The Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS) is the primary government agency in Guam responsible for delivering health and social services to the island community. Established on July 1, 1964, DPHSS was founded under the provisions of 5 GCA, Government Operations, Chapter 3, Department of the Government, Article 1 §3III, DPHSS operates as a line agency within the Government of Guam.

OUR SERVICES

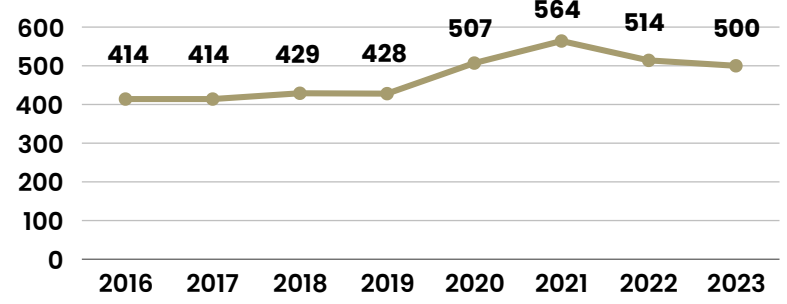
DPHSS is organized into six divisions, each dedicated to delivering essential health and social services to the community. Our services include:

- Provide primary care and preventive services.
- Promote public health through disease control and prevention.
- Promote healthy lifestyle and wellness.
- Issue vital records, such as birth, death, and marriage certificates.
- Ensure environmental health and safety for all residents.
- Support individual families through programs like childcare, foster care, Medicaid, and more.
- Promote the well-being of seniors aged 60 and over.

OUR WORKFORCE

In fiscal year 2023, DPHSS employed 500 employees across its six divisions. These employees were classified into different employment categories, including classified, unclassified, limited-term appointments, temporary appointments, and contractual positions.

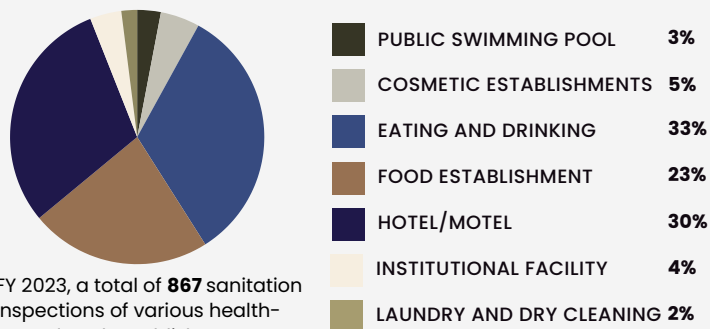

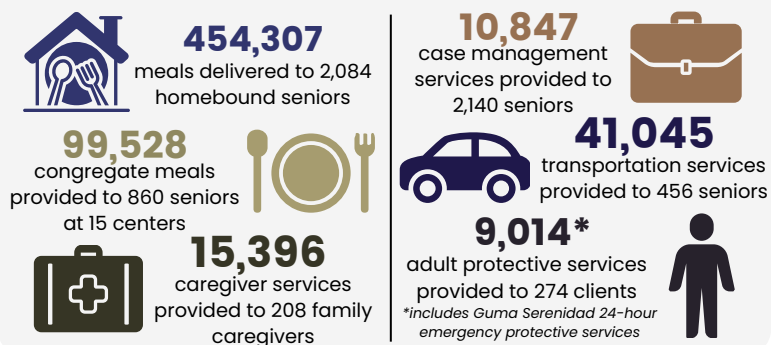
DISTRIBUTION OF SANITARY PERMITS ISSUED IN FY 2023

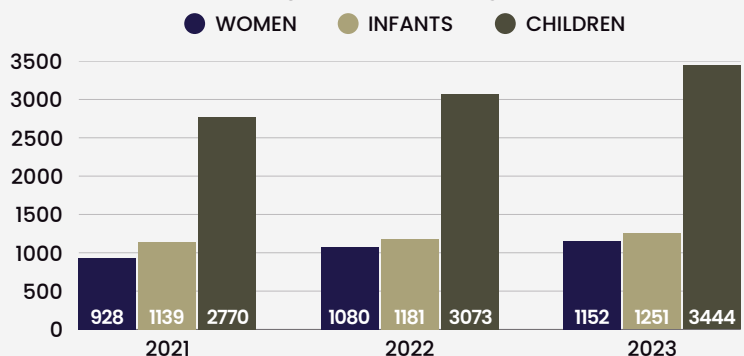

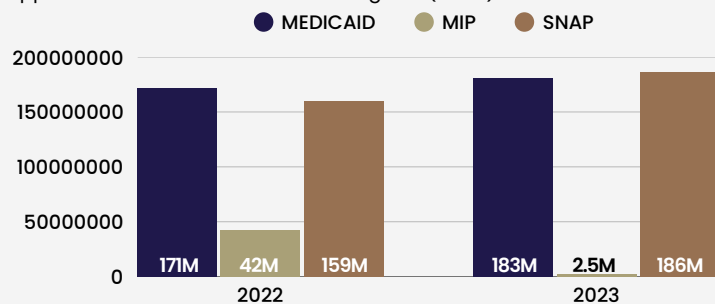
AVERAGE MONTHLY WIC PARTICIPATION BY CATEGORIES FROM FY 2021-2023

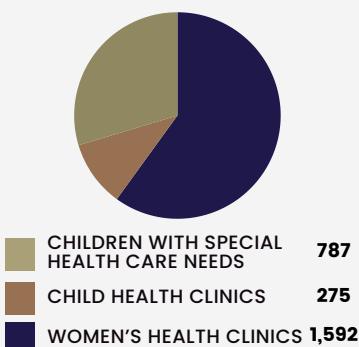
MEDICAID, MEDICALLY INDIGENT PROGRAM (MIP), AND SNAP ALLOTMENTS ISSUED IN FY 2023

In FY 2023, a total of \$183 million in Medicaid claims and \$186 million Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) allotments were issued.



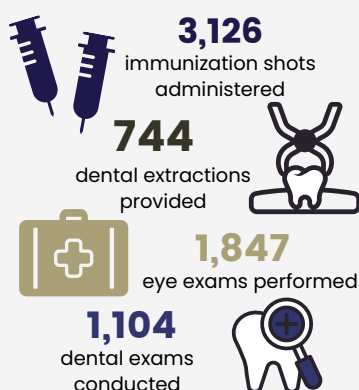

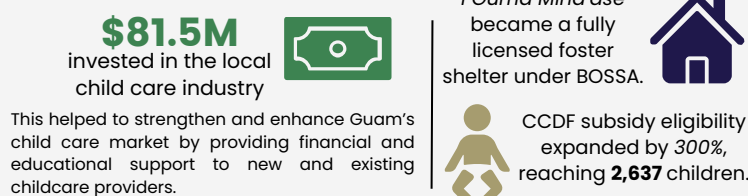

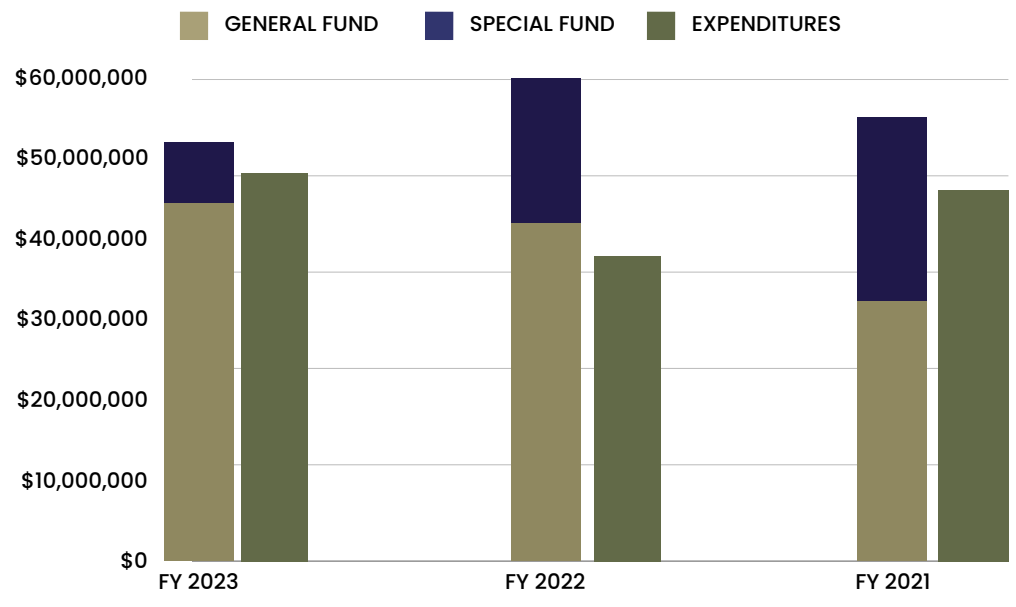

FUNDING OVERVIEW

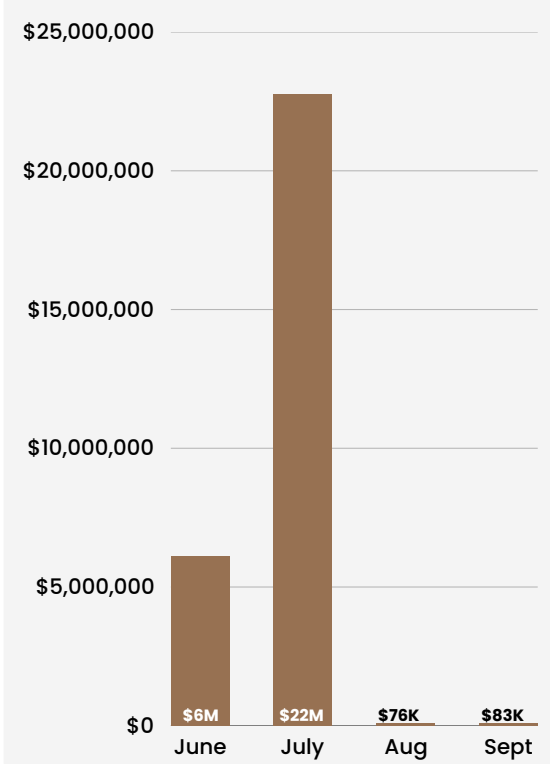
In FY 2023, the DPHSS received funding from three primary sources:

- **General Funds.** These are primary funds from the local government.
- **Federal Funds.** These are grants from the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS).
- **Special Funds.** These consist of various programs that help fund the following: Community Health Centers, Health Professional Licenses, Health and Human Services, Controlled Substance, Environmental Health, and Healthy Futures. Special Fund revenues are restricted to specific purposes.

BREAKDOWN OF FEDERAL FUNDS

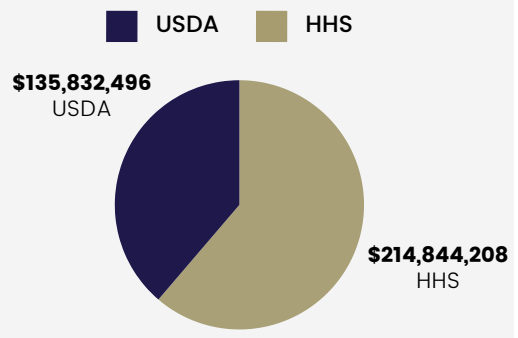
TOTAL FEDERAL FUNDS RECEIVED IN FY 2023



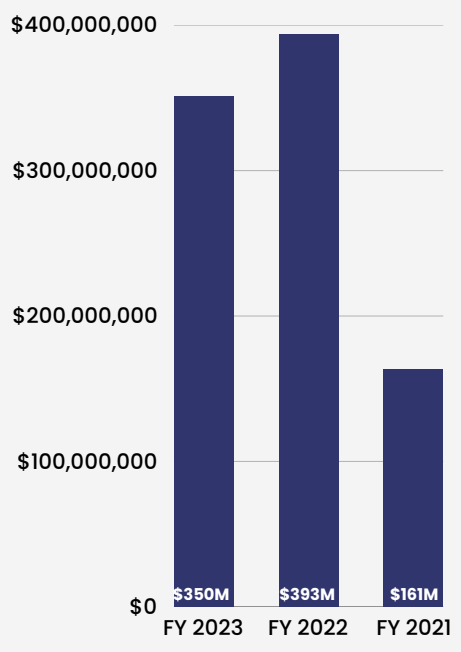

OUR CHALLENGES

General Operational Challenges. The DPHSS continues to face recruitment and procurement challenges. Securing a qualified workforce through effective recruitment is crucial for delivering quality services. Similarly, efficient procurement is essential for ensuring the timely acquisition of medical equipment and supplies.

Centralizing Services for Better Operations. The DPHSS is actively working to consolidate its services, which are currently scattered across various locations throughout the island. This dispersal presents significant operational challenges, hindering efficiency and limiting public access.

FY2023 HIGHLIGHTS

DPHSS INNOVATIVE READINESS TRAINING (IRT) MEDICAL MISSION PROVIDES OVER 14K SERVICES

The DPHSS in collaboration with the Department of Defense (DOD) provided a total of 14,743 at no-cost medical services to island residents through Guam's first ever Innovative Readiness Training (IRT) Medical Mission. DPHSS, together with local and Federal partners, provided services such as dental, vision, physicals and vaccinations to the people of Guam during the period of August 2, 2023 through August 10, 2023 at the University of Guam (UOG) Calvo Field House.



DPHSS DISTRIBUTES \$23M IN D-SNAP BENEFITS

The DPHSS with assistance from various Government of Guam Agencies distributed a total of \$29,026,514.84 in Disaster Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (D-SNAP) benefits to the people of Guam.

"I would like to thank the Department of Public Health and Social Services as a whole, as well as the various Government of Guam Agencies for their commitment and sacrifice in both assisting the people of Guam get access to this benefit in a time of need, and their part in making this program a success," added Director San Agustin.

Accreditation Readiness Initiatives: This involves preparing DPHSS for accreditation reviews to ensure adherence to national standards and best practices. Achieving accreditation will demonstrate the DPHSS' commitment to quality and enhance public trust.

Workforce Development and Training: This focuses on investing in the professional development of DPHSS staff through targeted training programs. Enhancing employee skills and knowledge will improve service delivery and ensure a competent and motivated workforce.
