Håfa Adai Mr. Speaker,

Bill No. 103-38 (COR) creates an important tool for our law enforcement agencies to use to recruit qualified individuals who possess the basic training to be a law enforcement officer by having received a bachelor's degree or its equivalent but have not completed all of the necessary advanced training to become fully POST Commission certified. Bill No. 103-38 (COR) now allows the law enforcement agencies to recruit and hire these individuals and then allow them nine (9) months of receiving their temporary certification to complete all the training necessary to receive full POST certification. During the time the individual only possesses a temporary certificate the individual will be limited to the duties they are allowed to perform. If the individual does not complete the required training within the required time frame they will be separated from their employment. This new provision is good for both our law enforcement agencies and the newly graduated Criminal Justice majors seeking employment who invested their time and resources in the desire to become law enforcement officers.

For these reasons, I sign Bill No. 103-38 (COR) into law as *Public Law No. 38-50*.

AN ACT TO ADD A NEW § 51102(h)(11) AND AMEND §§ 51103(b)(4), AND 51105(b) ALL OF CHAPTER 51, TITLE 17; AND TO AMEND § 7120 OF CHAPTER 7, TITLE 22, **GUAM** CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO AUTHORIZING THE TEMPORARY CERTIFICATION OF PEACE OFFICERS AND TO AUTHORIZING THE MANPOWER DEVELOPMENT **FUND FOR** CERTIFICATION COURSES REQUIRED BY THE PEACE OFFICER STANDARDS AND TRAINING COMMISSION.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds
- 3 that in addition to implementing compensation adjustments and providing for a safe

and conducive work environment, public safety and law enforcement agencies of the

2 Government of Guam must also position themselves to recruit and retain individuals

3 to serve as peace officers by improving Peace Officer Standards and Training

(POST) Commission (Commission) certification policies.

Based on information provided to the Committee on Public Safety, Emergency Management, and Guam National Guard, *I Liheslatura* finds that criminal justice graduates of the University of Guam (UOG) who desire to establish a career in public safety and law enforcement, but lack certain training requirements including, and not limited to, First Responder/First Aid, Emergency Vehicle Operator Course (EVOC), Officer Survival and Use of Force, Firearms and safety, Criminal Investigations, and Dynamics of Substance Abuse, do not qualify nor are they offered temporary employment options. Despite having completed undergraduate degree requirements for potential employment in management and administrative positions at the Department of Corrections, Customs and Quarantine Agency of Guam, or the Judiciary of Guam, criminal justice graduates are left to either seek employment elsewhere or delay their public service career – and the opportunity to earn a salary and benefits – while they complete POST Commission requirements at their expense.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that the POST Commission statute and corresponding sections under the Guam Administrative Rules and Regulations allow the Commission to grant temporary certification of peace officers who have previously completed basic peace officer training but have since left service in good standing, provided that these peace officers shall satisfy standards and training requirements as set by the Commission. These same policies also permit the temporary certification of peace officers from other jurisdictions who have completed basic peace officer training and have since left service in good standing.

Recognizing the time and resources that are invested by criminal justice graduates to earn their college degree, and the overlapping of public safety and law enforcement principles and practices that are taught through UOG and POST Commission certified training programs, *I Liheslatura* proposes to authorize the POST Commission to grant temporary peace officer certification for those who possess a degree in criminal justice or equivalent area of study and who are in good standing, provided they satisfy the standards and training requirements as set by the Commission.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further intends through this Act to authorize the Guam Department of Labor and the Guam Community College to expend a portion of their Manpower Development Fund appropriations for costs associated with training individuals who are granted temporary peace officer certification by the POST Commission.

**Section 2.** A new § 51102(h)(11) of Chapter 51, Title 17, Guam Code Annotated, is *added* and § 51102(h) is *re-numbered* to read as follows:

"(11) provide by rule for the temporary certification of peace officers who possess a degree in criminal justice or equivalent area of study as determined by the Commission, and who are in good standing, provided that said peace officers satisfy standards and training requirements as set by the Commission. The Commission shall require applicants to complete any remaining certification requirements within nine (9) months of temporary certification and may prescribe limited duties for temporarily certified peace officers during this period. Failure to obtain full certification by the Commission within nine (9) months of temporary certification shall result in separation from employment. Employing agencies retain the authority provided in § 51105(c) of this Chapter to establish qualifications and standards that exceed those set by the Commission, and nothing herein shall

1		affect the selection of eligible applicants by agency heads or designated hiring
2		authorities for Category 1, Category 2, or Category 3 peace officer positions.
3		The Commission is further authorized to establish policies to recoup tuition,
4		fees, and other government-funded expenses in the event an employee resigns,

- (D) the remaining balance of the Department of Labor's MDF allocation shall be used for administrative and operational purposes as may be determined by the Director of Labor.
- (2) Seventy percent (70%) of the annual revenues generated shall be allocated to the Apprenticeship Training Program at the Guam Community College, with the primary intent to develop the workforce for positions that have been approved for non-immigrant temporary workers. The Guam Community College allocation in the MDF shall be paid out by the Treasurer of Guam to the Apprenticeship Training Program at Guam Community College, and shall be expended exclusively to fund the following:
  - (A) subject to the approval of the Guam Community College Board of Trustees, direct financial assistance to students enrolled in the apprenticeship or preapprenticeship program which may include, but are not

1		limited to, courses required for certification by the Peace

4		Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), such
