EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2026-03

**RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING GOVERNMENT LEADERSHIP IN ENERGY
REDUCTION AND GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS REDUCTIONS TO
ACHIEVE NET-ZERO EMISSIONS BY 2045**

WHEREAS, Guam is already experiencing the impacts of climate change, including rising temperatures and sea levels, stronger storms, risks to freshwater supplies, and coral reef degradation, all of which have significant effects on the health and well-being of our population; and

WHEREAS, these climate risks continue to intensify, costing the government and residents millions of dollars in recovery costs in the event of disasters;

WHEREAS, Guam is a member of the U.S. Climate Alliance and is committed to accelerating greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions reductions and climate resilience consistent with the goals of the Paris Agreement, including achieving net-zero emissions by no later than 2050; and the Government of Guam further commits to exceeding this goal by achieving net-zero emissions from its operations by 2045;

WHEREAS, Guam has committed to and made progress toward climate-friendly goals that include objectives targeting emissions, clean energy, transportation, and natural lands through the Guam Green Growth Initiative, the Priority Climate Action Plan, the Clean Energy Master Plan, the Guam Zero Waste Master Plan, and the pending Guåhan 2050 Sustainability Plan and Climate Action Plan;

WHEREAS, Guam, as an island territory with finite resources, is heavily reliant on imported and price-volatile fossil fuels for power generation and transportation, underscoring the need for bold public leadership and action;

WHEREAS, government operations represent a sizable share of the island's energy use and emissions, and it is essential that the Government of Guam lead by example in adopting energy-efficient practices, transitioning to clean energy sources, decarbonizing its vehicle fleets, and reducing its overall greenhouse gas footprint;

WHEREAS, advances in green building practices, clean technologies, and energy and water management can enhance sustainability and resilience, improve air quality, and protect public health for Guam's communities;

WHEREAS, energy and water efficiency improvements in government buildings and operations save the government money and boost Guam's economy by investing in green technology companies and green jobs;

WHEREAS, natural and green landscaping initiatives at government facilities help sequester carbon, enhance air quality, reduce heat impacts, beautify facilities, prevent erosion, and reduce the risk of flooding;

WHEREAS, wastewater treatment practices also contribute to greenhouse gas emissions, particularly methane and nitrous oxide, and reducing the amount of water requiring treatment will contribute to emissions reductions in the wastewater sector;

WHEREAS, solid waste that ends up in landfills contributes to Guam's greenhouse gas emissions, including methane, has the potential to contaminate land and water resources, and reduces the island's limited available space; increasing recycling efforts and reducing landfill waste will help mitigate these issues;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LOURDES A. LEON GUERRERO, *Maga'hågan Guåhan*, Governor of Guam, and by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Organic Act of Guam and the laws of Guam, do hereby order:

I. Implementation of Energy Efficiency Targets

- A. The Government of Guam and its Agencies shall work to reduce total GHG emissions from its operations by at least **50% below 2023 levels by 2035**.
- B. The Government of Guam's goal is to achieve **net-zero GHG emissions from its operations by 2045**.
- C. The Government of Guam and its Agencies shall focus on increasing energy efficiency in operations with a goal of **reducing total energy use by at least 15% from 2023 levels by 2035, with a total reduction of 30% from 2023 levels by 2045**.
- D. Interim performance targets shall be established for energy use reduction, renewable energy adoption, fleet electrification, and emissions reporting by the Office of the Governor, or its designee.

II. Strategies and Actions

The Government of Guam Agencies are further directed to focus on the following key areas to reduce their GHG emissions:

- A. **New Buildings:** All new government buildings, built-to-suit leased buildings, and major renovations that cost more than 50 percent of the replacement cost of the building shall, when feasible, be designed and constructed to maximize energy and water efficiency and energy generation potential, and to use building materials that reduce the carbon footprint of the project. Agencies may seek U.S. Green Building Council LEED certification, Green Building Initiative Green Globes certification, or a comparable certification from another accredited sustainable building certification program where appropriate.

- B. **Energy Efficiency:** Existing government buildings and facilities, whether owned by the Government of Guam or leased, shall, to the extent feasible, implement policies and programs to reduce energy consumption.
 - C. **Onsite Renewable Energy:** Government Agencies, in coordination with the Guam Power Authority, shall, to the extent feasible, increase onsite renewable energy generation, such as solar or photovoltaic generation, and energy storage capabilities.
 - D. **Government Fleets:** Zero-emission vehicles shall be prioritized in procurement to transition government vehicle fleets. The Government of Guam shall, if appropriate vehicles are available, replace 25% of the vehicle fleet with battery electric or plug-in hybrid electric vehicles by 2035, and 100% by 2045. Government agencies shall evaluate opportunities to reduce vehicle miles traveled and incorporate new technology where appropriate.
 - E. **EV Charging:** The Government of Guam shall, if feasible, require new construction, substantially renovated buildings, and other public improvements involving significant parking lot improvements to include infrastructure readiness measures for future electric vehicle charging installations and, where feasible, publicly accessible charging infrastructure.
 - F. **Green Spaces:** Guam governmental agencies shall develop and maintain robust landscaping and green space plans on their properties to sequester carbon, prioritizing the use of native species and plants that can help retain water to prevent flooding and soil erosion. Government properties shall protect native forests and support reforestation efforts where feasible.
 - G. **Water Use:** Guam government buildings and facilities shall work to reduce overall water use by 10% by 2035 and by 20% by 2045, as measured against a 2023 baseline.
 - H. **Solid Waste and Recycling:** Guam governmental agencies shall, in government-owned and leased facilities and public spaces, implement mandatory recycling of materials accepted in Guam's recycling facilities. Agencies shall analyze how and where solid waste from their facilities can be reduced and diverted from landfills, including, but not limited to, reducing source material, separating organic materials for composting, and repairing and reusing materials when feasible.
- III. Agency Responsibilities**
- A. All Guam governmental agencies shall work to implement reduction strategies in their facilities, fleets, procurement practices, and operations, and to achieve the goals set forth in this Order.

- B. Each agency head shall designate a senior staff member responsible for coordinating compliance with this Order and the Plan.
- C. Each agency shall develop policies to incorporate the strategies outlined in this Order to achieve the emission reduction goals.
- D. Each agency shall cooperate with the Bureau of Statistics and Plans (BSP) to track and analyze agency utility usage.

IV. Implementation and Review

- A. BSP shall compile and issue a government-wide preliminary progress report within one year of this Order and annually thereafter.
- B. The Government of Guam shall, as necessary, revise strategies and targets every five years to align with technological advances, financial resources, and updated science.

IV. Effective Date

This Order shall take effect immediately.
