Håfa Adai Mister Speaker,

Last month, the Guam Legislature passed two pieces of legislation aimed at addressing local election practices. Bill No. 153-38 amends the voter threshold per precinct from "substantially over 800" to 1,200. The outlined benefits of reducing overhead costs and accommodating current voter behavior help GEC prepare for the upcoming election cycle.

Bill No. 154-38 reinstates the requirement for documentary proof of U.S. citizenship as part of the voter registration process. GEC provided testimony that it has already begun verifying citizenship documentation since March 2025, contrary to the current local law and a federal preliminary injunction. However, this step anticipates aligning Guam's laws with potential changes to election requirements by the federal government.

AN ACT TO AMEND § 3102(a) AND ADD A NEW § 3102.1(h) TO CHAPTER 3, TITLE 3, AND AMEND § 3103.3(c)(1) OF CHAPTER 3, TITLE 16, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO REQUIRING UNITED **STATES DOCUMENTARY PROOF OF VOTER CITIZENSHIP ALIGN GUAM** TO REGISTRATION **PRACTICES** WITH **FEDERAL ELECTION INTEGRITY STANDARDS.** 

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds
- 3 that preserving the integrity of elections is essential to upholding the principles of

1 democracy and maintaining the public's trust in government institutions. Under both

federal and territorial law, the right to vote is reserved exclusively for United States

3 citizens.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that as it currently stands, voter registration procedures in Guam require applicants to submit an affidavit of registration before an authorized registration clerk or in accordance with absentee procedures, as established in Title 3 of the Guam Code Annotated. While applicants must declare under penalty of perjury that they are U.S. citizens, the law as it is does not mandate the submission of documentary proof of citizenship.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that on March 25, 2025, President Donald J. Trump issued Executive Order 14248, titled "Preserving and Protecting the Integrity of American Elections." The Order directs federal agencies to strengthen voter registration requirements by mandating documentary proof of U.S. citizenship and identity verification through the national mail voter registration form. It further encourages states and territories to adopt similar requirements to protect election integrity and public trusts.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that while Guam is not a state, the governing body is committed to upholding the highest standards of electoral integrity and to align territorial practices with evolving national policy. In light of Executive Order 14248, I Liheslatura finds it necessary to modernize Guam's voter registration laws to require valid, documentary proof of U.S. citizenship and government-issued photo identification as conditions of voter eligibility.

Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to authorize the Guam Election Commission (GEC) to implement these requirements, including the verification of documents, secure storage of citizenship and identification records, and necessary procedural adjustments to strengthen Guam's commitment to lawful,

1	secure, and transparent elections and ensure compliance with national election
2	integrity standards.
3	Section 2. § 3102(a) of Chapter 3, Title 3, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby
4	amended to read:
5	"(a) No person shall be registered as a voter, except by affidavit of
6	registration made before an authorized registration clerk or, in the case of an
7	absentee voter, pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 10 of this Title.
8	(1) Before such affidavit shall be made, the person shall state
9	if he or she is currently registered to vote in any other jurisdiction(s). If

**Section 5. Severability.** If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or inorganic, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.

**Section 6. Effective Date.** This Act shall be effective upon enactment.
