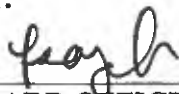

Sablan provided an update regarding licensing operations, administrative activities, staffing, technology improvements, and, most importantly, the continued review and revision of the Guam Board of Social Work's rules and regulations. B. Sablan emphasized the importance of completing the rules and regulations and requested that the Board prioritize the matter and diligently work toward completing the proposed revisions by the end of the current fiscal year, or no later than the first quarter of 2027. It was noted that updating and establishing rules and regulations for the professional boards is part of her strategic plan, and that the Guam Board of	HPLO	1111	Noted

	Allied Health Examiners had recently completed its school psychology certification requirements. B. Sablan advised that she would continue to provide support and administrative assistance to the Board and requested a final draft of the rules and regulations so that the administrative process could proceed. The Board was asked to establish a clear timeline for completing its review, addressing any remaining areas requiring discussion or revision, and finalizing the proposed rules and regulations. B. Sablan explained that once the Board completes its draft, the administrative or the AAA process will require a public hearing, which may either be conducted by the Board at HPLO's conference room or otherwise handled through the Legislature. B. Sablan recommended that the Board consider holding one or two public hearings at HPLO's conference room to facilitate Board member participation and help move the administrative process forward. B. Sablan further stated that administrative support would continue to be provided with the goal of completing the process by the first quarter of 2027. If the Board is unable to complete the rules and regulations by September 30, 2026, the matter would need to be placed on a Board meeting agenda for final approval before proceeding with the public hearing. B. Sablan emphasized that the rules and regulations serve as an important framework for the Board's regulation of the social work profession and that ensuring they remain current and consistent with existing statutes and professional standards would provide greater clarity for the Board, licensees, applicants, HPLO staff, and the public. Regarding licensing and application processing, B. Sablan reported that staff continue to review applications for completeness and verify required documentation before matters requiring Board action are presented for consideration, while also communicating with applicants regarding incomplete applications and outstanding documentation to minimize processing delays. B. Sablan also reported efforts to expand and improve online licensing capabilities, with the Guam Board of Social Work identified as one of the next boards to transition to enhanced online services. The completion of the rules and regulations was identified as necessary to provide guidance for developing the Board's professional dashboard. The transition to more comprehensive electronic licensing services is intended to make application and renewal processes more accessible and efficient for applicants and licensees while improving HPLO's ability to track applications and maintain accurate licensing records. Regarding complaints and investigations, B. Sablan reported that administrative processing of complaints received by the Board continues, with confidentiality maintained when required and complaints appropriately processed and brought before the Board when Board action is necessary. HPLO concluded by expressing its availability to answer questions and provide continued support to the Board.

Lape expressed appreciation for HPLO staff's assistance in reviewing applications and noted that staff effectively streamline the process by identifying required documentation and promptly contacting applicants regarding outstanding items before Board meetings. A. Lape then requested clarification regarding the planned online licensing capabilities and asked whether information from another board's implementation could be shared to help the Board determine whether any related provisions should be considered while finalizing the rules and regulations. Regarding complaints and investigations, A. Lape requested that HPLO staff establish and maintain a timeline or calendar for each complaint outlining applicable deadlines and required steps. She noted that, because members have separate employment responsibilities, having clearly established timelines would assist them in remaining on schedule and fulfilling their responsibility to investigate and resolve complaints in a timely manner. A. Lape then invited J. Baleto and D. Calvo to provide any additional questions they might have for B. Sablan. D. Calvo stated that she had no additional questions but asked whether the information presented would be provided as a formal written strategic plan. A. Lape asked if B. Sablan could share that with the Board. B. Sablan clarified that the proposed online licensing initiative is part of its strategic plan and provided an update on similar projects being implemented for other professional boards. The Guam Board of Nursing currently is 100% online, which allows complaints to be submitted through its nursing portal. B. Sablan explained that the nursing board project was supported by funding from the National Council of State Boards of Nursing and involved an investment exceeding \$500,000, making it distinct from the broader implementation being pursued for other boards, including the Guam Board of Medical Examiners. B. Sablan explained that, when the Guam Board of Social Work is brought into the online system, each licensee would have access to a professional dashboard containing demographic information, professional credentials, educational history, and other relevant applicant information. The dashboard would allow licensees to submit applications, renew licenses, and make payments online, with the goal of integrating these functions into one system. Applicants would also be able to upload supporting documents, including payment receipts, and would be expected to maintain current contact information within the dashboard. B. Sablan stated that the system would allow staff to receive and review submissions more efficiently and communicate more quickly with applicants and licensees. She further noted that the functionality for Board members to review applications through the system was still being developed, but the initial phase

	would focus on establishing the professional dashboard for licensees. A future phase would also include the issuance of digital licenses through the same system once all requirements had been completed and approved. A. Lape inquired about the level of public access to the professional dashboard. B. Sablan clarified that the professional dashboard would not be accessible to the public and would be restricted to individual licensees. Public-facing information would continue to be available through the live licensing directory, where members of the public could search for licensees by designation, including LCSW, and license number and verify whether a license was valid or expired. A. Lape expressed appreciation for the update and indicated that the Board looked forward to reviewing HPLO's strategic plan.			
VI	Chairperson's Report A. Lape acknowledged being cognizant of the Board's responsibility to promulgate the rules and regulations and reported that it has been diligently working on the revisions, which are currently in the final cleanup stage. A. Lape anticipated reaching a point where the draft could be shared with K. Aguilar for administrative assistance with formatting and other necessary revisions. Although the Board did not anticipate completing the rules and regulations by September 30, 2026, it expressed its intent to establish specific goals and timelines for completion during the first quarter of the new fiscal year. The Board planned to identify dates for providing the draft to Casey for administrative assistance, followed by planning for a potential public hearing while ensuring that the scheduled dates would accommodate the availability of Board members. D. Calvo then asked about the complaint and investigation procedures discussed in the HPLO report. She noted that the Board had received what appeared to be a standard complaint and investigation procedure from HPLO and inquired whether the planned automation of the Guam Board of Nursing's complaint process would result in changes to the standard procedures for receiving, investigating, and closing out complaints. B. Sablan clarified that the implementation of an online complaint system for the Guam Board of Nursing has not changed the established policies and procedures for complaints and investigations, which remain consistent across all boards. She explained that the primary difference may involve timelines due to difficulties in scheduling meetings and other administrative matters, but the underlying complaint and investigation process remains unchanged regardless of whether submissions are made online, in person, or by email. B. Sablan noted eventually, when they get into that phase of implementing an online complaint system, the process will be reviewed.	A. Lape	1124	Noted

Lape provided an update regarding the ASWB and noted that, although the Guam Board of Social Work does not currently require ASWB examinations for licensure, several Guam residents are licensed or seeking licensure in other jurisdictions where the examinations may be required. It was reported that ASWB had initiated a pilot program for online proctoring of examinations for individuals who live remotely or have limited access to testing sites; however, the pilot program was suspended the previous month following an attempted cheating incident. ASWB is contacting individuals who had registered for or were scheduled to participate in the pilot program to advise them of alternative testing options, and the online proctoring program may be resumed after the identified issues are addressed. A. Lape reported that a regulatory board chair online session was scheduled for the following morning and that any relevant information obtained from the session would be shared with the Board at the next meeting. An administrator's online session previously discussed was also scheduled for August 27, corresponding to August 28 at 4:00 a.m. Guam time due to the session being scheduled according to Eastern Time. B. Sablan, K. Aguilar, and other staff involved directly with the Guam Board of Social Work were encouraged to register and participate if available. A. Lape also provided information regarding ASWB's annual Delegate Assembly scheduled for November in Utah. It was noted that ASWB generally covers the costs for one representative from each member board to attend. The meeting typically addresses ASWB business, changes to organizational processes, election of ASWB leadership, and issues relevant to the regulation of social work practice. The meeting also includes a pre-conference Administrator Forum and a Board Member Exchange, with the Board Member Exchange described as an opportunity for participants to engage in substantive discussions regarding current regulatory issues. The Administrator Forum is available to board administrators and staff, and the Board noted that attendance is typically rotated among members and administrative personnel. A. Lape reported that J. Baletto had attended the previous year's Delegate Assembly, while D. Calvo would be unable to attend the upcoming meeting. Accordingly, A. Lape indicated an intention to register for the November meeting and stated that the required public health process and request through HPLO would be completed before the applicable deadline. She further advised that ASWB holds an annual education conference, with the next conference scheduled for April 2027 in Quebec. Unlike the Delegate Assembly, the education conference is not funded by ASWB; however, Board members may apply for available scholarships. It was noted that a Guam Board member had previously received such a scholarship several years earlier and that

Sabalenka survives despite 'tricky' weed smell at U.S. Open

When it comes to marijuana-smoking tennis fans, Aryna Sabalenka has a simple request.

"I was, like, guys, you can do whatever, you can smoke whatever. You can relax as much as you can, but please, do not do it around the tennis courts," Sabalenka said Friday after she was troubled by the smell of pot wafting over Louis Armstrong Stadium in her U.S. Open third-round win.

"It's a bit tricky to handle that smell while you're trying to compete at your best," said Sabalenka, who at one point complained to the

umpire about the powerful smell, wondering if the official could spot the offenders.

The two-time defending champion also halted her service motion at times during a straight-set win over Kamilla Rakhimova of Uzbekistan.

Was it the sun?

"No, I'm used to the sun, so that wasn't the problem," she said.

Questions about Sabalenka's pot plea to the umpire dominated a post-match press conference, where the Belarussian was asked at one point, "How much of a high

are you on here compared to the other majors?"

The world number one, who will face American Taylor Townsend in the fourth round, conceded that she has smelled weed previously in New York, but never so strong.

Sabalenka's comments to the umpire seemed to incriminate the crowd at the Louis Armstrong Stadium. But she also postulated that the wind may have played a role.

Several players have mentioned smelling marijuana smoke on outside courts, most assuming it's drifting in from nearby parks.

"I don't know if it's coming from the crowd or outside because of the wind," she said.

A philosopher said it was all part of a chaotic atmosphere at the U.S. Open.

"Obviously, though, you probably just feel like that's the way it is," she said. "I've just been some person on a break behind the stadium knows."

Sabalenka kept her bid for a rare U.S. Open threepeat on track with a 6-4, 6-3 victory over American

dangerous Ukrainian Marta Kostyuk 7-5, 5-7, 6-4.

Sabalenka needed all of her resolve against the multi-faceted Townsend, whose blistering service returns and net prowess flummoxed the Belarussian star in a first set that opened with five breaks of serve.

But her sustained power and precision proved too much and after falling behind 3-1 in the second set she won the last five games to seal the match.

"I was just trying to stay focused on myself and play not only point by point but ball by ball," Sabalenka said.

"I'm happy that I was able to turn around that second set."

Noskova needed six match points to seal her victory over Kostyuk, failing to convert two in the second set.

"I am more than relieved," Noskova said. "This match was so tough, emotionally more so than physically."

American Frances Tiafoe, the 11th seed who has twice reached the semi-finals in Flushing Meadows,

Tiafoe will face compatriot Alex Michelsen for a place in the semi-finals. Michelsen defeated Argentina's Tomas Martin Etcheverry 7-6 (8/6), 6-4, 6-4.

Women's third seed Jessica Pegula also advanced the U.S. cause. Pegula, one

of the players with a chance to supplant Sabalenka atop the rankings in New York,

reached the semi-finals 6-3, 6-4 over Serbian Sorana
