Good Morning Mr. Chair/Vice speaker Ada, Senators -

My name is John Glenn Taitague, I'm an employee of Department of Parks & Recreation, and as the Acting Parks Administrator, I've been with the Government of Guam for 33 years. I oversee the Vicente Limtiaco Cemetery with burial scheduling, assisting families with grave locations, record keeping of deceased etc..

If your not aware and ask why DPR is in this cemetery business, let me explain Public Law 15-96 signed and promulgated on April 4th 1985 by Governor Ricardo J. Bordallo.

Which designates DPR the responsibility with administration, operations, and maintenance of all public cemeteries, **WHEREAS** the Vicente Limitaco Cemetery "Tiguac" is a public cemetery and is included in the Guam Territorial Park System inventory. The cemetery has been in existence since 1966. DPW was the agency who was handling the scheduling of burials at the time then it was turned over to DPR sometime mid to late 90's and also is responsible for the Guam Veterans Cemetery at one point, before it was turned over to Guam Office of Veterans Affairs (GOVA)

I am here in support of Bill No. 49-38 (COR) and to emphasize the importance of the bill.

Vicente Limtiaco Cemetery aka "Tiguac" has met the maximum capacity with over 5,000.00 burials dating back from 1966 to present. In the past months DPR has been finding extra space to conduct burials and has come to and end with "NO MORE SPACES AVAILABLE".

Bill 49-38 (COR) will allow DPR the ability to continue with daily burials for family members to lay their loved ones to the final resting place and at least allowing DPR up to 5 years until a new cemetery property have been pursued.

DPR is tremendously working with planning to either continue with ground burials or constructing crypts such as 2 layers up (height) and 100 per rows back to back but of course funding will be the main issue again. Hoping that you all consider the DPR budget and allow for more funding to the solution.

So in closing, I hope you all will consider and support Bill No. 49-38 (COR).

I respectfully submit this testimony against Bill No. 49-38 (COR), an act to transfer Lot No. 258 to the Department of Parks and Recreation for the purpose of expanding the footprint and capacity of the Vicente A. Limtiaco Memorial Park.

One of the biggest problems about our government is we build, construct and expand our facilities and parks without first taking proper care of what currently exists. If the Vicente Limtiaco Cemetery was properly maintained perhaps, I would be inclined to support such a measure.

If the intent of this bill is to care for our loved ones at the time of death, why are we not concerned about the current state of this cemetery? There is no perimeter fence for safety reasons, an unpaved road is the only access into the property, the lawn is almost always overgrown or poorly maintained, trash is strewn all over the property.

What's most disturbing is that the Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR) doesn't even own a backhoe. On March 28, 2025, there was a grass fire at the cemetery. DPR had no resources to assist the Guam Fire Department (GFD) extinguish the fire. It was only until the evening of March 29, 2025, that heavy equipment was available to assist GFD. I am only aware of this because GFD called me for assistance. They called the mayor and not DPR, the owners of the property. Our Piti residents were in danger and the onus was on the owners of this property to do everything within its power to keep our people safe. Who manages this cemetery?

Futhermore, is DPR prepared to build on this property? Do they have sufficient funds and a grand plan that will include the upgrade and maintenance of the current property? Who will oversee the development of this property? Does DPR have a timeline to properly utilize this parcel should it be transferred or will this sit and wait for another Legislature to come in and make other plans?

You might want to bury your loved ones in the current state of the Vicente Limtiaco Cemetery, but not everyone on Guam believes the same. Most of us live in better conditions and my deceased loved ones deserve a more respectful and appropriate final resting place.

You might also be concerned about burying everyone regardless of financial status or income, but they too, deserve a dignified final resting place. This government must truly discern its decisions before making bold moves to please anyone. We took an oath to serve the people of Guam and I believe our people deserve better than what we're giving them.

I urge you to consider the egregious ramifications of transferring more property to DPR for a cemetery that cannot be properly managed as evidenced in its existing state.



Buenas yan Hafa Adai! The Department provides additional testimony to Bill 49-38, we submit the following:

The Department supports the transfer of Lot 258, Municipality of Piti to the Department of Parks and Recreation, wherein they be granted "administrative jurisdiction" over the property and not as owner in Fee Simple as stated in the Bill. The transfer of the property would be subject to the land being registered under the Land Registration Act. The Land Registration Court will be the entity granting title.

The Department has already begun the initial land registration process for Lot 258 by transmitting the required documents to the Office of the Attorney General on July 8, 2024.

Relative to the original cemetery, Lot 273:

As a side note, the original cemetery, located on Lot 273, also unregistered, was submitted to the Office of the Attorney General on August 14, 2023 to be processed for Land Registration.

In 2003, Governor Felix Camacho initiated a Land Summit where results indicated a need for an additional or expanded public cemetery. The present day Tiguac Cemetery also known as the "Vicente A. Limtiaco Cemetery" is located on Lot 273, also unregistered.

Ltr to Honorable Vice Speaker V. Anthony Ada Subject: Additional Testimony on Bill 49-38 May 23, 2025

A Land Registration Map for Lot 273-1 and Lot 273-R1 was recorded in 1989, but became stale before Land Registration proceedings were filed.

On June 2022, the Department of Land Management completed and recorded a new updated Land Registration map for Lot 273.

On August 14, 2023, the Department submitted to the Office of the Attorney General the necessary documents for a Land Registration Case for Lot 273.







I. OVERVIEW

<u>Bill No. 49-38 (COR)</u> was introduced on <u>February 7, 2025</u>, by Senator Joe S. San Agustin and was subsequently referred to the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Land, Environment, Housing, Agriculture, Parks and Infrastructure on February 17, 2025.

The Committee on Land, Environment, Housing, Agriculture, Parks and Infrastructure convened a public hearing on May 13, 2025, at 8:00 am at the Public Hearing Room of the Guam Congress Building.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

Vice Speaker V. Anthony Ada, Chairman – Committee on Land, Environment, Housing, Agriculture, Parks and Infrastructure: Håfa Adai and Good Morning. This public hearing conducted by the committee on land, environment, housing, agriculture, parks, and infrastructure is called to order and the time is 8:00 a.m. Today's date is May 13, 2025. Notice of this hearing was

disseminated to all local media outlets on May 6, 2025, with the second notice provided on May 11, 2025. Notice of the hearing was also made known on the Guam Legislatures' website and the Government of Guam public notice portal. This morning, the committee will hear testimony on bill 49-38 COR introduced by Tina Rose Muna Barnes and co-sponsored by me and senators Joe S. San Augustin, William A. Parkinson, Chris M. Dueñas, Shawn Gumataotao, Vince Borja, Shelly Calvo, Jesse Lujan, an act to transfer lot number 258, Municipality of Piti to the Department of Parks and Recreation for the purpose of expanding the footprint and capacity of the Vicente A. Limtiaco Memorial Park. We will also hear testimony on legislation that I introduced bill number 79-38 (COR), an act to authorize the Maga'håga Guahan to sell a portion of block 8 in new Agat designated as block 8 park area and to deposit the proceeds of the sale into the Chamorro Land Trust infrastructure and survey fund. I would like to welcome my colleagues joining me here today. On my right is Senator Rose Tina Rose Muña Barnes and on my left is Senator Telo Taitague. Thank you, senators, for being here this morning. Uh for those who would like to uh come up to testify on uh the first bill, please uh go ahead and come up to the stand and I'll go ahead and give uh Senator Tina Rose Muña Barnes for her opening statement.

Senator Tina Rose Muña Barnes, Primary Author: Manana si Yu'os. Uh um Mr. Chair, uh Vice Speaker, and to the listening audience, uh thank you uh Vice Speaker. I appreciate you working with my office to hear this bill 49-38. Uh especially given the urgency of this issue and for the benefit of the committee and uh and the public, uh in late January, we received a request from the Department of Parks and Recreations to see firsthand the state of the Vicente A. Limtiaco Memorial Park, commonly known as Tiguac Cemetery in Nimitz Hill. Uh during the visit, uh the Department of Parks and Rec. staff stressed the need to expand the park and showed my office that the department was fast approaching its full capacity given its current footprint. Uh colleagues and to the listening audience, the request from the Department of Parks and Recreation is simple. Transfer a lot directly adjacent to the cemetery into its inventory. A property that is already owned by the government but is not assigned to any agency and a lot that has already been surveyed. That that uh request is formalized uh Mr. Chair in Bill 49. Several weeks ago, the department had asked to schedule a hearing for this measure because its capacity concerns have reached a critical level. Uh once again, uh I thank you, Mr. Chair, for hearing this urgent matter uh as soon as our schedules allowed. So, while the bill uh before us is simple, I will note for the record that it is merely the first steps needed to help the Department of Parks and Recs., its budget, as we all know, is bare bones. So, there isn't any wiggle room to absorb additional costs or pay for any development to this new lot. The Department of Parks and Recreation will certainly need to clear and great the lot and infrastructure like uh walking paths or vehicle access certainly has a price tag as well and with our partners here, I hope that they can share some of their strategic planning efforts to maximize these lands. Um perhaps with spaces to hold earns as an option to uh save space. Uh I do have some questions for later, but I also want to note uh Mr. chair that the um the fiscal note for 49-38 (COR) has been submitted and uh it too noted that the land management to transfer the above reference lot in the Tiguac area uh expanding the footprint and capacity of uh the memorial park. The issuance of the certificate of title for set lot number from Department of Land Management to DPR as owners and fees simple is administrative in nature but Mr. Chair they noted but may incur administrative costs in the process. Additionally, any work on the set lot required by DPR to expand the municipal cemetery like land clearing and excavating and or construction will incur uh additional cost. However, absent that information from DPR on what specific work will be required, a more detailed fiscal impact of this legislation cannot be determined at this time. I bring that up, Mr. chair because it has been noted by BBMR that there may be and as noted in my opening statement. Um uh this is important uh as we look at providing the service to the community especially the indigent community and also for the record to site um uh 10 GCA on the health and safety uh for our community chapter 30 which talks about cemetery in the mortuary. Um there is a provision on section 30108 the public cemetery uh that authorizes the government to set aside public land uh for uh such within such an amount as may deem necessary for the establishment of a public cemetery and that uh jurisdiction will then fall under Parks and Recs. I tell you that uh Mr. chair uh because of the responsibility that the government is held to uh

to uh provide for the community of those within the um yes, the indigent community. So, thank you Mr. Chair and I know the mayor has to the good mayor has to leave real soon. So, I'm hoping you could yield to him to uh share his remarks.

Chairman Ada: Uh thank you Senator Barnes. I'd just like to welcome my colleagues, uh, Senator Therese Terlaje and Senator Chris Barnett for joining us here this morning as well. Uh, we'll go ahead and start taking testimony. Uh, mayor, uh, president of the mayor's council of well, and mayor of Piti, please, we'll go ahead and start with you, sir. This morning, thank you.

Mayor Jesse Alig - Municipality of Piti: Good morning, Mr. Chair, and good morning, senators. I do have written testimony that I'll submit. Uh, but because I do have a 9:00 a.m. OPA meeting, I will have to make this short. it. I want to respectfully oppose this bill uh for several reasons. One, I understand the need for burial plots truly, but I also understand the need for dignified burial plots for our people and if our intentions are to provide this space for our loved ones, then before we continue to give more property to the department, perhaps we need to fix up the cemetery first and we need to maintain the cemetery in a manner that is dignified for our loved ones and I say this because if you in any given day you go to Tiguac Cemetery, if you are happy with the way that cemetery looks, so be it, but I'm not and the majority of my residents are not and I'm not saying that it's one person's problem. The cemetery has looked like that for so many years and if truly the government is concerned about our people, then you need to be concerned about that cemetery as well and before you give, give, give. We're so good at building. The government is so good at producing big, lavish buildings, more property, more everything, but nothing to maintain those facilities, those buildings, and those properties and that's that that'll be the problem here because in this bill, we give property to DPR, but I haven't seen a plan. I haven't seen a grand plan for that expansion. I Where's the What's the funding source? Are we just going to rely on this government because I can't simply just rely on the government to provide the funding source and to provide a grand plan for this expansion when in fact the current state of that cemetery is deplorable. The route to Layon landfill looks way better than going into Tiguac Cemetery. The paved road to Layon is better than Tiguac Cemetery and if you're truly concerned about our people, and that's the rhetoric here, then shame on us for caring for our people like that, but for now, I want to say that if there is no better plan that exists currently to support the cemetery, the current cemetery, to maintain that cemetery to the best of their ability, which is much better than that should be because the director and the deputy director are fine gentlemen, then I'm not going to support anything that's going to give them more property, more money if they can't currently manage within their means this cemetery as it exists today. If that changes, I am inclined to support any transfer of property or transfer property for more burial plots, but again, for me, it's why are we doing this and what is our plan? because we're going to give and have no plan and at the end we're going to wait for another legislature to come in to change the plans because there's no money and there's no plan for the current expansion. Thank you.

Chairman Ada: Uh thank you, Mr. Mayor. Director Sablan.

Mr. Angel Sablan, Director – Department of Parks and Recreation: Manana si Yu'os, Angel Sablan, Director of Department of Parks and Recreation, and uh my good friend to my left, the president of the mayor's council of Guam. I don't disagree with sentiments, but all got to remember that that cemetery was there long before he was in power and long before I was even the Director of Parks and Recreation and it's true, if you don't fund it, if you don't maintain it, it's you're going to get what you don't fund for and so I just want to reiterate today that we hope to change his mind by coming up with some concrete plans to make that place a dignified place for our people and I can assure the president and the rest of the people listening that um we're trying at DPR to change things around of many years of neglect and we can't do everything overnight but we're certainly on that track. I want to also say that this shortage of space at uh recently at Vicente A. Limtiaco Cemetery was not just overnight. We have brought this up before even to the 37th Guam legislature. Unfortunately, no bill

was ever produced to do an increase in the uh footprint of Vicente A. Limtiaco Cemetery. The bill before you today simply does that. It just increases the footprint because if you hear the testimony today from the person that's been in charge of handling the cemetery, we are down to less than maybe a month of burials left at Tiguac and my other only other choice is if we don't get additional property is we close it to further burials. Uh so this additional space doesn't require um any appropriation at least currently. All it does is it changes the survey marks of Tiguac. Um we just want an opportunity to be able to have a place that we can look forward to make the plans that uh President Alig is asking for. We don't want to go and invest something in uh in a plan where we don't even have the authority to use that property and so that's all that this bill does is to give us the authority. It's not going to displace anyone. It's not going to uh change anything. Tiguac, as we call it today, will remain the same. All it does is increase the property, but moving forward, once we get the property authorized to DPR, then we can set things in motion to come back to this Legislature, show you our plans, and ask you for the appropriation to do it. One of our other ideas is instead of continuing to bury in the ground because we know this is finite again in another five years we're going to come back and say we need more space is to build crypts in that additional property that we may be given so that there will be more years that we can use the cemetery than what is currently um at hand and so with that, I just wanted to let you all know that Tiguac Cemetery um the lack of space is not has not just been brought and we thank Senator Tina for introducing this bill, but we have asked since the 37th Guam legislation, perhaps even the 36th to come forward and look at expanding the cemetery or once and for all just closing it and so I'll let uh the deputy and I'll let uh our acting parks administrator further testify. Thank you.

Chairman Ada: Thank you, Director Sablan. Uh Mayor Alig, you need to excuse yourself for your OPA. You can go ahead and You're welcome. Uh deputy director uh Warren Pelletiere, you can go ahead and begin, sir.

Ms. Warren Pelletiere, Deputy Director – Department of Parks and Recreation: Yeah, I was planning on uh well, good morning, everybody and thank you. Thank you for uh holding this uh hearing and to hear our cries of needing additional space and to help us hopefully get your support and approval to uh include the lot in question as to one with the Tiguac cemetery. Um, since my appointment here at Department of Parks and Recreation, this has been one of the thorns in in my shoe about uh finding a location and uh or expanding the Tiguac Cemetery from its current footprint. Um, we have made many adjustments over the past 3 years in moving things around, moving spaces around, moving the infant burial area to a nicer area so that we can uh increase the plots and the numbers of plots for the adult uh burials. Um, but right now we are at a very critical point. Um, I have reached out to Department of Land Management. We've met on many occasions. Um, I've also reached out to uh Joseph Santos and we have met a couple times. There seems to be a master plan that uh if implemented and funded, it will allow for another 50 years plus and will give the dignity that Mayor Alig was asking for. Um we can't turn back time. What happened transpired in the past decades was all before we started working at parks and recreation, but now we are reaching out to you and pleading with you for the for the inclusion of that lot into the current uh lot and also uh minimum funding to create the roads and the pathways into there, the kåskåhu that is needed to be laid down in order so that when we do and hopefully with your approval obtain that lot and it's included in the overall lot can begin burials in that site and we estimate five plus years. Now if we are able to add crypts with that it can be 20 25 years. Um, I'd like to say in the past a lot of the problems at Tiguac Cemetery is uh families not following the guidelines set forth in in the structures of some of these crypts and burial slots. They plant trees and now these trees are enormous in size and it's difficult to trim them, get any equipment to them and such, so those are some of our challenges financially and set and forth, but uh I will reach out to uh Joseph Santos uh at the request of Senator Tina Barnes to see if we can obtain that master plan. Uh I've seen it myself it's a beautiful plan and hopefully we can uh get a copy of that flash drive and I could provide a copy for each one of you to view and observe and see and again, getting back to Mayor Alig's uh concerns, he is he's opposed to continuing or allowing this to happen today, but he's it with one condition that the funding is there to make it more presentable for our people. Okay so, that that's my testimony. I thank you very much for giving me this time.

Chairman Ada: Thank you, Deputy uh Mr. John Glenn Taitague, please, sir. Your testimony.

Mr. John Taitague – Department of Parks and Recreation: Good morning, Mr. Chair, Vice Speaker Ada, Senator Barnes, Terlaje, Senator Barnett, Senator Taitague. My name is John Glenn Taitague. I am an employee of the Department of Parks and Recreation and as the acting parks administrator. I've been with the Government of Guam for 33 years. I oversee the Vicente Limtiaco Cemetery with burial scheduling, assisting families with grave locations and recordkeeping of deceased. If you're not aware and ask why DPR is in this cemetery business? let me explain. Public law 15-96 signed and propagated on April 4th, 1985, by Governor Ricardo J. Bordallo which designates DPR the responsibility with administration, operations and maintenance of all public cemeteries whereas the Vicente Limtiaco Cemetery, Tiguac, is a public cemetery and is included in the Guam territorial park system inventory. The cemetery has been in existence since 1966, which I believe DPW was the agency at that time handling the burial schedules and before it was turned over to DPR and also DPR was handling the Guam Veteran Cemetery at one point, before it was turned over to Guam Office of Veterans Affairs, GOVA. I am here in support of bill number 49-38 (COR) and to emphasize the importance of the bill. Vicente Limtiaco Cemetery also known as Tiguac has met the maximum capacity with over 5,000 burials dating back from 1966 to present. In the past months, DPR has been finding extra space to conduct burials and has come to an end with no more space available. Bill 49-38 CR will allow DPR the ability to continue with daily burials for family members to lay their loved ones to the final resting place and at least allowing DPR up to 5 years until a new cemetery property have been pursued. DPR is tremendously working with planning to either continue with ground burials or constructing crypts such as two layers up and height and 100 per row back-to-back, but of course, funding will be the main issue again. Hoping that you all consider the DPR budget and allow for more funding to the solution. So, in closing, I hope you will consider and support bill number 49-38 (COR). si Yu'os Ma'åse.

Chairman Ada: Thank you, Mr. Taitague. If we can ask Mr. Joe Borja to please come up. I see that you wanted to give oral testimony as well.

Mr. Joseph Borja, Director of Land Management: Uh thank you, Mr. Chairman. Actually, I was here to answer any questions that you might have about the, you know, the property itself. Uh land management has actually been working on this project for several years uh to uh actually uh survey a property and take it through land registration, but um you know it was the drive I guess of this uh department and now this time that um pushed this issue to the forefront. I understand uh they only have uh remaining space for about 40 or more burials, but even prior to this uh because there was no master plan of the area uh people were getting buried under the easements uh some of the power line easements alongside of the road. Uh during the survey we found out that some of them were buried there. Yeah, so Piti has a distinction of having two cemeteries at least. The other cemetery of course is the veteran cemetery which also I believe is uh approaching its uh capacity. Thank you.

Chairman Ada recognized Senator Muña Barnes.

Senator Muña Barnes wanted to reiterate for the record that before DPR seeks funding for Tiguac Cemetery, the adjacent lot must be in their inventory.

Mr. Sablan confirmed that that is correct.

Senator Muña Barnes asked to confirm that it would not be the best use of time to develop a plan with their current footprint because the plan would be irrelevant as soon as the footprint is bigger due to this transfer.

Mr. Sablan confirmed that was correct and used the Harmon Sports Complex as an example. He said that what is seen there today is not even 10% of the plan but the plan is just laying there on the shelf rolled up in maps because there is no funding.

Senator Muña Barnes wanted it reiterated that given the current capacity, how much longer would it be to operate the cemetery before turning away a family applying for burial and how many plots are left.

Mr. Sablan said that the time frame is fluid because they don't know how many people will be asking to use the cemetery.

Mr. Taitague said they have approximately eight more plots left.

Mr. Sablan said that could take eight months or eight years.

Senator Muña Barnes asked how much do they estimate it costs to operate the Tiguac cemetery and how much has been allocated to their budget to cover those costs.

Mr. Sablan said that they had been asking for an allocation for the cemetery at least employee-wise. They do not have a lowering device for the caskets and have to work with funeral homes for that. They don't have the collateral equipment needed to truly run a cemetery and do burials. Their budget for the past four years have been status quo.

Senator Muña Barnes asked **Mr. Sablan** to share with the committee why the partnership Tiguac has with the veterans cemetery is critical.

Mr. Sablan said they do not have equipment so they work with Mr. San Agustin at Veterans Affairs to loan them backhoes. They have to sometimes schedule burials based on their operational needs and when they can have free use of the back hoe.

Senator Muña Barnes asked if they have estimates for the cost of installing walking and parkways and a timeline for how soon the funds will be needed and if they are included in their fiscal year 2026 budget request.

Mr. Sablan said they are not included because they do not even have a laid out plan but once have the property, they will have things put in motion.

Senator Muña Barnes brought up what Mr. Borja said earlier about possible plans for Tiguac to expand.

Mr. Borja said that was for cemeteries in general. There was a public law authorizing the governor to select a lot in the northern part of Guam but it does not support in ground burials. There is a plan for 19 cemeteries including provate ones but he is not aware of a specific plan for Tiguac.

Mr. Pelletiere said that there is a plan that he's seen for himself and he will reach out to this person for a copy. He believes this person made the plan when he was working at DLM. He said he believes this person retains all rights to the plan and it was one of the projects he was assigned to do plans for as well as the Dededo Sports Complex. He said the footprint there is 25 acres and the size of the plans includes over 100 acres that show development of baseball fields, football fields, soccer fields, tennis courts and such past the pipeline. There are plans to add about 30 to 40 more years to Tiguac.

Mr. Borja referred to the statement about an employee that owns those plans because he worked on it while at Land Management and said, "I kind of beg to differ."

Chairman Ada recognized Senator Telo T. Taitague.

Senator Taitague asked who owned the plans.

Mr. Pelletiere said they have an engineer at DPR who had mentioned that an individual has a plan for Tiguac and the person's name is Joe Santos and that Mr. Santos met with them and he was able to see the plan. He said the engineer works for DPR but Joe Santos is independent. The engineer's name is Ariel Evarola. Mr. Evarola was formerly at DPW and transferred to DPR many years back.

Senator Taitague wanted to clarify that it was not a Government of Guam employee who created a plan as an employee as that would become property of the Government of Guam and that person would not own the rights to it. She wanted to make it straight that he is a private citizen.

Mr. Pelletiere said that at the time that he created the plan, he was an employee of Gov Guam.

Senator Taitague said that is something they need to look into and then clarified that DPR does not need the land in their name in order to do upkeep and make improvements.

Mr. Sablan said they can make improvements but cannot do anymore burials. He said they need more funding and personnel to make improvements.

Senator Taitague asked what other cemeteries DPR runs.

Mr. Sablan said they only run Tiguac.

Senator Taitague again questioned the need to have the property in DPR's name if they've been burying people in land they don't technically own all these years.

Mr. Borja said that the Government of Guam owns the subject plot under sovereign power. They can run into problems similar to Umatac cemetary when getting federal funds, they do not like to give property to another agency of the government that is different from the department that is applying for the assistance. He said the land was not registered and that the best way to assert your title is through legislation.

Chairman Ada thanked Senator Taitague and recognized Senator Chris Barnett.

Senator Barnett asked how frequently they get requests for burials.

Mr. Taitague said it varies.

Senator Barnett asked what is happening with the clearing there.

Mr. Taitague said they cleared it a bit to see what they are working with.

Senator Barnett brought up the lack of upkeep at the cemetery said he would like to see something that indicated what they want to do with the property.

Mr. Sablan said that the difference between Veterans Cemetery and Tiguac is that the Veterans' Cemetery has a dedicated staff to operate the cemetery.

Senator Barnett asked if the area is patrolled by the territorial park patrol.

Mr. Sablan said they make rounds there but people will go to the cemetery in the dark of night.

Mr. Pelletiere said that DPR staff and the operator of the backhoe they use also does work at the Veterans cemetery. They have brought up their plans in the past and asked for help. Veterans cemetery gets funding and sources they are not privy to.

Senator Barnett asked if they put in their budget the cost of what it would take to hire maintenance staff and get the equipment.

Mr. Pelletiere said there was a proposed bill for \$5 million and met with their department heads to see what their wants and needs are and if they could revisit that bill, it would address everything they need for the next five years.

Chairman Ada thanked Senator Barnett and recognized Senator Therese M. Terlaje.

Senator Terlaje addressed the State Historic Preservation Office and asked if they are providing testimony and if the land has been surveyed, when the land registration will be complete and why are they surveying the property for, why it was a priority to have the land registered, what the size of the property was, if the land is usable for other purposes, that it's unbelievable that there is a master plan that they cannot get access to before the hearing, if DLM has a master plan, asked when the land will be registered, that it seems like they are holding the plans back from the attorney general, what lands on their list for being registered are priority, if it's necessary to transfer land to DPR if GovGuam already owns the land, if DPR has applied for federal funds and if they are planning to apply, what the plans are for the cemetery, who the legal owner is of the existing cemetery.

Mr. Borja said the land has been surveyed for land purposes but not for archaeological purposes.

Mr. Sablan said the property is 30 acres but a big portion is not available. The back portion is not usable because it is in a ravine and Mr. Borja and Mr. Pelletiere reiterated.

Mr. Borja said he is not aware of any master plan.

Mr. Sablan also repeated that he has not seen any plan.

Mr. Pelletiere repeated that he has seen the plan and will reach out to the person who has the plan. He emphasized that he does not know if the plan was prepared by DLM but that it was prepared by an employee of DLM.

Mr. Borja said that they cannot control the court's calendar but registering the land is being worked on. He also said that there are a number of properties on their list for registration including CLTC properties.

Mr. Sablan repeated that the federal government changed their perception on grants to specific projects and insist that if they are going to put federal funds into a facility that it should be owned by the agency requesting the funding. He said they have personnel looking into different grants, not just for the cemetery.

Mr. Borja said he will have to look into who the legal owner of the property is.

Chairman Ada thanked Senator Terlaje and asked if the cemetery has a revolving fund and when was the last time the fee structure was looked at.

Mr. Sablan said the cemeteries do not have their own revolving fund.

Mr. Taitague said that they last looked at the fee structure in 2006 or 2006 and it was up to \$500. They are currently looking at revising the fee schedule.

Chairman Ada asked how many more burials they've done since COVID, referencing that there was an emergency back then where they needed to open more spaces.

Mr. Taitague said maybe over 2000. He also clarified that the eight plots they have available are for adults. They currently have maybe 50 to 100 plots available for infants.

Chairman Ada recognized Senator Barnes for closing remarks.

Senator Barnes stressed the importance of the cemetery as a community lifeline as the most affordable option for grieving families who cannot pay for the high costs associated with private cemeteries. The bill expands their only government managed cemetery. She said that the issue had been brought up before, before the pandemic and it's an issue they cannot keep kicking it further along.

Chairman Ada adjourned the public hearing at 9:29 am.

III. FINDINGS & RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee finds that the Vicente A. Limtiaco Memorial Park, located in the Tiguac area of Nimitz Hill, Piti is one of a few public cemeteries on Guam that still provides an affordable option for burial of loved ones who have passed away. While, the Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR) has faced numerous logistical and financial difficulties in maintaining the cemetery, one hurdle is clear; it is running out of space for burials.

The committee finds that subject lot in Bill No. 49-38 (COR), although properties surrounding the current cemetery be completely optimal, they are not suitable for purposes other than a cemetery.

With very few options for available land to expand the cemetery, the committee reports out the bill, however, an amendment is added to the bill that allows DPR to substitute the subject lot for a Government of Guam lot(s) of similar size provided the lot is adjacent to or in close proximity the cemetery boundary.

The Committee on Land, Environment, Housing, Agriculture, Parks and Infrastructure hereby reports out **Bill No. 49-38 (COR) As amended** - Senator Tina Rose Muña Barnes – "AN ACT TO TRANSFER LOT NO. 258, MUNICIPALITY OF PITI, TO THE DEPARTMENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF EXPANDING THE FOOTPRINT AND CAPACITY OF THE VICENTE A. 
DPR reported during the same January 31 site visit that utilizing the adjacent lot could result in an additional 5 years of capacity for the Vicente A. Limtiaco Memorial Park.

Therefore, it is the intention of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to transfer this adjacent lot to DPR, as the first step in expanding this necessary community resource, and allow the department staff to begin seeking funding from local and federal sources to develop and construct the necessary infrastructure and capital improvements that will fulfill their mission to provide affordable funeral plots to local families.

Section 2. Designated Use of Property. The use of Lot No. 258, in the Municipality of Piti, shall be consistent with the purpose of expanding the Vicente A. Limtiaco Memorial Park, and shall not be utilized for any other program or duty under the Department of Parks and Recreation.



Limtiaco Memorial Park provides the most affordable option to Guam residents, which can save families the added heartache and burden caused when trying to purchase a funeral plot or crypt at a private cemetery - a cost that may require additional debt or third-party fundraising on the part of the deceased's family.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan additionally finds an unassigned government-owned lot adjacent to the Tiguac-based cemetery, identified in land records as Lot No. 258, which according to DPR has been recently surveyed by the Department of Land Management (DLM), is available to expand the cemetery's current footprint, avoiding the lengthy, bureaucratic process of locating and opening up a new cemetery in another village.

DPR reported during the same January 31 site visit that utilizing the adjacent lot could result in an additional 5 years of capacity for the Vicente A. Limtiaco Memorial Park.


Therefore, it is the intention of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to transfer this adjacent lot to DPR, as the first step in expanding this necessary community resource, and allow the department staff to begin seeking funding from local and federal sources to develop and construct the necessary infrastructure and capital improvements that will fulfill their mission to provide affordable funeral plots to local families.

Section 2. Designated Use of Property. The use of Lot No. 258, in the Municipality of Piti, shall be consistent with the purpose of expanding the Vicente A. Limtiaco Memorial Park, and shall not be utilized for any other program or duty under the Department of Parks and Recreation.

Section 3. Transfer of Property. Lot No. 258, in the Municipality of Piti, consisting of a computed area of Forty-five Thousand Seven Hundred Ninety-Three (45,793) square meters as shown on Map No. 994957 (Lot), is hereby transferred to the Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR), pursuant to 21 GCA § 60112, for

- 1 the purpose of expanding the Vicente A. Limtiaco Memorial Park. A survey map
- 2 designating the area of Forty-five Thousand Seven Hundred Ninety-Three (45,793)
- 3 square meters (Map) for the property has been prepared, recorded, and provided by
- 4 the Department of Land Management for DPR. A copy of the Map is attached hereto
- 5 as Exhibit A.
- 6 Section 5 4. Issuance of Certificate of Title. The Department of Land
- 7 Management (DLM) shall issue a certificate of title for Lot No. 258 in the name of
- 8 the Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR) as owner in fee simple so long as the
- 9 Lot is used to expand the Vicente A. Limtiaco Memorial Park. If the use of Lot No.
- 10 258 is inconsistent with the purposes stated in Section 1 of this Act, then Lot No.
- 11 258 shall automatically revert to the government of Guam. These covenants shall be
- 12 contained in any certificate of title or deed issued by DLM to DPR under this Act.
- Section-65. Exemption from Appraisals. 2 GCA § 2107(b) and the
- 14 Standing Rules of I Mina'trentai Ocho Na Liheslaturan Guåhan, relative to land
- 15 appraisals, shall not apply to this Act.
- 16 Section 7 6. Effective Date. This Act shall become effective upon enactment.
- 17 Alternative Lots. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Department of
- 18 Parks and Recreation is authorized to substitute the lot cited in Sections 3 and 4 of this
- 19 Act with another lot(s) owned by the Government of Guam that is located within one-
- 20 <u>hundred (100)</u> meters of the periphery of the cemetery lot, provided that the total area
- of the alternative lot(s) does not exceed twelve (12) acres and that the administering
- 22 agency of said lot(s) agrees to the transfer. Nothing, herein this Act or in any other
- 23 provision of law, is intended to prevent the Department of Parks and Recreation from
- 24 <u>accepting land from the Government of the United States for purposes of expending</u>
- 25 <u>the cemetery.</u>
- Section 8 7. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any
- person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity *shall*

- 1 not affect other provisions or applications of this Act, which can be given effect
- 2 without the invalid provisions or applications, and to this end the provisions of this
- 3 Act are severable.






SATELLITE IMAGERY of Existing Conditions FROM GOOGLE EARTH 10/15/2023

The issuance of the certificate of title for said lot number from DLM to DPR as owner in fee simple is administrative in nature, but may incur administrative costs in the process. Additionally, any work on the said lot required by DPR to expand the municipal cemetary, i.e. land clearing, excavating, and/or construction will incur additional costs. However, absent information from DPR on what specific work will be required, a more detailed fiscal impact of this legislation cannot be determined at this time.
