# Here are 5 ways to spend less on running

50 million Americans who are runners, you might have the impression that the sport is basically free. You have a T-shirt, you have shorts, you have sneakers, and out the door you go. Right?

Let Andrew Huynh disabuse you of that notion. The financial planner from Tolland, Connecticut, is an “avid” runner, and he wants you to know: Being a serious runner is most definitely not free.

“The costs can add up quickly once you actually get started,” Huynh tells Current, a consumer fintech banking platform. “I’ve seen many people underestimate the investment before even registering for a race, including shoes, nutrition, recovery tools, gym memberships, and training gear.”

Total it all up, and the costs can get pretty eye-popping. According to a survey from Running USA, runners spent an average of \$1,748 in the previous year on the sport.

Since many runners right now are aiming toward races in the fall (longer distances typically take a few months of training), now is the perfect time to start planning things out. Some key advice, to get a handle on costs before they start to run away from you:

## Plan early, plan often.

There are a host of reasons why preparing as early as possible will save you a significant amount of money. First, most races offer early discounts on entries, which ramp up over time as you get closer to the start date. Second, many races book hotel blocks for participants at special rates, which, for popular events, get booked up quickly.

One tip: Some specialty operators, like Marathon Tours & Travel, offer package deals

that include flights, hotels, and guaranteed entries into hard-to-get races.

## Don't go crazy on

## apparel.

The fancy brands of the world won't want to hear this, but there's no reason to go

overboard on pricey athletic wear. You do need synthetic materials, especially socks — cotton chafes, as every runner knows — but the reality is that entries in most races come with giveaways, such as tops or shorts. As a result, you can assemble a “free” wardrobe in a pretty short order.

## One place to splurge: Shoes.

You should absolutely not skimp on running shoes by buying used gear, even though it may be tempting to do so. The reasons are both performance and injury related: Individual gaits require certain types of shoes, with particular cushioning.

# FIFA clear US star Balogun to play in World Cup after Trump call

FIFA cleared US star striker Folarin Balogun to play in the World Cup co-hosts' showdown with Belgium despite his red-card ban after a personal phone call from President Donald Trump, it emerged Sunday, igniting a furious row that has rocked the tournament.

Balogun had been set to miss Monday's last-16 knockout clash with the Belgians after receiving a straight red card following video review for stepping on the foot of a Bosnian defender in a round-of-32 clash that the US won 2-0.

Under FIFA rules, a straight red card automatically triggers a one-game ban, which cannot be appealed by the player's team.

But world football's governing body said Sunday the ban will now be suspended for a year, in a stunning move for which no specific explanation was offered.

Two sources familiar with the matter told AFP that Trump personally called FIFA President Gianni Infantino asking him to review Balogun's punishment.

"Thank you to FIFA for doing what was right, and reversing a great injustice!" Trump wrote on his Truth Social platform.

The decision was immediately slammed by Belgian football officials, who released a statement saying they are "astonished" by a move that is in "direct contradiction" with FIFA's own rules.

The Royal Belgian Football Association is "investigating all potential options" to "safeguard the legitimate rights of all participating teams and to protect the fundamental principles of fair play in our sport," it said.

"I didn't know that at the FIFA World Cup, the 5th of July is now the 1st of April,

eration. We are defending football, whether it's ethics or integrity," said coach Garcia on Sunday, as Belgium protested the latest U-turn.

Belgium goalkeeper Thibaut Courtois said it was "a bit of a surprise" that Balogun was cleared to play just a day before the match.

"Had it been done earlier, we'd have been able to be mentally more prepared, perhaps," he said.

and that it's April Fool's Day," added Belgium coach Rudi Garcia, at a press conference.

Trump spoke with Infantino on Wednesday, the same day that the red card was given, sources told AFP on condition of anonymity.

US Secretary of State Marco Rubio also publicly called for the card to be rescinded.

The decision to suspend the ban was taken by FIFA's disciplinary committee.

- 'Boost' -

Top scorer Balogun has been key to the USA's progress in the tournament, netting three times, and his absence against Belgium would have been a blow to the team in the game in Seattle.

The stakes are huge for the co-hosts. Playing on home soil, a strong US start to the tournament has raised expectations to fever-pitch levels among the American public.

The co-hosts are targeting a historic run to at least the quarter-finals, which they have not reached since 2002, or even further.

Balogun himself had said Friday the red card ban was "something I have to just accept."

But US players and offi-

cials welcomed the news Sunday.

"It's a fair decision because it should have never been a red card," said head coach Mauricio Pochettino, calling the punishment "too big" for an unintentional foul.

"It's not that we are victims, but we are not the bad men, the mean ones here," he said.

Star forward Christian Pulisic called the decision a "boost" while governing body US Soccer said it was "pleased."

- 'Surprise' -

In its statement, FIFA pointed to "article 27 of the FIFA disciplinary code" which allows the suspension to be "suspended for a probationary period of one year."

Balogun would serve the ban only if he commits another similar foul in the next year, it said.

There is some precedent for the decision.

Portugal superstar Cristiano Ronaldo earned a three-game ban for an elbow during qualifying last year, but had two matches of his ban suspended.

The move, which allowed Ronaldo to play in Portugal's World Cup opener, drew criticism at the time.

It was also noted that discussions had taken place with GMH regarding prior concerns about communication gaps, and that the MIST form was intended to address those issues by improving the quality and completeness of information shared with receiving facilities.</p> <p>The commission discussed the need to further evaluate and refine both the base station reporting criteria and the MIST form in coordination with receiving facilities, including GRMC, Naval Hospital, and GMH, to ensure consistency and alignment with hospital expectations. Mateo noted that GRMC has implemented their MIST form, emphasizing concise radio communication focused on essential clinical information needed to prepare emergency resources such as trauma bays or respiratory support, along with basic vital signs. He additionally noted that, in two specific recent cases involving patients later identified with cervical spine fractures, C-collars had not been applied upon arrival, including one case complicated by patient intoxication that may have affected initial assessment. A request was made for renewed dissemination of protocol guidance to field providers to ensure consistent application of spinal immobilization procedures in cases of significant trauma.</p> <p>Chief Chaco noted in response that Dr. Ross had addressed spinal immobilization practices during the conference, providing guidance on appropriate indications for the use of cervical collars and backboards, including when such measures should and should not be applied in cases of significant injury. It was further explained that current clinical guidance reflects evolving practice standards, including the understanding that rigid backboards may, in some cases, exacerbate patient injuries compared to transport on padded gurneys. Chief Chaco assured coordination would be undertaken with Dr. Ross and other relevant stakeholders to develop clearer, standardized guidelines delineating appropriate use of spinal immobilization measures. It was further noted that this effort is intended to align field practice with current hospital expectations and evidence-based care considerations, particularly given that prior routine use of backboards has been reduced based on concerns regarding potential harm.</p> <p>Dr. Von Trampe acknowledged that there are exceptions to established protocols and that clinical application requires ongoing refinement, with emphasis placed on avoiding blame and recognizing the challenges of maintaining perfect compliance in all situations. He further clarified that any perceived lack of acknowledgment during patient handoff is generally due to clinical focus on patient care rather than a lack of appreciation for EMS contributions.</p> <p>Dr. Von Trampe made a request to encourage EMS personnel, when feasible, to document or capture scene photographs, particularly in motor vehicle collision cases, to assist hospital providers in understanding the mechanism of injury, including vehicle damage, forces involved, and passenger compartment intrusion. He expressed that, despite past training exercises and smaller-scale incidents, there remained concern regarding the island's readiness for large-scale mass casualty events such as aviation disasters, maritime incidents, or major structural fires. Dr. Von Trampe emphasized the need for a coordinated and comprehensive framework involving all relevant stakeholders, including EMS, emergency departments, trauma services, surgery, and blood bank resources, in order to evaluate system capacity, identify limitations, and strengthen preparedness for high-volume patient surges.</p> <p>In response, C. Mateo reported that Chief San Nicolas briefly addressed ongoing efforts by the Guam Fire Department to revise administrative protocols related to inter-facility transports. It was noted that Chief C. Chaco expressed interest in establishing a small working group within the commission to support these efforts and ensure alignment among all stakeholders. The primary objective of the proposed changes was described as minimizing delays between patient transfer processes by ensuring that both sending and receiving facilities are prepared in advance, thereby reducing unnecessary standby time and improving overall efficiency.<br><br>It was further explained that these protocol updates aim to streamline inter-facility movements, particularly in situations involving medically necessary transfers such as pediatric patients from GRMC to GMH, STEMI cases, and stroke patients requiring time-sensitive care. The discussion emphasized that such transports are intended to be limited to clinically necessary movements in order to ensure patients receive appropriate and timely treatment.<br><br>Concerns were raised regarding delays of 30 minutes to one hour during patient transfers, with emphasis placed on improving coordination to avoid such interruptions. It was noted that these efforts are especially important given limited ambulance availability, which can fluctuate significantly depending on operational conditions. The subcommittee's overarching goal was described as ensuring that inter-facility transport processes are more seamless, efficient, and consistently aligned across all facilities, with a continued emphasis on prioritizing patient care and system-wide coordination. 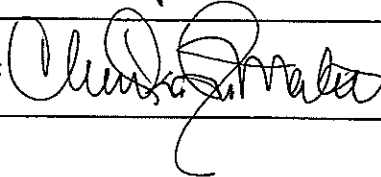
