Håfa Adai Mr. Speaker,

Bills 106 and 155 are about crime victim's rights, preserving their safety, dignity, and well-being. These bills recognize that behind every crime statistic is a human being who has suffered deeply.

At its core, Bill 106 reflects the simple truth that our justice system must respect the dignity and voices of those most affected by crime: the victims. Too often, victims have faced the painful reality of learning about plea deals after the fact, blindsided and retraumatized by a system that should have supported them. Bill 106-38 changes that. It acknowledges that victims are integral to the justice process and deserve to be informed, heard, and respected. It ensures that no plea agreement can proceed without documented proof that good-faith efforts have been made to notify victims, and gives the victims an opportunity to voice their concerns. Ultimately, Bill 106 adds transparency to our local justice system and enables the victims of crimes to be heard.

Bill 155 further supports victim rights by establishing a procedural framework and standards through the adoption of the Rules and Regulations for Adjudication of Victims Claims. The Guam Criminal Injuries Compensation Act was established to support victims who frequently experience emotional, physical, and financial trauma due to circumstances beyond their control. These revised regulations provide structure to claims processing while safeguarding the confidentiality and dignity of victims. They also reinforce fiscal responsibility in administering compensation from public funds.

AN ACT TO AMEND § 60.80(b) OF CHAPTER 60, TITLE 8, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO PROHIBITING PLEA DEALS WITHOUT REASONABLE PROOF OF VICTIM NOTIFICATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Plea Bargaining Regulated. Subsection (b) of § 60.80 of
- 3 Chapter 60, Title 8, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby *amended*, to read:
- 4 "(b) If a plea agreement has been reached by the parties which
- 5 contemplates entry of a plea of guilty or nolo contendere in the expectation

that a specified sentence will be imposed or that other charges before the court will be dismissed, the court shall require the disclosure of the agreement in open court at the time the plea is offered. Thereupon, the court may accept or reject the agreement, or may defer its decision as to acceptance or rejection until there has been an opportunity to consider the presentence report. No plea agreement shall be accepted by the court unless the agreement includes a certification by a victim advocate of the Office of the Attorney General's Crime Victim's Response Unit assigned to the case, affirming one of the following:

- (1) the victim has been notified of the terms of the plea agreement and has indicated agreement; or
- (2) the victim has been notified of the terms of the plea agreement and has indicated disagreement; or
- (3) reasonable and documented attempts were made to notify the victim of the terms of the plea agreement, but the victim did not respond; or
- (4) reasonable and documented attempts were made to notify the victim of the terms of the plea agreement, but the victim could not be located.

Such certification shall be attached to the plea agreement submitted to the court, and the court shall not accept any plea agreement lacking such certification."
