KEYNOTE PRESENTERS



National Heritage Area - Guam Study **Tracy O'Toole**

This session explores the National Heritage Areas System managed by the National Park Service. National Heritage Areas are places where historic, cultural, and natural resources form nationally important landscapes. They expand traditional conservation by supporting large-scale, community-driven efforts that engage residents in heritage preservation and promote economic development.

Congress has directed the National Park Service to study the feasibility of designating sites in Guam as a National Heritage Area. Learn about the benefits and how to participate in the Guam study.

For nearly 25 years, Tracy has worked in community engagement and international affairs supporting public land management, heritage tourism, and economic development. She currently oversees the National Heritage Area System at the National Park Service, serving 62 sites nationwide through community-driven partnerships focused on conservation, education, and tourism. Previously, she led communications, tourism, partnerships, and congressional affairs for 84 Northeast park sites and worked in the Pacific Northwest on tribal engagement and public land preservation. Her work focuses on strategic communications and partnerships to expand awareness of national parks, with additional experience in sustainable tourism and economic initiatives across the Caribbean, Latin America, and the Middle East.



Main Street America: The Movement, Its Impact, and Why It Works **Lisa Mullins Thompson**

For more than four decades, Main Street America has helped communities use historic and cultural assets as a foundation for economic development. More than a framework, it is a movement grounded in local leadership, cultural stewardship, and a deep connection to place.

This session explores how the Main Street Approach revitalizes downtowns while preserving both physical fabric and cultural identity. Participants will learn how preservation, including traditions, stories, and community memory, drives authentic economic development. Through real examples, we will highlight reinvestment, business growth, and strengthened identity, and how communities adapt the model to honor heritage while building a sustainable future.

Lisa Mullins Thompson is a Senior Program Officer at Main Street America. She is a national leader in economic development, placemaking, and historic preservation, with experience across government, nonprofit, and private sectors. Lisa brings a strategic and collaborative approach to strengthening communities across rural, urban, and culturally distinct places.

Her work focuses on leveraging historic assets to drive economic vitality, support small businesses, and guide long-term revitalization. She advances public-private partnerships and positions preservation as a cornerstone of community development. Grounded in a deep respect for place, her work connects the built environment with the people and stories that give it meaning.



Empowering Native Pacific Communities **Paige Miki Kalāokananiki'eki'e Okamura**

Learn how the Administration for Native Americans Pacific Region Training & Technical Assistance helps organizations serving Native communities in the Pacific develop and to find grant funding, including federal opportunities, for their community-based projects. As a resource for the Pacific, the office is dedicated to serving the Native peoples of the Pacific Region, including Hawai'i, American Sāmoa, Guam and CNMI. No matter what expertise level applicants have, the office is always ready to help develop the capacity needed to start solving a community's problem. As a means to thrive, our office helps community organizations start a nonprofit, creating a project plan, understand Federal cost principles, leverage resources, and much more.

Paige is a keiki papa of Māeaea, Waialua. She teaches Hawaiian at UH Mānoa through Ua Ao Hawai'i, the free Hawaiian language initiative open to the public. Her masters research is focused on strengthening Hawaiian communities through understanding their kuleana to 'āina. With 10+ years of Hawaiian research and translation experience, she believes that language is key to cultural and national identity. Her deep aloha for her 'ohana, 'āina, and language drive her to educate those around her about the value of indigenous perspectives and knowledge to the global community.
