MINUTES

I. CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the Criminal Justice Automation Commission was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by Co-Chair Associate Justice Katherine A. Maraman.

ROLL CALL:

Justice Maraman recognized the presence of Chief Justice Robert J. Torres and requested that a roll call be conducted. Representatives from the following agencies were present via videoconference and identified themselves for the record:

II. PROOF OF DUE NOTICE OF MEETING

The publication of the five-day Notices of Meeting of the Criminal Justice Automation Commission, as required under the Open Government Law, was published in the Guam Daily Post. Proof of publication and acknowledgments are on file.

III. DETERMINATION OF QUORUM

A quorum was established with at least 50 percent of Commission members present.

IV. READING AND DISPOSAL OF MINUTES: October 15, 2025 Regular Meeting minutes.

Justice Maraman called for a motion to approve the October 15, 2025 Regular Meeting minutes. Director Fred Bordallo moved to approve the minutes. There being no objections, the minutes were approved.

V. NEW BUSINESS

A. GPD Law Enforcement Records Management System (LERMS) Digitization Project: Annual Statistics for 2025

The Office of Technology (OTECH) reported no updates. Justice Maraman indicated the item would be revisited at the next meeting.

B. eCourt Case Management System Upgrades

Chief Justice Robert J. Torres provided an update on the Judiciary's transition from the JustWare case management system to the e-Series platforms, including eCourt and eSupervision. Data conversion from JustWare is substantially complete; however, additional work is underway to ensure accuracy and completeness, particularly for financial and probation-related data.

The original GoLive target of January 2026 has been postponed to the weekend of March 2, 2026, to allow for additional testing and targeted staff training. The Judiciary emphasized the importance of a smooth transition, noting that JustWare will no longer be accessible once GoLive occurs.

Administrator of the Courts Danielle Rosete added that the e-Series platforms are designed to function as a seamless solution and will support future integration with partner agency systems. Development of a public access component is also underway. Following GoLive, the Judiciary will coordinate with agency heads to explore system interfaces. Discussion included coordination with the Department of Corrections' Parole Services Division to align processes with the Judiciary's probation systems.

C. GPD LERMS Upgrades

Mr. Phillip Wintterle reported that GPD is undergoing major upgrades to its LERMS system and anticipates completion in March 2026.

D. Technology Grant Updates

Ms. Sonia Siliang provided an update on the Byrne technology grants. The FY2024 Byrne JAG awards have been vetted, and Memoranda of Understanding (MOUs) are being circulated. She anticipates the Judiciary will receive its MOU in the coming weeks.

She also noted that quarterly programmatic and financial reports are due soon and that guidance from the U.S. Department of Justice regarding FY2025 and FY2026 funding is pending. BSP expects the Byrne program to continue, though potential consolidation of funding streams may affect future applications and awards.

E. Virtual Computerized Criminal History (VCCH) System Status and Procurement of New Criminal History System

Administrator Rosete reported that the VCCH system remains inoperable and is being rebuilt in coordination with the vendor, Datamaxx. The Judiciary has received Interface Control Documents (ICDs) from three of the four contributing agencies and is awaiting the Guam Police Department's submission. She emphasized that receipt of the remaining ICD is critical to moving forward and noted the need for test environments from contributing agencies to support system integration and validation.

Ms. Beatrice Santos indicated OTECH's willingness to assist in coordinating with agency vendors to establish test environments. Mr. Phillip Wintterle stated that he will coordinate with GPD's vendor to determine system interface capabilities and assist with the ICD requirement.

Chief Justice Torres noted that discussions regarding system design, including whether data will be pulled or pushed through interfaces, should occur concurrently with ongoing system upgrades. Administrator Rosete further explained that the redesigned VCCH system will incorporate resiliency measures to maintain functionality if a contributing system is unavailable. Justice Maraman emphasized the importance of restoring VCCH functionality as soon as possible, noting its significance to law enforcement operations and officer safety.

F. Notice of the Next Meeting – mid-April 2026

VI. COMMUNICATIONS

There were no new communications to report.

VII. OPEN DISCUSSION

- **Committee to Draft Permanent By-Laws**
Justice Maraman announced that a committee will be formed to draft permanent bylaws and appointed Mr. Nathan Tennyson as Chair. She invited members to participate and requested that interested individuals notify the Judiciary. Justice Maraman also requested that OTECH designate a representative to participate on the committee.
- **Data Sharing Governance and Cybersecurity**
Justice Maraman emphasized the need to address data sharing governance and cybersecurity as key priorities for the Commission moving forward.
- **Future Agenda Items to Include**
Chief Justice Torres recommended that future meetings include brief updates from each member agency regarding ongoing technology initiatives. He noted that this would promote coordination and identify opportunities for collaboration. Justice Maraman agreed and stated that this item will be included in future agendas.
- **Additional Strategic Initiatives to Undertake**
 - Future Projects
 - IJIS Report

Chief Justice Torres referenced the IJIS report as a guide for future initiatives, including efforts toward achieving compliance with the FBI's Interstate Identification Index (III). Deputy Marshal Joseph Leon Guerrero stated that participation would allow Guam to manage its own criminal history data and requires completion of the VCCH system and interagency coordination. Senator Shawn Gumataotao asked about costs, and Deputy Marshal Leon Guerrero noted there is no direct cost, but compliance with FBI requirements is necessary.

- **Procurement of New VCCH Solution**

Administrator Rosete recommended that the Commission begin considering the procurement of a new criminal history system, as outlined in the IJIS report, and indicated it will be distributed to members for review. Director Bordallo discussed the distinction between information sharing and intelligence sharing and highlighted challenges associated with paper-based systems. He emphasized the need to strengthen information-sharing frameworks and explore more integrated, technology-based solutions.

- **Agency Designations**

Administrator Rosete reminded members to submit agency designation letters for CJAC records, noting that only one agency has submitted to date.

- **Judiciary's CJAC Co-Chair**

Justice Maraman announced that she has been elected Chief Justice and will transition her role as Co-Chair of CJAC to Chief Justice Torres. She expressed appreciation to Commission members for their continued commitment to improving Guam's criminal justice system. Chief Justice Torres thanked Justice Maraman for her leadership and stated that he looks forward to continuing the Commission's work as Chair.

VIII. ADJOURNMENT

The meeting adjourned at 10:43 a.m.

MINUTES

I. CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the Criminal Justice Automation Commission was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by Presiding Co-Chair Justice Robert J. Torres.

ROLL CALL:

Justice Torres requested a roll call. Representatives from the following agencies were present via videoconference and identified themselves for the record:

II. PROOF OF DUE NOTICE OF MEETING

Justice Torres stated that the initial publication of the meeting notice was scheduled for April 16, 2026. However, due to disruptions from Typhoon Sinlaku, the Pacific Daily News was unable to complete the electronic publication that day. The notice was subsequently published on April 17, 2026, in compliance with the five-working-day notice requirement.

Justice Torres further stated that, pursuant to Section 4.2 of the CJAC bylaws, he executed a certification declaring that emergency conditions existed from April 13 through April 16, 2026, due to the typhoon, and waived strict compliance with the five-working-day publication requirement. Justice Torres stated that the certification will be filed with the Commission's records.

Secretary's Note: Information received following the meeting confirmed that the Pacific Daily News published the first meeting notice electronically on April 16, 2026, as originally scheduled. This note is included to reflect the publication date in the Commission's records.

III. DETERMINATION OF QUORUM

Following roll call and confirmation of additional members present via videoconference and chat, a quorum was established.

IV. READING AND DISPOSAL OF MINUTES: January 14, 2026 Regular Meeting

The minutes of the January 14, 2026 Regular Meeting will be presented for action at the next CJAC meeting.

V. OLD BUSINESS

A. GPD NCHIP-Funded Digitization Project

No updates were provided by the Guam Police Department. The item was deferred to the next meeting.

B. eCourt, eSupervision Case Management System Upgrades

Administrator of the Courts Danielle Rosete provided an update regarding the Judiciary's upgraded case management systems. She reported that the Judiciary officially went live with the eCourt and eSupervision platforms on March 2, 2026.

Ms. Rosete explained that eCourt serves as the Judiciary's case management system for court records and filings, while eSupervision is utilized by probation officers, law enforcement personnel, and client services staff. She noted that the Judiciary continues to refine system functionality and end-user processes.

Ms. Rosete further stated that efforts are underway to expand public access capabilities and improve system efficiency. She emphasized that the upgraded systems further strengthen information-sharing initiatives among contributing criminal justice agencies.

C. GPD Law Enforcement Records Management System (LERMS) Upgrades

Sgt. Scott Wade of the Guam Police Department provided an update on the LERMS upgrade project and ongoing coordination to prepare for integration with the Virtual Computerized Criminal History (VCCH) system. Additional updates will be provided at the next meeting.

D. Technology Grant Updates

Ms. Sonia Siliang provided an update regarding Edward Byrne Justice Assistance Grant funding and related technology projects. She reported that there were no significant developments beyond those previously discussed and noted that ongoing grant activities continue to be monitored.

E. Virtual Computerized Criminal History System Status and Procurement of New Criminal History System

Administrator Rosete provided an update on the VCCH system rebuild. She reported that contributing agencies continue to work with the vendor, Datamaxx, to develop interface connections and data mapping necessary for integration.

Administrator Rosete stated that all contributing agencies, with the exception of the Guam Police Department, have submitted Interface Control Documents (ICDs) and

provided the information necessary for testing environments. She emphasized that participation from all contributing agencies is critical to the successful implementation of the system, particularly because arrest data from GPD serves as the foundational component of criminal history records.

Administrator Rosete further explained that the new VCCH system is being developed with safeguards to ensure continued system functionality, even if a participating agency's data feed becomes temporarily unavailable.

Discussion continued regarding the long-term procurement of a modernized criminal history system and implementation of recommendations identified in the IJIS report previously distributed to Commission members. Justice Torres also advised that the CJAC annual report would be submitted to the Legislature. Further discussion of the CJAC Technical Guidelines and the CJAC Privacy, Civil Rights, and Civil Liberties Policy documents distributed to Commission members will take place at a future meeting.

Commission members also discussed recommendations in the IJIS report to replace the existing criminal history system with a modern, sustainable platform capable of supporting long-term interoperability, resiliency, and information sharing among contributing agencies. Discussion also included the need for a centralized procurement process to support implementation and future system maintenance.

Following the discussion, Justice Torres called for a motion to authorize the Judiciary to lead the procurement process to engage a qualified expert or firm to conduct a comprehensive technical assessment and to assist in identifying and developing system requirements. The motion was made by Director Brennan, seconded by Ms. Siliang, and unanimously approved by the Commission members present via videoconference.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

A. Agency Updates – Ongoing Technology Initiatives

Commission members provided updates regarding agency technology initiatives and operational impacts resulting from Typhoon Sinlaku.

- The Bureau of Statistics and Plans reported no major operational impacts and no additional technology updates.
- The Department of Corrections reported no significant storm-related issues.
- The Guam Customs and Quarantine Agency reported temporary connectivity and operational disruptions resulting from outages affecting Office of Technology infrastructure. Col. Franklin Gutierrez stated that the agency is pursuing upgrades to enhance connectivity and system performance while continuing development of an automated customs data system to support future integration and information-sharing capabilities.
- The Marianas Regional Fusion Center reported that outages affecting the Office of Technology also impacted Fusion Center operations and information-sharing capabilities. Ms. Helen Matthews emphasized the importance of strengthening information-sharing partnerships and regional efforts among local and federal law

enforcement agencies. She stated that future CJAC discussions may include additional initiatives related to information-sharing governance and regional security coordination.

- The Office of Technology reported challenges experienced during the typhoon, including issues involving the agency's generator and automatic transfer switch. Ms. Beatrice Santos noted that the outage highlighted vulnerabilities affecting operational continuity and emphasized the importance of infrastructure resiliency and disaster recovery planning.

B. Notice of the Next Meeting – mid-July 2026

Justice Torres advised that the next CJAC meeting is expected in mid-July 2026.

VII. COMMUNICATIONS

There were no new communications to report.

VIII. OPEN DISCUSSION

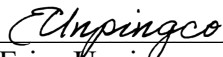
Commission members continued discussions regarding strengthening interagency information-sharing capabilities, ongoing VCCH coordination and agency participation, and future CJAC initiatives supporting III compliance and integrated justice information-sharing. Administrator Rosete reiterated the importance of continued collaboration among all contributing agencies to ensure successful implementation and long-term system functionality of the VCCH system.

Members also discussed disaster recovery, cybersecurity preparedness, and technology infrastructure challenges highlighted by the operational and connectivity issues experienced during Typhoon Sinlaku. Ms. Matthews emphasized the importance of strong partnerships and regional coordination among local and federal agencies. Ms. Santos noted the need to strengthen infrastructure and maintain critical justice information systems during emergencies.

IX. ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business before the Commission, the meeting adjourned at approximately 10:45 a.m.
