Hafa Adai!

The Government of Guam released its fiscal year 2023 financial audit on February 8, 2025. This is a reminder that your citizen-centric report (CCR) is **due no later than April 10, 2025**, or 60 calendar days after the audit release, according to Title 1 Guam Code Annotated Chapter 19 §1922(a).

The entities required to submit a CCR include line agencies, autonomous and semi-autonomous agencies, public corporations, the Mayors' Council of Guam, the Judiciary of Guam, and *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*. Your CCR must be:

- Submitted to OPA via .pdf e-mail attachment;
- Submitted to the Speaker via .pdf e-mail attachment; and
- Posted on the entity's website.

As a result of our previous audit, OPA Report No. 24-10, we issued letters to certain entities outlining areas for improvement that would bring the entity into full compliance with submission requirements. We remind your entity to prepare your CCR [according to the most current format suggested by the AGA](#). Your entity might consider submitting your CCR for consideration in [AGA National's Certificate of Excellence in Accountability Reporting](#), as well as [AGA Guam Chapter's Best CCR Contest](#).

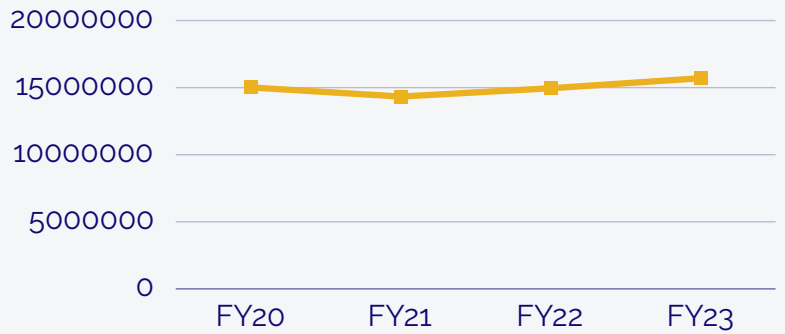
## FY2022 General Fund Appropriation & Expenditures

**Expenditures \$13,613,959**

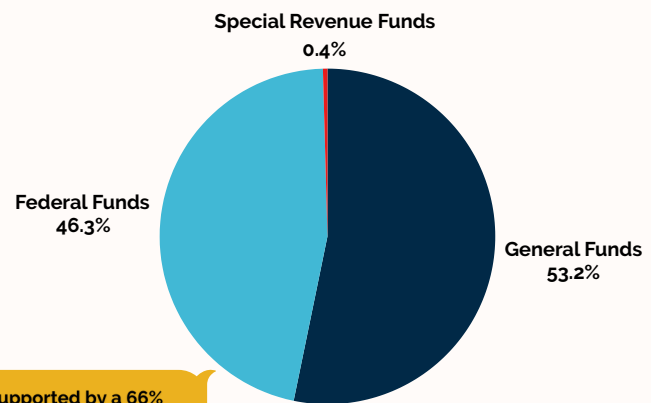

\$877K awarded to organizations who provide direct services to the community

The OAG is responsible for managing the Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) federal grant which funds organizations that provide direct services to victims of crime. The Office received a total of \$877,094.00 for victim assistance-related funding, and \$45,000 for victim compensation reimbursement. These funds have yet to be divided among the subrecipients.
