The Bureau requests that Bill No. 315-38 (COR) be granted a waiver pursuant to Public Law 12-229 as amended for the following reason(s):

Bill No. 315-38 (COR) is an act to add a new Article 6, Chapter 7, Title 9, Guam Code Annotated; relative to abolishing the “Rough Sex” Defense in cases of serious injury or death and to be cited as the “Krystal Mitchell Law”.

The proposed legislation dedicates the Act in memory of Krystal Jay Mitchell, an advocate for justice whose life was tragically taken in 2016. The purpose of this Act is to establish in Guam law that no person can lawfully consent to their own serious harm or death, and that such consent shall not serve as a defense or justification in any criminal prosecution.

Based on comments received regarding Bill No. 315-38 (COR), the Office of the Attorney General has stated that there is no fiscal impact for this bill.

As such, the bill is determined to be administrative in nature and poses no fiscal impact upon any funds of the Government of Guam.
