The Bureau requests that Bill No. 344-38 (LS) be granted a waiver pursuant to Public Law 12-229 as amended for the following reason(s):

Legislative Bill No. 344-38 (LS) intends to add a new § 1850, Article 5 to Chapter 18, Title 1 of the Guam Code Annotated, which would place a government-wide moratorium on fee increases to remain in effect for a period of twenty-four (24) months following the bill's enactment.

The proposed legislation is administrative in nature and would not fiscally impact the appropriations for FY 2026.
