Håfa Adai Mr. Speaker,

The Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission (CICC) exists to help victims navigate the overwhelming financial burdens of crime, assisting with lost wages, medical costs, property damage, and funeral costs. Yet historically, nearly 50% of applications denied by the CICC were rejected solely on the basis that they were filed outside of the time period established by law.

Bill No. 324-38 (LS) rectifies this, allowing the CICC to consider applications filed after the 18-month deadline upon a showing of good cause. Trauma, grief, and recovery do not operate on a statutory timetable. As highlighted in testimony from Dr. Sarah Elmore-Hernandez of the Bureau of Women's Affairs, the same obstacles that hinder crime reporting—such as fear of retaliation, psychological trauma, and fear of stigmatization—are the exact barriers that prevent survivors from applying for financial assistance in time.

Signing this bill into law is a positive step forward in ensuring the survivors of crimes on Guam are treated with compassion and dignity. Therefore, I sign Bill No. 324-38 (LS) into law as **Public Law No. 38-141**.

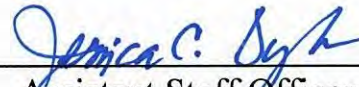

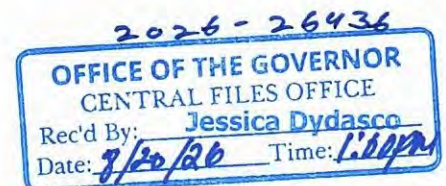

**AN ACT TO *AMEND* § 161.90(a) OF CHAPTER 161,
TITLE 8, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO
AUTHORIZING THE CRIMINAL INJURIES
COMPENSATION COMMISSION TO CONSIDER LATE
APPLICATIONS UPON A SHOWING OF GOOD CAUSE.**

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslatuan Guåhan* finds
3 the nation's commitment to supporting victims of crime includes the Victims of
4 Crime Act of 1984 (VOCA) [28 CFR Chapter 1 Department of Justice, Subpart B,

1 §94.115]. The core intent of VOCA is to provide limited financial support for
2 victims of violent crime, and to ensure they are treated with dignity and fairness.

3 *I Liheslatuan Guåhan* further finds that our commitment to supporting victims
4 of crime includes the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission (CICC), created
5 by 8 GCA Ch. 161. The CICC is directed to review applications from victims of
6 violent crimes (8 GCA Ch. §161.55) and award compensation based on statutory
7 parameters. *I Liheslatura* finds in the immediate aftermath of a violent crime, victims
8 and survivors may not know about compensation or may not have the emotional
9 capacity to go through an arduous application process. The process of applying for
10 compensation can be exhausting, retraumatizing, and an emotional hardship for
11 victims and survivors. Guam’s compensation statute of limitation requires that an
12 application to be filed within 18 months of injury or death. It was copied from
13 Hawaii’s compensation statute of 1967. Hawaii amended its statute of limitation to
14 allow for a good cause exception with these words “provided that upon a showing
15 of good cause, the commission may consider applications filed beyond this time
16 period.” The majority of states provide for similar good cause exceptions to the
17 rigidity of statute of limitations. A “good cause” exception allows a state or
18 territory’s criminal injuries compensation program to consider applications with
19 equity and fairness. *I Liheslatuan Guåhan* seeks to accomplish such intent.

20 **Section 2.** § 161.90(a) of Chapter 161, Title 8, Guam Code Annotated, is
21 *amended* to read:

22 “(a) No order for the payment of compensation shall be made under
23 this Chapter unless the application has been made within eighteen (18) months
24 after the date of injury, death or property damage, provided that upon a
25 showing of good cause, the commission may consider applications filed
26 beyond this time period. Good cause may include, but is not limited to,
27 physical or mental incapacity, trauma resulting from the offense, fear of

1 retaliation, hospitalization, inability to obtain necessary documentation, or
2 other extraordinary circumstances beyond the applicant's control.”

3 **Section 3.** This enactment shall apply and benefit pending victim
4 applications.
