WHEREAS, †Antonio A. Calvo ("Mr. Calvo"), born on June 5, 1927, to Gregorio Leon Guerrero Calvo and Maria Rosario Acosta Calvo, was the youngest of eight children Rita Calvo Artero, Maria Calvo Flores, Manuel Calvo, Pedro Calvo, Gregorio Calvo, Jose Flores, and Antonio Flores, and was raised with an enduring commitment to faith, family, and service; and

WHEREAS, Antonio Calvo married Celestina Pangelinan on July 23, 1955, and together they built a strong and loving family, raising eleven (11) children, Elena, Tina, Juanita, Anthony, Eduardo, Teresa, Patricia, Celena, Corina, Gregorio, and Manuel, instilling in them the same values of humility, compassion, and dedication to community that guided his own life; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Calvo began his journey in public service as a File Clerk in the Governor's Office from 1951 – 1952, later commissioned by Governor Carlton Skinner as a Second Lieutenant to the first regiment of the Guam Militia, where he faithfully served from 1952 to 1954, demonstrating patriotism and leadership in service to the island and the country; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Calvo later served at the Governor's Office/Passport Office from 1954 – 1968, contributing to essential government operations during a time of rapid growth and change for Guam; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Calvo was elected Commissioner of the Village of Yigo, serving three (3) full terms from 1969 to 1981, where he worked tirelessly to uplift his community with dignity, quiet strength, and a commitment to improving the quality of life for every resident; and

WHEREAS, during his leadership as Commissioner, Mr. Calvo spearheaded important initiatives, including the 1969 American Red Cross Fundraising Campaign in Yigo, demonstrating his dedication to humanitarian causes and community welfare; and

WHEREAS, beyond local government service, Mr. Calvo contributed significantly to island-wide civic progress, including serving as an Election Commission Clerk for Yigo in 1956, and participating in Guam's First Constitutional Convention from 1969–1970, reviewing the Organic Act of Guam and recommending revisions to the United States Congress during 44 General Sessions, helping shape the framework of Guam's governmental identity; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Calvo continued his public service as Deputy Director of Guam Mass Transit from 1982 – 1984, and later was honored as Grand Marshal of the 2011 Liberation Day Parade, recognized for his lifetime of community leadership and service; and

WHEREAS, during his years of public service, Mr. Calvo collaborated and worked for the Guam Legislature as a Community Service Worker II from 1997 to 2003 under the late Honorable Speaker Antonio Unpingco, prior to that, he served under the late Senator Ernesto Espaldon and late Speaker Tommy Tanaka, forging strong partnerships to develop programs and resources for the people of Guam; and

WHEREAS, throughout his life, Antonio Calvo was known not merely for the positions he held, but for the kindness, humor, humility, and steadiness with which he carried them, quietly improving lives, leading with integrity, and strengthening the island through example; and

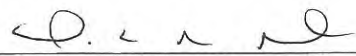
