The Bureau requests that Bill No. 224-38 (COR) be granted a waiver pursuant to Public Law 12-229 as amended for the following reason(s):

Bill No. 224-38 (COR) is an act to add a new Article 5 to Chapter 18, Title 1 of the Guam Code Annotated, relative to revitalizing mandatory Government-wide recycling.

The proposed legislation seeks to build upon the work of previous local leaders in establishing mandatory government recycling by requiring GEPA to create a centralized, online recycling resource guide for government and public use, codifying EO-2003-17 in the Guam Code Annotated, and by facilitating the completion of roles and regulations required by Public Law 24-304, in order to further enforce mandatory government recycling

The Bureau had sought input on the proposed Bill 224-38 (COR) from Guam Environmental Protection Agency and have not received any official comments as of the date of this fiscal note waiver. However, this bill is determined to be administrative in nature and poses no fiscal impact upon any funds of the Government of Guam.
