AN ACT TO AMEND § 3102.3 OF ARTICLE 1, CHAPTER 3, DIVISION 2, TITLE 17, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO EXTENDING TERMS OF OFFICE AND IMPLEMENTING STAGGERED TERMS FOR THE GUAM EDUCATION BOARD TO ENHANCE STABILITY, CONTINUITY, AND FOCUS ON STUDENT OUTCOMES.

## 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that
- 3 Guam's public education system must prioritize equity and excellence to prepare all
- 4 students for future success. As the governing body for the Guam Department of
- 5 Education, the Guam Education Board holds critical responsibility for policy-setting
- 6 and oversight.
- 7 To promote greater stability, continuity, and community engagement, I
- 8 Liheslaturan Guåhan intends to reform the Board's composition and terms by
- 9 extending appointed and elected member terms to four (4) years and establishing
- 10 staggered elections. These measures aim to reduce frequent turnover, foster

1	institutional knowledge, and ensure consistent leadership focused on strategic			
2	planning and student achievement.			
3	By implementing these reforms, I Liheslaturan Guåhan reaffirms its			
4	commitment to a transparent, accountable, and effective education board that aligns			
5	with the needs and values of Guam's community, ultimately benefiting the island's			
6	children and future generations.			
7	Section 2. §3102.3(b) to Article 1, Chapter 3, Title 17, Guam Code			
8	Annotated is hereby amended to read as follows:			
9	§ 3102.3. Composition and Terms of Office for Board Members.			
10	The Board shall be composed and serve terms as follows:			
11	(a) Three (3) Appointed Voting Members. I Maga'håga/Maga'låhi			
12	shall appoint, subject to the advice and consent of I Liheslaturan Guåhan,			
13	one (1) voting member from among each of the following to serve for a term			
14	of three (3) four (4) years:			
15	(1) one (1) member who is employed in an upper level			
16	managerial position in a private business;			
17	(2) one (1) member who is a parent of a student enrolled within			
18	the Guam Department of Education; and			
19	(3) one (1) member who is a retired teacher or administrator of			
20	the Guam Department of Education.			
21	Terms of the appointed members shall be staggered such that one (1)			
22	term expires each year. Appointments made to fill a vacancy shall be for the			
23	remainder of the unexpired term only.			
24	(b) Six (6) Elected Voting Members. Six (6) voting members shall be			
25	elected at-large at each General Election. Each elected voting member shall			

1	serve for a term of two (2) four (4) years, commencing at 12:00 noon on the
2	first Monday in January following their election. A candidate for the Board
3	must be at least twenty-five (25) years old, and a resident of Guam for at least
4	five (5) years immediately proceeding preceding the date on which the
5	member takes office and continuing throughout the term.
6	(1) Nomination of candidates for election to the Board shall be
7	made by petition on forms prescribed by the Guam Election
8	Commission (Commission) and initiated by the candidate. In order for
9	a candidate's name to be placed on the ballot for election to the Board,
10	such petition must be signed by not less than one hundred fifty (150)
11	persons registered to vote in Guam and must be filed with the
12	Commission no later than the first Monday after a Primary Election,
13	unless such date is a holiday, in which it shall be filed the day
14	following the holiday, or sixty (60) days prior to a Special Election. No
15	defect in any nominating petition presented to the Commission shall
16	prevent the filing of another petition which is presented within the
17	allowed filing period.
18	(2) The election provided for within this Subsection (b) shall be
19	non-partisan, and no political party shall directly or indirectly sponsor,
20	nominate or endorse any of the candidates for such office.
21	(3) Staggered Terms for Elected Members: To ensure continuity,
22	the terms of office for members elected under this Section shall be
23	staggered as follows:
24	(A) At the first General Election following the enactment
25	of this Section, the three (3) candidates receiving the highest

1	number of votes shall serve terms of four (4) years, and the three
2	(3) candidates receiving the next highest number of votes shall
3	serve terms of two (2) years.
4	(B) Thereafter, at each biennial General Election, three (3)
5	members shall be elected to serve four-year terms.
6	(c) Non-Voting Members. The Board shall have the following non-
7	voting members serving a term of one (1) year:
8	(1) one (1) student member of the Board shall be elected by an
9	Island-wide School Board of Governing Students. The student member
10	shall be a junior or a senior at a public high school and maintain a grade
11	point average of 2.5 or above; and the student member shall receive
12	service- learning credits for the service hours on the Board; and
13	(2) one (1) member appointed by the exclusive bargaining unit
14	which represents teachers and other employees within the Department.
15	(d) Non-Voting Member of the Mayors' Council of Guam. One (1)
16	member appointed by the Mayors' Council of Guam who shall serve for a
17	term of two (2) years, or for the remaining term of the appointed Mayor,
18	whichever is longer.
19	Section 3. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any
20	person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity
21	shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect
22	without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of the
23	provisions of this Act are severable
24	<b>Section 4. Effective Date.</b> This Act shall become effective upon enactment.
