**BUREAU OF BUDGET AND MANAGEMENT RESEARCH**  
**COMMENTS ON BILL NO. 300-38 (COR)**

**Bill No. 300-38** seeks to amend § 5141 of Chapter 5, Title 5 Guam Code Annotated, relative to expanding procurement training options in order to build a sufficient workforce, promote fairness and integrity that can reduce protests, and streamline government procurement.

*I Liheslatura Guahan* finds that procurement training modules courses offered by the Guam Community College (GCC) have been effective tools for procurement personnel. Consequently, Bill No. 300-38 seeks to expand the current “GCC Procurement Program” by introducing various amendments, such as the inclusion of an additional training module: “Practical Application (Advanced), bringing the program’s total to five (5) modules. The subject bill also revises prerequisites to include the requirement to complete additional modules to perform more advanced procurement roles. Additionally, the bill mandates that certifications remain valid for five years, after which recertification is required.

It should be noted that the GCC Procurement Program operates on a full-cost recovery basis, wherein the College promulgates fees to recover costs incurred. Should Bill No. 300-38 be enacted, GCC can anticipate absorbing the costs associated with program expansion, such as trainer fees, additional training materials, technology, and overhead. With additional prerequisites to certifications, agencies can also expect to pay more fees to complete additional modules. However, absent comment from the College, the Bureau cannot ascertain a specific fiscal impact at this time.
