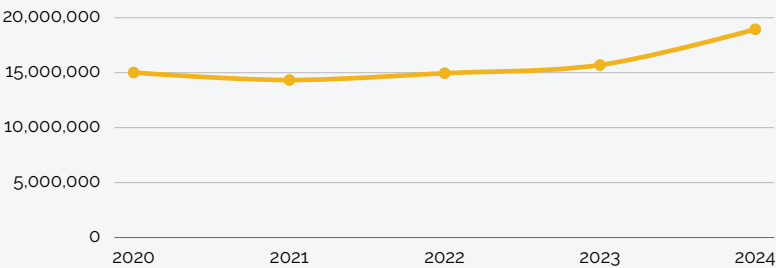
FY2024 General Fund Appropriation & Expenditures

The AG's Office received \$18,954,746 for Fiscal Year 2024. Over the last few years, we have had to deal with a stagnant or limited budget. This fiscal year, we were able to **do more with less**, resulting in an over \$3 million in surplus.

- Expenditures \$15,885,471.41

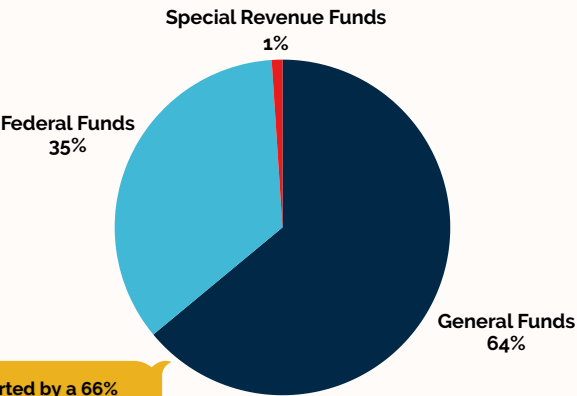

The AG's Office is responsible for managing the Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) federal grant which funds organizations that provide direct services to victims of crime. The Office received a total of \$576,248.00 for victim assistance-related funding, and \$53,000 for victim compensation reimbursement.
