

**Net Income** 





#### **FUTURE OUTLOOK**

As Mount Carmel School continues to advance its mission, the upcoming school year promises even greater opportunities for growth, excellence, and achievement.

**Department of War Award:** Mount Carmel School continues to lead the way in educational innovation as the first school in Guam selected by the Department of War to integrate the Manufacturing and Engineering Education Reimagined for All (MEERA) program into its curriculum. Our students in grades 3–6 will gain hands-on all-encompassing experience in robotics, welding, additive manufacturing, and computer numerical control (CNC) programming. The program is designed to build a pathway for students to enter the industrial workforce. This award (over \$155K) covers the initial cost of equipment, sustainable costs and the cost to train teachers for this program.

**Martial Arts:** Mount Carmel School will continue to build on the success of its distinguished Martial Arts Program. In the coming year, we will prepare our students to represent the school in local and international martial arts competitions, including the Marianas Open, striking exhibitions and opportunities to represent Mount Carmel on the international arena.

**Music:** The Music Department will build out our drum room and expand by acquiring more music equipment for our students. We also plan to update our stage and audio systems to host bigger concerts and events at the school. The Music Department will also expand its reach with student band performances in island-wide and interschool festivals and events, further strengthening the school's cultural and artistic presence throughout the community.

**Spoken Chamoru:** Our students will demonstrate their proficiency through participation in the 2026 Chamoru Language Competition as well as local cultural competitions, honoring our island heritage and celebrating the richness of our native language.

**Faculty:** SY2025-26 will focus on expanding our faculty to continue to build upon recruitment of Chamoru instructors, Martial Arts Instructors and Music Instructors to maintain the standards of proficiency in these areas. In addition, we will continue to invest in our current faculty by providing Professional Development and learning opportunities to build upon skills and enhance PBL learning and implementation across all grade levels.
