Håfa Adai Mr. Speaker,

These two bills were introduced in coordination with the Guam Election Commission (GEC). Bill No. 53-38 addresses concerns raised by the public about the posting of the voting registration lists in a public place on election day. These concerns expressed are about the ability of individuals with nefarious intent to obtain valuable personal identifying information about voters. I agree that as a government we have an obligation to protect sensitive information our citizens provide to our agencies. With the availability of online methods for a person to determine their voter status, the absence of public lists outside of each polling station does not appear to negatively impact any substantive rights of the voters.

Bill No. 55-38 intends to simplify the reporting schedule for candidates and the political parties. Under Bill No. 55-38, the candidates have a specific date that reports are due to the GEC. This also makes it easier for the public to know when they can expect the financial information to be available for inspection. This quarterly requirement will improve the public's ability to monitor the spending of candidates and the parties.





**AN ACT TO *REPEAL* § 9107 OF CHAPTER 9, TITLE 3,
GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO
SAFEGUARDING THE PRIVACY OF REGISTERED
VOTERS, TO BE CITED AS THE “VOTER PRIVACY
PROTECTION ACT OF 2025.”**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds
that the current law requiring the Guam Election Commission (GEC) to post two
voter rosters or voter registration indexes outside polling precincts, exposes sensitive
personal information - such as voter names, addresses, and dates of birth – to the

1 public. This mandate jeopardizes voter privacy and security, leaving individuals
2 vulnerable to potential misuse of their personal information.

3 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that the requirement to post hardcopies
4 of voter registration indexes at each polling precinct to assist voters in confirming or
5 locating their assigned precinct is an outdated practice that imposes unnecessary
6 financial burdens on government resources and contributes to inefficient paper
7 waste.

8 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that the GEC has adapted to technological
9 advancements and provided an online portal in the GEC website where voters can
10 securely check their registration status and assigned voting precinct without
11 accessing anyone else's information. This modern implementation allows for secure
12 and sustainable methods of disseminating voter information and effectively
13 eliminates the need for hardcopy indexes.

14 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that granting the public unmonitored
15 access to hardcopies of the voter registration indexes may be a breach of
16 confidentiality, leaving registered voters vulnerable to the risks of exploitation and
17 ultimately exposing the GEC to potential liabilities under criminal statutes.

18 Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to repeal the statutory
19 requirement for posting voter rosters or registration indexes outside polling precincts
20 to safeguard voter privacy, stop unnecessary financial expenditures, support efficient
21 practices, reduce paper waste, and eliminate potential liabilities.

22 **Section 2.** § 9107 of Chapter 9, Title 3, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby
23 *repealed*.

24 **Section 3. Severability.** If any provision of this Act or its application to any
25 person or circumstance is found to be invalid or inorganic, such invalidity
26 shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect

1 without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
2 Act are severable.

3 **Section 4. Effective Date.** This Act shall be effective upon enactment.
