest cousin in this family right now. I am 88 years old, I'll be 89 in July, and I'm going to tell you, I am very thankful that I can look out every day and say, "Thank you, Lord, for another day." I work very hard. I lost some weight. I've been in the hospital since April of last year. I've been in and out of the hospital many times, but I still go out there and fight the snakes, the lizard, the mosquitoes, and the ants and I wash when my washing machine broke down. I washed by hand. I told my son then my son wasn't home. He was at he was in Michigan, and he had a couple of operation in his hand. So, he wasn't there to help me, but I told him, I said, "It's a good thing you're not here because if you're here, I'll have you make me a bateha." And he said, "Mom, what is a bateha?" I said, "That's how we do laundry." I said, "And that's what you're going to have to do when you get here." My bill was turned off this last week. I was like 10:30 in the morning. My whole power, everything is gone. I didn't know, you know, I live in near Pulantat, in Yona, and the uh mayor's office is up there by the church. So, and I'm not supposed to be driving, by the way. But don't tell anybody, but I wasn't arrested for tickets or anything. Nobody stopped me for anything that they did out of law. But anyways, I'm trying very hard and I want to thank all of you because there's nobody that is really stupid. What you have to do is think about what is good for the people of Guam. Don't worry about what the other countries are doing or what the other neighbors are doing. What is good for me and what is good for the island of Guam. I have approached when my husband was taking uh oxygen and I had to go to have his oxygen tank refilled. I found out from a few people that were waiting to see the doctor, they said they have to pay \$35 to have the little tank refilled. And I said, "My god, that \$35." My husband uses he uses a whole barrel of oxygen. So, I went to uh who was the congress lady? It was Bordallo, but she was off island, but I went right to his office. I went right to her office and I spoke to a gentleman named Mr. Perez and I told him I said this is this is not fun. I said when people need this and they have to pay, and they travel from Merizo or Talofofo and I said and they have to pay so much money that is a shame. So, I think that uh you tell Mrs. Bordallo when she comes back that they have to do something to get oxygen for pe for the people that needs them. That is important. It's not important to just talk about it and then have a long discussion all day long about what's happening and that you know do it. Think about it. Who is it for? You have children. I have children. I am so glad that my kids are all doing well. Thank goodness. But anyways, my son came up to accompany me to I have to go to the hospital. So that means going off island again. Since April of last year, I have been back and forth uh in the hospital here and in the states. But I finally said, I'm going back to Guam. This place is too cold. I'm going to die. And so, I come here and it gets so hot that now I have to turn the fans on and but that's okay. Anyways, for all of you that are working, continue working hard. I live in Yona and always available if I'm healthy enough. I will do whatever I can for anybody. I don't hesitate to help anybody whether it's out in the street or whether at home and we have we have helped people It's not because I have, I don't have that much money to spend in anybody. I don't go out shopping for myself, but if I have any to spare and somebody needs it, I will use it. So please continue working and help each other. You know, I know that this is a having a discussion about some things you don't always have to excuse but think of the purpose of what your reasoning is.

Chairman Ada: Thank you.

**Ms. Birdwell:** And that's what's worth it. It's for the people, for you and for everybody else. Don't think about, you know, whether I'm going to have a two-story house or I'm going to have this and that. It really doesn't matter to me. When the wind is blowing, I said, "Oh, that feels good." When it doesn't

rain, I ask God, "Please water my flowers. Thank you very much." So, anyways, thank you for giving me this chance. Thank you for giving me your time and you too.

Chairman Ada: Yes, ma'am. Thank you.

**Ms. Birdwell:** Oh, I want to mention something about my grandmother. She has this Bible. I mean, it's about this high and it's a big Bible and the reason why I want to talk today is because of Janom. In that book, she said and she told me the reason why I'm not selling Janom is because I have children and they have children who may not be able to afford education so they can live off of here because we lived there during concentration camp and we had people even from Maina and then they come down and help and they carry produce up and they go fishing and they catch fish and so that is the reason why my grandmother didn't sell the land And I have a lot of questions to ask because I did one time after I had that uh the property registered in 2009. They've been paying over \$8,000, and so I had to have Hanom uh we have to a surveyor down there, and we got Mr. Castro, and he went down and he did it well from \$8,000 to \$5,000. I said, "That's a relief, right?" But now I my head is clear as to what you guys have been doing with the land that you've been holding. Who's paying the taxes and who's benefiting from it? While we still have the land in our possession, who is taking care of the taxes and who's benefiting from the taxes? Do you follow me?

Chairman Ada: Yes.

Ms. Birdwell: Do you understand what I'm trying to say? Yes. Because I did go about the \$5,000 and then and they told me they cannot reimburse me the money, the difference. I said, "Well, okay. So, we'll pay what's coming now. We'll pay it all." But I happened to pay the taxes. I worry about it. Well, this year's taxes in Hanom must have not been paid yet. I still have the voucher for it, but I didn't pay my co- uh Frankie. Where's Frankie? administrator. I gave him all the checks and everything when I left to go to the States. And I told him; you take care of the taxes and take care of the bills for the account. I even open up a box for the for the account so that they will get they didn't well since I didn't, I had one of my cousins take collect the mail make a copy of it and then I gave the rest to Frankie and he knows it. Thank goodness he found the checks that I gave him because I do not have any checks. He found it already. So, I'm glad that it did. But I just wanted to mention that I try to keep track of what's going on and I'm learning every day. Like I said, I listen if I have enough time, if I don't have work to do at home, I would come and listen to what's going on, what you people are debating every day. And I'll be more than glad to listen because

Chairman Ada: Thank you.

**Ms. Birdwell:** I do. I like to learn to no matter how old I am as so long as I'm alive and as so long as the man upstairs is taking care of me. Thank you very much and God bless you all.

**Chairman Ada:** Thank you, ma'am, for your testimony and don't worry about the driving. There's not a single police officer in here. The chief of police already walked out so don't worry.

**Ms. Birdwell:** Your uncle were in the police force and they watch every move that I make. Thank you. If I step on the gas too much, they tell me I'm spending too much money.

**Chairman Ada:** Yeah, they didn't hear that one as well. Thank you, Auntie.

Ms. Birdwell: Thank you.

Chairman Ada: Thank you.

Ms. Birdwell: Thank you. God bless you all.

**Chairman Ada:** Mr. Flores, you have a testimony to also uh submit.

Mr. Christopher Camacho Flores: Yes, I do.

Chairman Ada: Thank you, sir.

Mr. Christopher Camacho Flores: Uh Good Afternoon and for the record, my name is uh Christopher Camacho Flores. I'm an heir to a uh original landowner. My father is Henry Tenorio Flores and uh just a little bit of background, next week, Tuesday, May 27th, I will be laying me father to rest at Guam Memorial Park. Uh he was 94 years old. He's a war survivor. He was 12 years old during the war. Suffered a great deal under the Japanese occupation and uh he will be laid to rest without ever seeing his land returned at Eagles Field and he understands. Uh, but that's another story. Uh, I'm here in support of bill number 41-38 and thank you, uh, Senator Joe San Augustin for sponsoring this bill. Thank you, Vice Speaker Ada for being present and, uh, also Senator Gumataotao for being present. uh because you are the new um inductees into the 38th Guam Legislature and I know that you would have uh an open mind into doing what's right and uh it's just so hard to follow a great testimony from uh auntie here and uh she may be 88 years old but uh her memory is better than a 12-year-old and better than mine. Um, another background is uh Frank I'm here also on behalf of my primu. Uh, just a little bit of background on him. When I was going through the senior ROTC training at University of Guam to become an army officer. He was our TAC NCO that stands for tactical non-commission officer. So he did all our training in tactics and leadership and because of his leadership and his uh knowledge, he's also a retired command sergeant major in the Green Beret special forces and I'm I wasn't here when he provided testimony, but I know he probably didn't mention that part because he's a very humble soldier and uh very giving of his time. We were the first class out of UOG and the only class to win the war of the Pacific award at Fort Lewis, Washington during every summer when the cadets go out there and compete with at that time it was region 4 which is what University of Guam region fell under on the ROTC uh program. As a matter of fact, one of our graduates uh received the rank of one star, Darren Cruz. He was the assistant at general under um the recent uh General Leon Guerrero. So with that, it's like what uh auntie said earlier that you know when you guys start debating about the land you know and I know that the bill says it will be entrusted into the Ancestral Lands Commission and then within 30 days of the effective date and then at after 180 days disposal of the land parcel and lot transferred by this act in a manner consistent with and pursuant to its enabling legislation and its mandates. I'm not a legalese expert and I don't know what the ancestral lands uh manner consistent with pursuant to their enabling legislation and its mandates, but I'm into simple language and I believe that language should be afforded into this bill that uh it should just rightfully go back to the original landowners, okay? After it's entrusted into the Guam Ancestral Lands, because once it gets into a government agency, that's where it gets into a quagmire and we're not here for a quagmire. It's simple. They have proof that they've owned this property. They took care of this property. I've been down to Hanom a lot. Uh the proof uh is the same as the owners of Jinapsan. They were they were able to prove beyond a reasonable doubt to the Air Force and the military that they've owned and operated that land throughout its history and the proof here is that these landowners uh have been taking care and been paying the dues of this property up in Hanom that is in question. So, my only ask is do the right thing, return the land back to the original landowners after it gets into the Guam Ancestral Lands and with that, thank you for allowing me to testify and I will accept any questions if you have any.

Chairman Ada recognized Senator Eulogio Shawn Gumataotao for questions.

**Senator Gumataotao** said that he hopes that in the markup, they'd be able to make sure that they are providing the information from Ancestral Lands in terms of subject lots, the acreage, topography, the availability of the infrastructure or existing structure and that Ancestral Lands.

Chairman Ada thanked Senator Gumataotao and mentioned for the record that the committee had received testimony from the Ancestral Lands Commission that he will be reading into the record after questions and that Ancestral Lands submitted a 900-page opinion by the Office of the Attorney General from 2009 that can be accessed through the Google Drive folder. He then recognized **Senator Therese M. Terlaje.** 

**Senator Terlaje** said that she was not able to review that document and that one of her comments was going to be that Ancestral Lands is not here.

Chairman Ada said that they only submitted testimony and they will leave the record open.

**Senator Terlaje** asked if Chamorro Land Trust and Department of Land Management are here.

Chairman Ada said that it was only Ancestral Lands.

Senator Terlaje said she wanted the Department of Land Management to be there because the bill does not say who the land is being transferred from and if the Land Trust is involved, what is their stances on this. She said all the information presented is very important and she agrees with how the families feel that this is not just about when the Navy took the land because of refusal to pay taxes and that is an injustice. Her question for Ancestral Lands is if the properties are returned, are they able to address that type of injustice. She wanted to know if this property was subsequently transferred to CLTC before the Ancestral Lands Commission was created. She wanted to know whether Ancestral Lands returned land to landowners that had been previously not condemned but taken because of non-payment of taxes, how many other people would this type of process requires them to consider. All of these injustices were put before the court, and they said the property belongs to the government of Guam and not the family because it belonged to the Navy at the time and the courts have not been able to overturn that. She thinks that there would have to be a process established to do that fairly for other claims that come up the same way.

**Ms. Guerrero** interjected that Ancestral Lands and the Chamorro Land Trust are on the same page regarding this land.

**Senator Terlaje** said that was why they need Land Management's help with this.

Chairman Ada thanked Senator Terlaje and recognized Senator Telo T. Taitague for questions.

Senator Taitague said she has been doing research, wanting to know exactly what happened. She was also hoping the agencies would be there so they could ask them these questions because of they're going to take it out of the Government of Guam Bank and place it into one of these two entities, which one do they do correctly? Is it considered crown property because if it was still that, it belonged to the Taitano family and taken away or there were taxes not paid on the property, and it was condemned. She mentioned a former governor who tried to take this parse of property and put it in ancestral lands and he couldn't do that without legislative approval. She asked where is it going to go so that the family can go to that entity and lobby for the land? Which entity do they go to? She said that it has to follow the procedures of Ancestral Lands and if it goes to Ancestral Lands, they have rules, regulations and requirements that it has to follow and if we veer away from that, we are setting a bad precedent. She repeated the previous speaker and said she hopes there is another hearing with the agencies in front of them so they can ask questions on camera.

Chairman Ada thanked Senator Taitague and recognized Senator Chris Barnett for questions.

Senator Barnett repeated earlier speakers that there is a lot more information that they need to clarify. He mentioned it was Governor Gutierrez who tried to remedy this situation and he is mindful now the bill is attempting to transfer these lots to Guam Ancestral Lands Commission but the commission said in their testimony that it makes reference to certified documents and superior court rulings that state the claimant is not entitled to the land as the Government of Guam maintains that the land should remain under government ownership. He said he'd like to get more information from Ancestral Lands and Chamorro Land Trust. He agrees with Senator Terlaje that if we're going to address the issue what does that do for other property owners who have lost their property in similar ways.

Chairman Ada thanked Senator Barnett and recognized Senator San Agustin for his closing.

Senator San Agustin reemphasized that the bill is very specific that once the land is transferred to the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission, they have to follow the legislative mandates and take appropriate action. The land has been stuck where it's at today and it has to be moved to Ancestral Lands in order for any action to be taken. He said that one it gets there, the Taitano family can figure out what they need to do. He also said that the easement bull cart trail will remain an easement for public access and utilities.

**Mr. Flores** asked if he could get a copy of the 900-page opinion provided by the OAG.

Ms. Guerrero also asked if her family could get a copy of the 900-page opinion.

Chairman Ada asked if there has been any discussion with the military for access to the property.

Ms. Guerrero, Mr. F. Guerrero and Mr. R. Guerrero shook their heads.

Chairman Ada read testimony from the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission.

**Chairman Ada** adjourned the public hearing at 5:37 pm.

The public hearing was adjourned at 5:37 pm.

### III. FINDINGS & RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee finds that Prior to the 1950 Organic Act, Guam's property taxes were assessed under two distinct colonial administrations: Spanish rule until 1898 and U.S. Naval rule from 1898 to 1950.

### Spanish rule (until 1898)

Under the Spanish system, property taxes were not assessed on the size or value of the land itself. Instead, the government collected taxes based on the income generated from a property's use.

### **U.S. Naval government (1898–1950)**

After the U.S. acquired Guam in 1898, the first naval governor, Richard P. Leary, abolished the Spanish system and implemented new land tax policies.

#### The new assessment method:

- Governor Leary instituted a system where the size and type of land were the basis for taxation, rather than the income it produced.
- For many years, the naval government specifically tied land values—for property tax and other purposes—to the number of coconuts the land could produce, creating a "copra economy".
- This tax on copra (dried coconut meat) was significant. For some plantations, the land tax absorbed as much as one-third of the income from the copra harvest.
- The administration sometimes attempted to protect families by allowing them to keep their land if they could not pay the tax.

The Committee further finds that both methods of assessing and collecting property taxes were done without the consent of the people of Guam. This includes seizure of property for non-payment of taxes. The subject lots in Bill No. 41-38 (COR) are among those properties that were seized by the US Naval Government and later deeded to the Government of Guam.

The Committee further finds much of the properties transferred by the Navy to the Government of Guam were unregistered meaning that the history of ownership was uncertain. As such, a judicial process of registration is required for all unregistered land before it can be duly titled.

The primary purpose of land registration for Government of Guam land is to ensure clear, legally recognized titles for public lands, preventing boundary conflicts with private landowners and providing assurance to government agencies regarding land status for development purposes. The process involves surveying and mapping public properties, serving notifications to potential claimants, and formalizing the ownership and usage rights of public land, including land designated for the welfare of the people.

The Committee on Land, Environment, Housing, Agriculture, Parks and Infrastructure hereby reports out **Bill No. 41-38 (COR)** As amended - Senator Joe S. The properties shall be transferred and shall be deeded to the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this Act. The Guam Ancestral Lands Commission shall within one hundred eighty (180) days dispose of the land parcel and lot transferred by this Act in a manner consistent with and pursuant to its enabling legislation and its mandates. All pre-condemnation roads, easements and bull cart trails shall remain as easements for public access and utilities."

**Section 2. Severability.** If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or inorganic, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without
