GBME has until June 2026 to rollout the emergency preparedness project, which is the technical assistant grant that we received. VI.	Chairperson's Report	A. Licensing Requirements for Military Physicians Prescribing Compounded Medications in Guam During the meeting, Dr. Aguon addressed a question raised by a pharmacist regarding the prescribing of compounded medications by military physicians at the Naval Hospital in Guam, particularly when the medication is compounded at a different hospital. The issue centers around pharmacists who are licensed but not within the Navy's jurisdiction, and military doctors who are not licensed in Guam, raising concerns about the legality of these practices. It was suggested to form a discussion group including Dr. Aguon, Dr. Eusebio, Dr. Wielaard, and	Dr. Berg		Noted

	representatives from the Board of Pharmacy to develop a formal process to address this issue. Additionally, ongoing concerns were highlighted about continuity of care when military patients are transferred to civilian hospitals or vice versa, as military doctors may be restricted from continuing care due to licensing limitations. There was discussion about potentially pursuing legislation to allow military physicians to remain involved in-patient care without violating licensing laws, particularly to ensure continuity. The conversation also covered the topic of medical records retention and the implications of clinic closures. It was noted that there is a need for clearer regulations on how long medical records must be retained and made accessible, with current requirements varying by CMS, HIPAA, and accrediting bodies. Guam currently lacks specific legislation on the duration for which records must be maintained. The group emphasized the importance of ensuring patient access to records when clinics close and discussed exploring model legislation and standards for record custodianship. Attorney Tillman provided legal clarification, confirming that under Guam law (26 GAR 41614), military medical personnel are exempt from certain licensing requirements and are allowed to prescribe, dispense, and administer medications within the scope of their official duties. However, local civilian pharmacies and hospitals are not required to fill these prescriptions but may do so at their discretion. This clarification appears to resolve the legal concerns surrounding compounded medication prescribing by military physicians, though hospital policies will ultimately determine implementation. Lastly, the group was reminded of upcoming recommendations from the Federation of State Medical Boards (FSMB) regarding alternative pathways for licensing international medical graduates (IMGs). Currently, IMGs must complete an ACGME-accredited residency program to obtain a medical license in the United States, except under exceptional circumstances. It was noted that no U.S. states issue unrestricted or restricted medical licenses to IMGs without this training, although some states permit assistant physician roles under certain conditions.			
	B. Ardeshir Ardeshiri, M.D. – Assistant Surgeon/Educational Consulting Surgeon Dr. Berg reported that Dr. Dulebohn from GRMC introduced the topic of potentially issuing a special license for a foreign physician, which prompted discussion among the board members. It was noted that Dr. Eusebio may also have an interest in this matter. Dr. Berg will attend the Guam Board of Medical Nursing meeting to collaborate with the Guam Medical Board on the development of an impaired healthcare provider program. Currently, Guam and CNMI remain the only FSMB member boards without such programs. The proposed model, based on Tennessee's system, aims to address mental health, substance abuse, and impaired providers—including physicians, physician assistants, and podiatrists. Coordination with the nursing board and legal counsel is ongoing to establish a unified approach designed to support impaired providers and reduce stigma. Dr. Berg also highlighted a legislative gap concerning medical record retention and patient access following clinic closures. While Guam complies with HIPAA's seven-year retention requirement, the period during which records must remain accessible to patients remains unclear. Dr. Berg will work with Attorney Tillman to review this issue and may propose new legislation or regulations.			Noted

		The board discussed the possibility of holding annual joint sessions with the CNMI medical board to address shared regional issues. Given the board's small size, Dr. Berg proposed formally sharing insights gained from FSMB meetings on a regular basis—ideally once a year, about six months after the annual FSMB meeting—to supplement informal discussions. All members, including Mr. Tajalle and Dr. Kim, were encouraged to participate in FSMB activities and utilize available online training courses. It was noted that FSMB includes physician assistants as full members with elected officials, highlighting the organization's inclusiveness. Members were reminded to reserve April 30 to May 2 for the upcoming FSMB meeting in Baltimore, recognized for its valuable sessions, including attorney-focused forums. Funding assistance may be available for legal representatives such as Attorney Tillman. Additionally, a board attorneys meeting scheduled for November 6-7 in Philadelphia was recommended for future attendance despite short notice this year. Dr. Berg noted that the FSMB is well-regarded for its educational programs, especially when compared to organizations like IAMRA. To enhance communication, Dr. Berg emphasized increasing the use of email and WhatsApp among members and legal counsel for sharing information and coordinating events. Finally, Dr. Berg shared that the board is finalizing plans for a visit by FSMB Chairman Dr. George Abraham and President Dr. Hank Chowdhury in early January. Their itinerary will include CNMI, Guam, and Palau, with the objective of encouraging Palau to join FSMB as an affiliate member due to its close alignment with the U.S. Efforts to engage American Samoa continue despite limited interest. Visit expenses are expected to be locally funded.

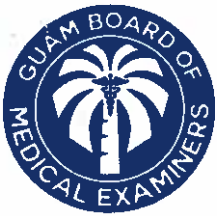

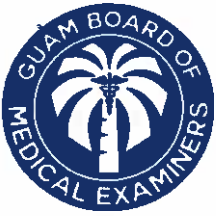

Guam on his mind

But before his sports footing in Philly, he was a young blonde kid who came to the tropical island of Guam with his parents and older brother Bunker (yes, Bunker Hill).

"I have met very few people in my life that have been friendlier than Guam," he said.

He thinks his parents just wanted a change of pace in those days, so they moved to Guam and lived in Hagåt while his dad worked as a gym teacher at Agat Junior High and his mom worked at Continental Air Micronesia.

"It was so much fun. I loved it. So many good memories," said the now 62-year-old. "My wife (Heidi) gets sick and tired of me talking about Guam. I had the time of my life on Guam and I will never forget the experiences I had there."

Hill recalls going hiking at Sigua Falls and Talofofo Falls and venturing down to Humåtak.

"I had so many friends, I had no enemies on Guam," he said. "It was so much fun. We all hung around and played kickball or catch toads."

He recalls his first day of school on Guam and how he immediately felt the welcome.

"They were all so friendly," he said.

His family's time on Guam was cut short in 1972 when they had to return to the states because of his grandfather's passing.

"We moved back for the funeral and we never went back (to Guam)," he said.

After Guam

West Virginia is where the Hill family would settle after playing in the southern jungles of Guam.

Zack went on to get an elementary education degree from West Virginia University and is still just six credit



hours short of a master's degree in sports administration.

His big break came while an intern with the 76ers in 1987, Julius Erving's final season.

During a snow storm, he dredged through 10 to 12 inches of the cold stuff in his 1980 Pinto to make it to the Veteran's Stadium parking lot, adjacent to The Spectrum.

"Only time we had ice on Guam was in the freezer," he recalled the difference between Guam and Philly weather.

In the parking lot on that frozen day, the only other car there belonged to then-GM John Nash.

The GM took the intern to breakfast before sending him home and said, "I'll remember this."

As the director of PR for the Sixers from 1987 to 1993, his fondest memory is when Charles Barkley called him to set up a Thanksgiving visit to a children's hospital.

Thinking that a media invite was part of the plan, Barkley insisted that the visit wasn't meant for publicity.

"He didn't want me to tell the media. He didn't want the publicity, he just wanted to do it for himself. We visited so many rooms, and no media. He didn't want it," Hill said.

After the 76ers, he moved over to the Flyers hockey organization, where he spent the next 30 years.

His job as the media relations manager for the Flyers entailed being the liaison

between the Flyers ownership, management, coaches and players with the media.

"I was the middle man," he said. "I'd coordinate interviews and do the best of my abilities to do that."

He did his job well enough to win the prestigious Dick Dillman Award four times, an award given to the NHL's best public relations staff in the league.

After two trips with the Flyers to the Stanley Cup (both losses) and 30 years of work, it was time to hang up the press credentials.

"I just want to enjoy life. I was 60 and I just thought it was time to retire and it was a good time, and I'm living right now in between two villages in Ohio (his birth state) and it's so calm—5 acres (half acre pond)."

Return to Guam

In 2000, Zack made a short trip back with his mom Midge Hill and brother Bunker.

Ms. Midge, by the way, did some acting while on Guam with the UOG Theatre. Zack and Bunker would play hide-n-seek around UOG. Midge would be a popular news anchor in her later years in Dallas and Pittsburgh, had roles in soap operas and even had a role in the uber popular episode of *Who Shot JR?*

"We had such fond memories and just wanted to see it again," mom Midge said about their return. "We'd have that pancit and lumpia and all that good stuff. Loved every minute of it. I thanked God for just send-

ing us there."

Midge's memories

As an office staffer for Continental Air Mike, Midge was able to take her young family in the early '70s around Micronesia and Asia.

The 82-year-old Midge still has vivid memories of her time on Guam: the local elections, Japanese soldier Sgt. Yokoi was discovered in the jungles on Jan. 24, 1972, all the hype of Orange Julius opening up, and eating the Taotaomona Burger at the old USO in Piti.

"I would wash clothes and hang them outside and more than once, the carabao would come up and tangle up in my laundry," Midge fondly recalls. "I miss Guam. Guam is great. I hope everyone who lives there or visited appreciates it, because we do. There's no place like Guam. The girls were beautiful. Mary Lou Pangelinan was beautiful."

When they got back to West Virginia in 1972, the local paper did a story on the family about their stay on Guam.

"(Zack) told them, 'I don't have one enemy on Guam.'"

'Value every day'

A lifetime story Zack left out, but mom Midge shared with us is his near-death car accident.

Zack was a victim of a drunk driving accident. While changing a flat tire coming home from a game in Philly, a drunk driver struck him, smashing his legs and breaking his hands along with head injuries.

"He was a mess and we wondered if he would even live," his mom said. "I know he was living in pain all this time, but he just carried on. He valued every day of his life because of this."

It was a second chance in life. A life he made good, with Guam still on his mind.

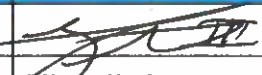
