AN ACT TO AMEND §§ 3102.1 AND 3125 OF ARTICLE 1, CHAPTER 3, DIVISION 2, TITLE 17, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO REQUIRING GUAM EDUCATION BOARD CONFIRMATION OF DEPUTY SUPERINTENDENT APPOINTMENTS TO ENHANCE OVERSIGHT, ACCOUNTABILITY, AND FOCUS ON STUDENT OUTCOMES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that
Guam's public education system demands equitable and effective leadership to
ensure success for all students. As the policy-setting and oversight body for the
Guam Department of Education, the Guam Education Board plays a vital role in
maintaining governance integrity. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* intends to mandate Board confirmation of Deputy

I Liheslaturan Guåhan intends to mandate Board confirmation of Deputy Superintendent appointments, along with public posting and Board approval of qualifications to promote greater accountability and transparency. These measures aim to align leadership selections with community values, mitigate potential conflicts, and support collaborative decision-making.

1	I Liheslaturan Guåhan further seeks to strengthen a professional Board
2	focused on strategic oversight and community engagement, ultimately advancing the
3	educational future of Guam's children by enacting these reforms.
4	Section 2. §3102.1 to Article 1, Chapter 3, Division 2, Title 17, Guam Code
5	Annotated is hereby amended to read as follows:
6	§ 3102.1. Duties of the Guam Education Board.
7	The Guam Education Board shall be responsible for all policies that govern the
8	Department of Education (hereinafter "Department"). The Board shall have the
9	authority to delegate such of its powers as it may deem appropriate, but shall retain
10	the ultimate responsibility for the exercise of its powers.
11	The Board, among other duties, shall perform the following in accordance with
12	applicable law:
13	(a) select and appoint a Superintendent and support him/her in the discharge
14	of his/her duties;
15	(b) receive, evaluate and act upon the recommendations and reports of the
16	Superintendent;
17	(c) adopt an annual budget and control expenditures accordingly; review
18	periodic financial reports and modify the budget if and when necessary;
19	(d) adopt student performance standards and assessment models;
20	(e) ensure that the Superintendent addresses the proper administration of all
21	mandated responsibilities;
22	(f) adopt attendance areas and school boundaries
23	(g) sue and/or defend itself in suits at law;
24	(h) report routine complaints and concerns related to the Department's
25	operations directly to the Superintendent for appropriate investigation and
26	response;

1	(i) have no business or pecuniary interest which will conflict with the
2	activities of the Board;
3	(j) establish student discipline policy;
4	(k) establish a school calendar;
5	(l) establish graduation standards;
6	(m) periodically review established policies for refinement and
7	improvement;
8	(n) serve as Guam's State Education Policy/Governing Board for Federal
9	programs where such a board is required by Federal law, to include, but not be
10	limited to, the Head Start Program;
11	(o) act as the approving authority on behalf of the Department for collective
12	bargaining agreements;
13	(p) make recommendations to I Maga'håga/Maga'låhen Guåhan or I
14	Liheslaturan Guåhan for changes, additions or deletions to Guam Education Laws;
15	(q) each newly elected or appointed Board member shall complete, during
16	the first year of that member's first term, a training program to be prepared and
17	offered by the University of Guam and the Department, regarding the skills and
18	knowledge necessary to serve as a local school board member. The training
19	program shall include:
20	(1) review of the Guam Code Annotated and other laws pertaining to
21	DOE;
22	(2) Robert's Rules of Order;
23	(3) the budgeting procedures and guidelines of the government of
24	Guam and the Department; and
25	(4) difference(s) between policy making and micromanagement of the
26	affairs of the Department; and

- (r) the role of the Board, as with any legislative body, is to act collectively, not individually. Any Board member shall report to I Liheslaturan Guåhan any potential or alleged violation of this Subsection. The Board shall not:
- (1) interfere in or micro-manage the affairs of the Department, or schools within the Department; or

- (2) involve itself with student discipline cases, unless expressly authorized by public law, and only to the extent authorized by public law.
- 8 (s) adopt a policy concerning the use of electronic security systems on 9 school campuses, to include, but not limited to, emergency contact protocols.
 - (t) Confirm the Superintendent's appointment of a Deputy Superintendent by majority vote, subject to the rules and procedures established by the Board.
 - **Section 3.** §3125 to Article 1, Chapter 3, Title 17, Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

" §3125. Chief Financial Officer Deputy Superintendents

(a) Unclassified Deputy Superintendent(s) Appointment. The Superintendent shall reserve the right to select unclassified Deputy Superintendent(s) as his management team with full management responsibility and authority as delegated unto him or her by the Superintendent. Such unclassified Deputy Superintendent(s) appointees may number from one (1) but shall not exceed four (4), unless otherwise approved by the Guam Education Policy Board. The unclassified Deputy Superintendent(s) appointed positions shall cover, but not be limited to: The Superintendent is vested with the authority to appoint Deputy Superintendents to serve as members of the management team. Each Deputy Superintendent shall possess management responsibilities and authority as delegated by the Superintendent. Such appointments shall be subject to confirmation by a majority vote of the Guam Education Board. The number of Deputy

1	Superintendents shall be not less than one (1) and shall not exceed four (4)
2	unless otherwise approved by the Guam Education Board. The Deputy
3	Superintendent positions shall include, but not be limited to:
4	(1) Deputy Superintendent, Finance and Administrative
5	Services;
6	(2) Deputy Superintendent, Assessment and Accountability;
7	(3) Deputy Superintendent, Curriculum and Instructional
8	Improvement;
9	(4) Deputy Superintendent, Educational Support and
10	Community Learning.
11	(b) Unclassified Status. Notwithstanding any other provision of law,
12	members of the management team may be selected through direct appointment or
13	through contractual arrangement and may be terminated at will and without cause.
14	Sole authority for selection and termination of management team personnel rests
15	with the Superintendent of Education. The authority for selection and termination
16	rests with the Superintendent of Education, subject to the confirmation and review
17	provisions of this Section.
18	(c) Compensation. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, personnel
19	from the Department of Education who are selected appointed as a management
20	team member shall receive compensation at no more than the maximum salary
21	established for the Superintendent of DOE.
22	(d) Qualifications. The Superintendent shall establish qualifications
23	demonstrating quantifiable criteria to define the skills required for each of the
24	positions, which qualifications shall be subject to approval by the Board. The
25	Superintendent shall establish, and publicly post minimum qualifications and
26	quantifiable criteria required for each Deputy Superintendent position. Such

- 1 qualifications shall be subject to review and approval by the Guam Education
- 2 Board prior to appointment confirmation.
- 3 Section 4. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any
- 4 person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity
- 5 shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect
- 6 without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of the
- 7 provisions of this Act are severable
- 8 **Section 5. Effective Date.** This Act shall become effective upon enactment.
