1 **Section ____.** § 30118.1 of Article 1, Chapter 30, Title 5, Guam Code
2 Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

3 **“§ 30118.1. Fiscal Authority Accounting; Expenditures.**

4 (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, The Office of
5 the Attorney General shall directly control and be responsible for the
6 conduct of operational matters addressing its financial activities, in
7 accordance with and consistent with the provisions contained herein.

8 (b) ~~The Department of Administration shall establish, for the~~
9 ~~benefit of the Office of the Attorney General, a~~ fund to be known as the
10 “Office of the Attorney General Operations Fund,” hereafter referred to as
11 the “Fund,” which shall be ~~maintained by the general administrative services~~
12 ~~of the Department of Administration~~ separate and apart from other funds of
13 the government of Guam, and independent records and accounts shall be
14 maintained in connection therewith. Financial statements detailing the
15 revenues generated and expenses incurred of the Fund shall be submitted to
16 the *Speaker of I Liheslaturan Guåhan* quarterly, or as otherwise required by
17 law. No other government departments or entities, including the Department
18 of Administration, shall be allowed to manage the Fund, including
19 withholding amounts appropriated to the AG’s Office by I Liheslaturan
20 Guåhan.

21 (c) All monies, except for monies required by law to be deposited
22 in a special fund, received by the Office of the Attorney General, from
23 whatever source derived, shall be deposited into the Fund bank account of an
24 eligible bank, ~~as defined in 5GCA § 21112, which is procured by the~~
25 ~~Department of Administration.~~ An eligible bank shall mean any bank

1 organized and operating under the National Banking Laws as a national bank
2 and approved by the Attorney General; any bank or territorial bank
3 organized under the laws of any state or territory of the United States
4 authorized and licensed to conduct the business of banking in Guam and
5 approved by the Attorney General; and any savings and loan association
6 organized under the laws of Guam which is an insured institution, as defined
7 in Title IV of the National Housing Act, and which has been approved by the
8 Attorney General.

9 (d) ~~All expenditures from the Fund shall be made by the~~
10 ~~Department of Administration, at the direction of the Office of the Attorney~~
11 ~~General.~~ The Attorney General shall take all action to ensure that the Fund is
12 operating in conformity with all existing statutes, rules and regulations,
13 codes, executive orders and any other authority, which is applicable to the
14 operations of the Fund. Any balance remaining in the funds at the end of the
15 fiscal year shall carry over into the next fiscal year or until expended. The
16 Attorney General shall hire accounting professionals to manage the Fund.

17 (e) ~~The Department of Administration shall adopt a uniform~~
18 ~~system of accounting, consistent with other government of Guam~~
19 ~~requirements, for the Fund and special funds of the Office of Attorney~~
20 ~~General.~~ All expenditures from the Fund shall be made, at the direction of
21 the Office of the Attorney General. The Attorney General may expend
22 funds for operations, personnel services, contractual services and other
23 expenditures allowed for in law or as deemed necessary for the effective
24 performance of his law office.

1 (f) All disbursement transactions on the Fund shall be as stipulated
2 herein:

3 (1) the Attorney General or a duly authorized fiscal officer or
4 designated Deputy Attorney General of the Office of the
5 Attorney General shall approve all expenditures from the Fund;

6 (2) there must be two (2) authorized signatures, to be affixed
7 by the Attorney General or a duly authorized fiscal officer or
8 designated Deputy Attorney General of the Office of the
9 Attorney General; and

10 (3) the Attorney General or a duly authorized fiscal officer or
11 designated Deputy Attorney General of the Office of the
12 Attorney General shall be responsible for receipts and other
13 substantiation for all checks issued.

14 (g) The Office of the Attorney General shall adopt a uniform
15 system of accounting, consistent with other government of Guam
16 requirements, for the Fund and special funds of the Office of the Attorney
17 General. The Attorney General shall procure an accounting system,
18 inclusive of a payroll function, for this purpose.

19 (h) Notwithstanding any other provision of the law, including the
20 Guam Procurement Law, the Attorney General of Guam shall be granted
21 procurement authority, as defined by Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, for
22 purchases and contracts. The Attorney General shall adhere to the
23 applicable procurement laws, rules and regulations. Procurements by the
24 Office of the Attorney General shall not be subject to approval or signature
25 by the Governor of Guam, including under 5 GCA § 22601. Further, because

1 the Attorney General and the attorneys of the Office of the Attorney General
2 advise and oversee government procurement matters, including 5 GCA §
3 5150 procurement reviews, they shall be exempt from the provisions of §
4 5141 of Chapter 5, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated.

5 (i) The Consumer Protection Fund (as defined in § 32131 of
6 Chapter 32, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated), the Office of the Attorney
7 General Special Fund (as defined in § 30205 of Chapter 30, Title 5, Guam
8 Code Annotated), the Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund (as defined in §
9 161.95 of Chapter 161, Title 8, Guam Code Annotated), the Opioid
10 Recovery Trust Fund (as defined in § 221702 of Chapter 22, Title 5, Guam
11 Code Annotated), and the Notary Public Revolving Fund (as defined in §
12 33106 of Chapter 33, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated) shall be transferred
13 from the Department of Administration to the Office of the Attorney General
14 for direct management and control. These Funds shall not be subject to
15 *Maga'håga/Maga'låhi's* transfer authority, and any lapses in these Funds
16 shall carry over into the next fiscal year.

17 (j) All unexpended fund balances, to include the carryover
18 appropriations, shall be transferred to the “Office of the Attorney General
19 Operations Fund” contained in this Section.

20 (k) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Office of the
21 Attorney General of Guam, in pursuit of the public interest, shall be
22 authorized to procure attorneys on a sole-source basis, as necessary to
23 pursue local and federal criminal cases and civil cases. Further, the Office
24 of the Attorney General of Guam shall be authorized to use up to five-
25 percent (5%) of its fiscal appropriations to procure additional consultants,

1 experts, and expert-witnesses on a sole-source basis, as necessary to pursue
2 local and federal criminal cases and civil cases. These contracts shall not be
3 subject to the provisions of § 22601 of Chapter 22, Title 5, Guam Code
4 Annotated.

5 **Section ____.** § 22205 of Chapter 22, Division 2, Title 5, Guam Code
6 Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

7 **“§ 22205. Exceptions.**

8 The provisions of this Act shall not apply to the accounting operations
9 of the Guam Waterworks Authority, the Guam Power Authority, the A. B.
10 Won Pat International Airport Authority Guam, the Guam Housing and
11 Urban Renewal Authority, the Guam Housing Corporation, the Guam
12 Economic Development and Commerce Authority, the Judicial Branch, the
13 Legislative Branch, the Guam Community College, the Department of
14 Education, the University of Guam, ~~and~~ the Guam Mass Transit Authority
15 and the Office of the Attorney General of Guam.”

16 **Section ____.** § 5125 of Chapter 5, Division 1, Title 5, Guam Code
17 Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

18 **“§ 5125. Application of this Chapter to Executive Branch.**

19 (a) Every governmental body which is in the purview of the Executive
20 Branch, and including the Government of Guam Retirement Fund, Guam
21 Community College, the University of Guam, the Department of Education,
22 the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority, Guam Economic Development and
23 Commerce Authority, ~~and~~ the Guam Visitor’s Bureau and the Office of the

1 Attorney General of Guam, shall be governed by Articles 1, 3, 6, 7, 10, 11

5 of each such governmental body or other above named body shall be
6 substituted wherever there is reference to the Public Policy Office, Chief
7 Procurement Officer or Director of Public Works in Articles 4, 5, 8 and 9 of
8 Chapter 5 of Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated.”

9 **Section ____.** § 30109(d) and (e) of Article 1, Chapter 30, Title 5, Guam
10 Code Annotated are hereby *repealed*.

11 ~~“(d) deliver receipts of money or property received by him in~~
12 ~~his official capacity and file duplicates thereof with the Director of~~
13 ~~Administration;~~

14 ~~“(e) as soon as practical after the receipt of any money in his~~
15 ~~official capacity, turn the money over to the Director of Revenue and~~
16 ~~Taxation, and on the first (1st) Monday of each month file with the Director~~
17 ~~of Administration, an account, verified by his oath, of all monies received by~~
18 ~~him in his official capacity for the government of Guam during the~~
19 ~~preceding month;”~~

20 **Section ____.** § 30119 of Article 1, Chapter 30, Title 5, Guam Code
21 Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

22 **“ § 30119. Fees.**

23 Every request for a letter from the Office of the Attorney General to
24 provide a statement about the disposition of a person’s criminal arrest or

1 criminal case, also known as an “AG Clearance”, shall pay to the ~~Treasurer~~

3 same fee charged by the Guam Police Department or the Judiciary of Guam
4 for their police Clearance or court clearance, whichever is higher. All fees
5 shall be deposited into the “Victim/Witness Travel-Housing Fund” and used
6 accordingly.”

7 **Section ____.** § 30121.1 of Article 1, Chapter 30, Title 5, Guam Code
8 Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

9 **“§ 30121.1. Administration of Personnel.**

10 The Attorney General of Guam is authorized to hire and appoint such
11 personnel, and to fix their duties and responsibilities under and in
12 accordance with Title 4, Guam Code Annotated, as may be necessary for the
13 purposes of this Chapter. Any reference to the Director of Administration
14 within Chapters 4 and 6 of Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, shall be deemed
15 to refer to the Attorney General for the purposes of this Chapter.”

16 **Section ____.** § 2110(a) of Chapter 2, Title 4, Guam Code Annotated is
17 hereby *amended* to read as follows:

18 “(a) No new unclassified employees may be hired in the Executive
19 Branch of government after October 1st of the last year of office of a sitting
20 *Maga’hågan/Maga’låhen Guåhan* who is not seeking re-election until after
21 such date that such *Maga’hågan/Maga’låhen Guåhan* leaves office. No new,
22 unclassified employees may be hired in any Legislative Office of a sitting
23 Senator, opting not to seek re-election, after October 1st of the last year in
24 office of such Senator. No new, unclassified employees may be hired in any
25 Mayoral Office of a sitting Mayor opting not to seek re-election, after

October 1st of the last year in office of such Mayor. No new contract workers or unclassified employees may be employed in the Department of Law or the Office of Public Accountability when the Attorney General or Public Auditor, respectively, opts not to seek re-election, until that Attorney General or Public Auditor leaves office, unless the Attorney General or Public Auditor for their respective elected offices make a determination that additional unclassified hirings are necessary in order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the people of Guam.”

Section ____. § 32404 of Chapter 3, Title 19, Guam Code Annotated is hereby amended to read as follows:

“§ 3204. Who May Solemnize.

(a) Marriage may be solemnized by:

(1) *I Maga’lahen Guåhan* (the Governor of Guam), or his substitute;

(2) the judges of the U.S. District Court, and the Superior Court of Guam;

(3) all ordained clergymen and priests of whatsoever religious faith who are recognized as such by the religious body whose faith they represent;

(4) the Director of Revenue and Taxation, the Director of Administration, and the Director of Public Health and Social Services;

(5) the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* (the Guam Legislature, or his/her designee; ~~and~~

(6) all village Mayors and Vice Mayors; and

(7) the Attorney General of Guam.
