This Settlement Agreement by and between Maria Apuron (“Employee”) and the Office of the Attorney General of Guam (“Management”) is as follows:

RECITALS

- A. Employee commenced a Grievance Appeal before the Civil Service Commission on November 5, 2025; and,
- B. The parties desire to enter into this Settlement Agreement (hereinafter

COPY

1 “Agreement”) for this matter to provide for certain arrangements in full settlement and
2 discharge of the Appeal in a fair and equitable means and upon the terms and conditions
3 set forth herein; and,

4 C. The terms and conditions of this Agreement shall become operative upon
5 execution of this Agreement.

6 NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual promises set forth
7 herein, the parties agree as follows:

8 **1. Purpose of Agreement.** Employee and Management acknowledge and agree
9 that this Agreement is a Settlement and Compromise of the referenced matter. It is the
10 intention of the parties by the execution of this Agreement to fully, finally and completely
11 resolve all disputes between them regarding these matters, in the manner more
12 specifically set forth in the terms of this Agreement that follow.

13 **2. Employee’s Obligations.**

14 2.1 Employee agrees that Management detailed her to the position of Acting Chief
15 Investigator on December 18, 2023. The detail was memorialized by the appointing
16 authority, the Attorney General of Guam, on this same day. The detail terminated on
17 January 27, 2025. The personnel action effectuating the detail prescribed an hourly rate
18 of pay of \$48.07. Notwithstanding the detail directive, Employee has actually been paid
19 at a rate equal to \$43.95 from the effective date of the detail to its termination.

20 2.2 Employee agrees that a Civil Service Commission Decision and Order should
21 accompany this Settlement Agreement.

22 **3. Management’s Obligations.**

23 3.1 Management agrees that Employee was detailed to the position of Acting
24 Chief Investigator on December 18, 2023. Management agrees that the terms of the
25 detail specified that Employee was to be paid at grade QL21-10 with an annual salary of
\$99,992. On information and belief Management believes Employee has actually been
paid at grade NL21-15 with an annual salary of 91,423 from the effective date of the detail
to present. This represents a pay shortage of \$7,513 for the pay periods beginning

1 December 18, 2023 and ending on February 8, 2025.

2 3.2 Management agrees with this calculation, subject to confirmation of
3 Employee's hours worked by the Payroll Section of the Department of Administration.

4 3.3. Management agrees that a Civil Service Commission Decision and Order
5 should accompany this Settlement Agreement.

6 3.4 Management agrees that it shall inform the Government of Guam Retirement
7 Fund as to period of detail and the correct detail pay so that Employee may receive the
8 appropriate credit toward her retirement.

9 3.5 Management shall pay the funds provided for in Section 3.1 of this Agreement
10 to the Employee's account with the Government of Guam Defined Benefit Retirement
11 Plan as directed by Employee.

12 **4. Performance Accepted.** The parties agree and acknowledge that:

13 a. they accept performance of their obligations specified in this Agreement as a
14 full and complete compromise of the matters involving disputed issues;

15 b. the negotiations for this settlement (including all statements, admissions or
16 communications by the parties or their attorneys or representatives shall not be
17 considered by and of said parties; and

18 c. no past or present wrong doing on the part of the parties shall be implied by
19 such negotiations.

20 **5. Release.** Each party represents and warrants that it is not aware of any claim
21 related to the Grievance, other than the claims set forth in the Greivance. Each party
22 expressly understands and acknowledges that it is possible that unknown losses or
23 claims exist or that present losses may have been underestimated in amount or severity,
24 and explicitly took that into account in determining the amount of consideration to be
25 given in the making of this Agreement, and a portion of said consideration and the mutual
covenants contained in it have been bargained for between the parties with the
knowledge of the possibility of such unknown claims, and were given in exchange for a

1 full accord and satisfaction and discharge of all such claims. Consequently, with respect
2 to such unknown claims or losses, each party knowingly and voluntarily waives any and
3 all rights under 18 G.C.A. § 82602, under principles of common law, or any comparable or
4 similar law of any state or territory of the United States or any other applicable
jurisdiction.

5 **6. Additional Documents.** All parties agree to cooperate and fully execute any
6 and all supplementary documents and take all additional actions as may be necessary
7 and appropriate to give full force and effect to the basic terms and intent of this
8 Agreement within 10 days of its approval by the Commission.


9 **7. Independent Advice of Counsel.** Each party represents and declares that it
10 has received independent advice from its respective attorneys and representatives with
11 report to the advisability of entering into this agreement and executing it. Each party
12 further represents and declares that it has not relied upon any statement or
13 representation by the other party or any of its partners, agents, employees or attorneys in
14 executing this Agreement or in making the settlement provided for, except as expressly
set out here.

15 **8. Voluntary Agreement.** Each party represents and declares that it has carefully
16 read this Agreement, that it knows the contents of this Agreement, and that it has signed
17 the same freely and voluntarily.
