Citizen Centric Report

Fiscal Year 2025 reflected continued progress in access, student achievement, workforce training, and institutional stewardship. GCC strengthened pathways from education to employment while investing in programs, facilities, and partnerships that respond to Guam's changing workforce needs.

Student Success

301 Graduates | 388 Credentials Awarded

The Class of 2025 celebrated 301 graduates and 388 credentials, including Adult High School diplomas, Journey Worker certificates, industry certifications, certificates, and associate degrees. GCC also continued its Free College initiative in Construction Trades, Information Technology, Accounting, and Education, helping reduce financial barriers for eligible students.

Guam Community College is a leader in career and technical workforce development, providing high-quality, student-centered education and job training for Micronesia.

Programs

GCC Class of 2025

GCC conferred 388 credentials to 301 graduates at its May 16, 2025 Commencement. The credentials included 39 Adult High School diplomas, 4 Journey Worker Certificates, 18 Industry Certifications, 83 Certificates, 205 Associate of Science degrees, and 39 Associate of Arts degrees.

Workforce Training That Leads to Jobs

Ten participants completed GCC's Certified Nurse Assistant Boot Camp III. All ten passed the National Nurse Aide Assessment Program exam and earned CNA licenses. GCC's 13th Ship Repair Bootcamp also trained 16 participants through the Metallica Scholars Initiative.

Adult Education & YouthBuild

During AY 2024-2025, 52 adults completed high school diploma requirements. GCC also launched its first YouthBuild cohort, combining GED preparation with pre-apprenticeship training, credentials, and employment preparation for young adults.

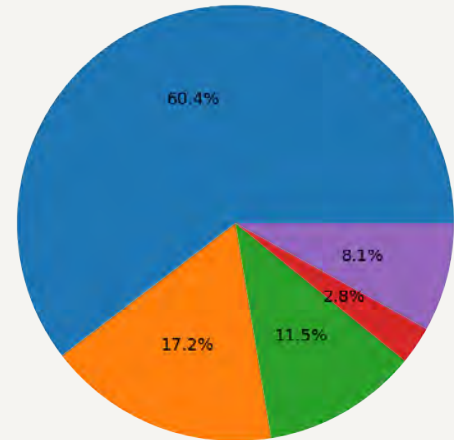

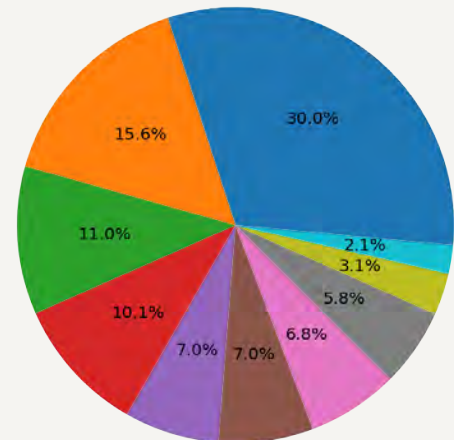

Community

ACCJC Reaffirms GCC Accreditation for Eight Years

Following its 2025 comprehensive review, the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges reaffirmed GCC's accreditation, with the next comprehensive review scheduled for 2033.

Workforce & Community Partnerships

GCC expanded workforce pathways through ship repair, CNA training, YouthBuild, apprenticeship, and employer partnerships. The College also hosted the Academy for Women Entrepreneurs, bringing 30 women from 25 Pacific Island countries to Guam for training and regional collaboration.

Looking Ahead

Guided by the 2026-2032 Institutional Strategic Master Plan, GCC will continue to expand access and affordability, strengthen retention and completion, align programs with workforce demand, invest in facilities and technology, and maintain transparent, responsible stewardship of public resources.

Facilities

Workforce Development Center

Renovation of the Barrigada Workforce Development Center continued in FY2025. The modernized facility will support work-ready boot camps and entry- and journey-worker training in construction and marine repair.

Student Support Services Center

The expansion and renovation of Building B continued, creating a more accessible front-campus hub for security, student identification, assessment and counseling, and student computer access.
