Please be advised that the Bills were transmitted to your office on January 29, 2026, at 7:04 p.m.

On February 11, 2026, you returned the following bills without your signature:

Bill No 79-38 (COR), "AN ACT TO AUTHORIZIIZE *I MAGA'HÅGAN GUAHÅN* TO SELL A PORTION OF BLOCK 8 IN NEW AGAT DESIGNATED AS BLOCK 8 PARK AREA AND TO DEPOSIT THE PROCEEDS OF THE SALE INTO THE CHAMORRO LAND TRUST INFRASTRUCTURE AND SUVEY FUND."

Bill 251-38 (COR), "AN ACT TO AMEND § 31101 OF CHAPTER 31, DIVISION 4, TITLE 17, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE GUAM COMMUNITY COLLEGE BOARD OF TRUSTEE COMPOSITION TO ENHANCE BUSINESS AND INDUSTRY REPRESENTATION."

The Organic Act also requires the Governor to sign all bills the Governor intends to approve within ten days of its presentation. Bill No. 138-38 (COR), Bill No. 150-38 (LS), Bill No. 162-38 (COR), Bill No. 169-38 (COR), Bill No. 195-38 (COR), Bill No. 202-38 (COR), Bill No. 215-38 (COR), Bill No. 217-38 (COR), Bill No. 235-38 (COR) and Bill No. 240-38 (LS) were approved and dated February 11, 2026, after the tenth day of presentation to you.

Therefore, Bill No. 138-38 (COR) is lapsed into law as **Public Law 38-94**, Bill No. 150-38 (LS) is lapsed into law as **Public Law 38-95**, Bill No. 162-38 (COR) is lapsed into law as **Public Law 38-96**, Bill No. 169-38 (COR) is lapsed into law as **Public Law 38-97**, Bill No. 195-38 (COR) is lapsed into law as **Public Law 38-98**, Bill No. 202-38 (COR) is lapsed into law as **Public Law 38-99**, Bill No. 215-38 (COR) is lapsed into law as **Public Law 38-100**, Bill No. 217-38 (COR) is lapsed into law as **Public Law 38-101**, Bill No. 235-38 (COR) is lapsed into law as **Public Law 38-102** and Bill No. 240-38 (LS) is lapsed into law as **Public Law 38-103**, respectively as of February 11, 2026.

In addition, the Organic Act of Guam requires the Governor to return all bills to the legislature in which the Governor does not intend to approve within ten days of its presentation. Bill No 79-38 (COR) and Bill 251-38 (COR) were returned unsigned on February 11, 2026, and after the tenth day of presentation to you.

Therefore, Bill 79-38 (COR) is lapsed into law as **Public Law 38-104** and Bill 251-38 (COR) is lapsed into law as **Public Law 38-105**, respectively, on February 11, 2026.

*Håfa Adai* Mr. Speaker,

Bill 215-38 seeks to waive the sanitary permit fees for student support fundraisers. Fundraisers, such as bake sales, concession stands, or school carnival fundraisers are learning opportunities for students where they can develop their own personal sense of responsibility, entrepreneurship, and work ethic while collaborating with peers and contributing to the community.

Sanitary permit fees can be particularly burdensome for student organizations with limited budgets and could potentially deter students from hosting future events, or starting new extra-curricular clubs.

Waiving sanitary permit fees would allow students to keep their money and reinvest it back into their respective programs and school communities, ultimately removing barriers to participation. Furthermore, this bill encourages civic engagement and allows students and staff members who often bear the burden of paying the fee to serve their commitments without worrying about finances.

By signing this bill into law, I hope to send a clear message to Guam that we trust our students, teachers, and volunteers to follow basic safety protocols, and that we prioritize their fundraising efforts over bureaucracy.

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

**AN ACT TO *ADD* A NEW SUBSECTION (e) TO § 21103  
OF CHAPTER 21, DIVISION 2, TITLE 10, GUAM CODE  
ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO WAIVING SANITARY  
PERMIT FEES FOR STUDENT SUPPORT  
FUNDRAISERS.**

1        **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2        **Section 1.** Subsection (e) is *added* to § 21103 of Chapter 21, Division 2,  
3 Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, to read as follows:

4                **“§ 21103. Form, Duration and Charges for Permit and Annual**  
5        **Renewal.**

1           (a) The form of the permit shall be prescribed by the Director. All  
2 permits applicable thereto shall be issued on an annual basis and, regardless  
3 of when issued, shall expire one (1) year after the date for which issued or  
4 renewed.

5           (b) All permits applicable thereto which are already in existence  
6 prior to the enactment of this law shall be renewed on the month consistent  
7 with the month they originally attained their permit. The Director shall have  
8 up to twelve (12) months from the enactment of this law to amend the renewal  
9 dates of these sanitary permits to conform with the renewal date outlined in  
10 the Section.

11           (c) Sanitary permits for the temporary workforce housing category,  
12 as defined in Chapter 26A of this Title, shall adhere to the permit renewal  
13 schedule pursuant to 10 GCA § 26A104.

14           (d) The fee for the sanitary permit shall be determined by the  
15 Director by regulation and shall be collected by him or his designee. The  
16 falsification of an application for a sanitary permit may result in the  
17 suspension or revocation of the sanitary permit in accordance with 10 GCA §  
18 21109.

19           (e) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, rule, or regulation,  
20 including but not limited to Title 26, Division 1, Chapter 4 of the Guam  
21 Administrative Rules and Regulations, no fee shall be required for a sanitary  
22 permit issued pursuant to this Chapter for a temporary food service  
23 establishment operated by a student organization school group, or parent-  
24 teacher organization for fundraising purposes that support students. For  
25 purposes of this subsection:

26                   (1) ‘Student organization, school group, or parent teacher  
27 organization’, means any group affiliated with a public or private

1 elementary, secondary, or postsecondary school on Guam, including  
2 but not limited to clubs, sports teams, class councils, parent-teacher  
3 organizations (PTOs), parent-teacher-student associations (PTSA's), or  
4 similar parent-school affiliated organizations;

5 (2) The student organization, school group, or parent-teacher  
6 organization shall comply with all inspection and sanitation standards  
7 under 10 GCA Chapter 21; and

8 (3) The applicant shall submit a certification from the school  
9 administrator verifying the fundraising purpose of each individual  
10 event. The school administrator may grant permissions to student  
11 organizations, school groups, or parent-teacher organizations on a case-  
12 by-case basis, maintaining records of such approvals and compliance  
13 verifications.”

14 **Section 2. Severability.** If any provision of this Act or its application to any  
15 person or circumstance is found to be invalid or inorganic, such invalidity shall not  
16 affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without  
17 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are  
18 severable.

19 **Section 3. Effective Date.** This Act shall be effective upon enactment.
