

<p>I attended the MidYear meeting of the Conference of State Court Administrators at the invitation of the Administrator of the Courts, who was encouraged to bring her deputy based on topics on the meeting agenda.</p> <p>Sessions on the first day of the meeting covered tools and strategies for advocating for financial support from the appropriations-making body, for handling budget constraints, and for supplementing budget needs where appropriate. Several of the panelists offered tips for revenue enhancement and cost savings measures. I took particular note of one jurisdiction's efforts to reduce technical violations that may result in incarceration which would thereby lead to reduced detention costs.</p> <p>Other topics on the first day included managing case management system transitions, which was particularly relevant for us as we make the move from JustWare to eCourt and eSupervision, and how to manage Court-Vendor partnerships.</p> <p>The second day of the meeting consisted of several sessions on artificial intelligence (A.I.). Among the most helpful tips was a framework for assessment regarding when and how to use A.I. For example, a highlighted inquiry was what the direct impact the use of A.I. would have on the delivery of justice services and even more specifically, what the consequences of getting it wrong would be. Additionally, a thoughtful observation that I found relevant was that given the cost of the deployment of such technologies and the speed of innovation, what one might assume would develop an efficiency or reduced cost may not actually have that benefit.</p> <p>All of this information is helpful to me as I carry out my duties as Deputy AOC, which include leading efforts in our transition from JustWare to eCourt and eSupervision and managing the daily operations of the Judiciary.</p>

I attended the annual Appellate Judges Education Institute (AJEI) Summit for Judges and Lawyers from November 13-16, 2025, in Minneapolis, MN. AJEI is the preeminent provider of education for appellate judges and lawyers in the United States. The 2025 Summit was attended by hundreds of judges, lawyers, and staff attorneys from across the country. The educational program featured a number of highly regarded speakers covering a wide range of topics on appellate courts and appellate practice, including a session on the death of the Chevron doctrine featuring former Solicitor General Elizabeth Prelogar, advanced appellate writing taught by Professor Joe Regalia, and a U.S. Supreme Court update by Dean Erwin Chemerinsky. Additionally, I was a member of the education committee for this year's Summit and put together a panel of speakers for a session on the evolving standards of review of digital evidence.

The summit is the primary educational program for appellate judges. The presenters bring to the judges attention important developments in the law, provides seminars to improve our skills and other information relative to the administration of the courts.

U. S. Constitutional Law. The main presenter on constitutional law was Dean Erwin Chemerinsky. He reviewed the important cases from the most recent U. S. Supreme Court's term. He also commented on important cases that will be heard in the new term. Other sessions included discussion of regulatory power in light of the death of the Chevron doctrine. One presentation was on the Roberts Court in the areas of separation of powers and originalism. Finally, there was a session on standing.

Some seminars provided information on improving our skills. There was one on advanced legal writing. Another was on appeals using AI. This included comments on counsel's use of AI and the Court's use of AI. The primary concerns were verifying truthfulness and completeness. A group reminded us of our responsibility to be fair and impartial by discussing respect for LGBTQ litigants. Another presentation concerned disagreement in reaching conclusion. The distinction and role of dissent and concurrence were explained.

Of great concern to state courts is the view that courts have become partisan and that decisions are based on political affiliation. There was an important discussion of restoring public confidence in the Courts.

Discussions impacting the administration of justice included Appropriate Response to judicial and lawyer misconduct. Also discussed was the growing number of amicus participants in litigation. Of concern is the how amicus' briefs and argument impact the decision considering that they are not parties.

Two other topics of interest were the new structure of military courts including the appeal process and the role of state constitutional rights in light of some recent U.S. Supreme Court decisions.

The Conference of State Court Administrators (COSCA) held its Midyear meeting in Savannah, Georgia. The Midyear meeting attended by state court administrators from all court jurisdictions provided educational training to the attendees on various topics relevant to court administration including budget management, managing technology solutions and challenges, AI readiness for courts, case management systems, and language access.

The sessions I attended provided me with practical skills I can apply in my position as administrator. The sessions allowed for meaningful dialogue from the court administrators and participants about how the topics presented can help improve the overall mission of delivering justice. While all the sessions were relevant, the topics most relevant to existing work with our Judiciary were the sessions on case management systems (CMS) as we are in the final stages of migrating our current CMS, Artificial Intelligence to learn more about how AI can be a component to improve access to justice and automation, and ensuring we have an adequate budget to ensure access to justice is provided.

I also attended the General Business meeting for COSCA members and during the meeting provided a written and oral report on subcommittee work for the subcommittee on Courts, Children and Families which I co-chair. COSCA members were also required to provide updates about their courts at the Western Region meeting. Finally, as a member of the Court Statistics Committee, the committee held a meeting to discuss data needs and updates.

Overall, attending the COSCA Midyear meeting has helped me learn more about advancing and improving the work of our court operations, engage and network with other court administrators, and applying what I have learned to our court. The education sessions presented also provided information relevant to several of the Judiciary's Strategic Pillars.


