AN ACT TO ADD A NEW CHAPTER 56 TO DIVISION 5 OF TITLE 17, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING THE "GUAM VETERANS HIGHER **EDUCATION BENEFITS ACT."**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that the people of Guam owe a profound debt of gratitude to the veterans who entered the U.S. Armed Forces from Guam, and to their spouses and dependents, for their distinguished service and immense sacrifice. While federal educational assistance programs provide valuable support, it is the finding of this body that the establishment of a distinctly local benefits program is a moral imperative that demonstrates Guam's unwavering commitment to honoring and supporting its veterans and their families.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that, with a significant veteran population residing on Guam, many of whom, along with their families, encounter substantial financial obstacles to accessing higher education, it is in the public interest to remove such barriers. Providing these educational benefits is not merely an act of gratitude

1	but a strategic investment in the intellectual capital and economic prosperity of our			
2	island. By enhancing access to higher education at the University of Guam and the			
3	Guam Community College, this Act will directly contribute to a more skilled and			
4	capable workforce, fostering economic growth and ensuring our veterans and their			
5	families can achieve their full potential.			
6	Therefore, it is the express purpose of this Act to establish the "Guam			
7	Veterans Higher Education Benefits Act." This legislation is designed to provide			
8	meaningful tuition assistance, modeled after effective programs such as the Texas			
9	Hazlewood Act, yet carefully tailored to the fiscal and institutional framework of			
10	Guam. It is the intent of this Legislature that the Act be implemented without			
11	requiring new appropriations, by leveraging existing institutional capacities for			
12	tuition waivers at the University of Guam and the Guam Community College.			
13	Section 2. A new Chapter 56 is added to Division 5 of Title 17, Guam Code			
14	Annotated, to read as follows:

18	compliance with the provisions of this Chapter.
19	(b) The government of Guam entity responsible for veterans affairs shall
20	provide necessary assistance in the verification of a veteran's status,
21	service record, and eligibility for benefits under this Chapter upon request
22	by an Institution.
23	§ 56106. Implementation.
24	(a) The benefits prescribed by this Chapter shall be implemented and
25	provided by the University of Guam and the Guam Community College
26	through a tuition waiver mechanism;

1	(b) It is the express intent of the Legislature that the implementation of this
2	Chapter shall require no additional appropriation from the General Fund.
3	The costs associated with the tuition exemptions shall be absorbed by the
4	Institutions as a civic and public duty.
5	(c) The University of Guam and the Guam Community College shall each:
6	(1) Develop and publish clear procedures for the application and
7	processing of tuition exemptions consistent with institutional
8	enrollment timelines and course availability;
9	(2) Submit a report to I Liheslaturan Guåhan no later than ninety (90)
10	days after the end of each academic year, detailing the number of
11	beneficiaries served, the total number of credit hours exempted, and
12	the calculated value of the tuition waived;
13	(3) Implement control measures to ensure that the granting of
14	exemptions under this Chapter does not result in the displacement
15	of any tuition-paying student from any course or program.
16	Section 3. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any
17	person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity
18	shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect
19	without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of the
20	provisions of this Act are severable
21	Section 4. Effective Date. This Act shall become effective upon enactment.
