

The Bureau requests that Bill No. 299-38 (COR) be granted a waiver pursuant to Public Law 12-229 as amended for the following reason(s):

Bill No. 299-38 (COR) is an act to amend § 84108 of Chapter 84 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, relative to updating the emergency medical commission composition (EMS). The proposed legislation intends to amend the current statute to reduce the number of appointed members from seventeen (17) to sixteen (16); to include one (1) representative from the Guam Regional Medical City and one (1) representative from the US Naval Hospital as non-voting member. The proposed legislation also intends to reduce public-at-large representation from two (2) to one (1); and to remove representation from "Incumbent Local Exchange Carrier" in the EMS composition.

The Bureau has determined that the Bill is administrative in nature and poses no additional fiscal impact upon any of the funds of the Government of Guam.
