Håfa Adai Mr. Speaker,

Bill 163-38 aligns Guam with the best practices already adopted by many U.S. states by establishing a mechanism for the Transfer-on-Death (TOD) designation for motor vehicle titles, creating a low-cost, efficient process for transferring vehicle ownership upon the death of the owner.

For most Guam residents, a car is a significant asset. Currently, transferring a vehicle title after an owner's death often requires the lengthy, expensive, and stressful process of probate, which can take months and require legal assistance. This delay imposes a burden on grieving families and can risk the asset's value. Bill 163-38 directly addresses this issue, allowing owners to designate a beneficiary on the vehicle title so the vehicle can pass directly to the chosen loved one without the need for probate court or a formal will.

For these reasons, I sign Bill No. 163-38 (COR) into law as **Public Law No. 38-84**.





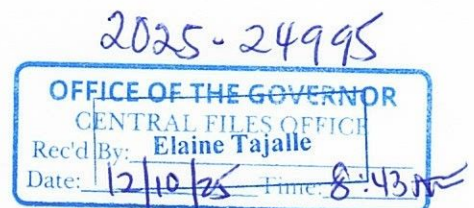

**AN ACT TO *ADD* A NEW § 7146.1 TO CHAPTER 7, TITLE
16, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO
TRANSFER-ON-DEATH BENEFICIARY DESIGNATION
FOR MOTOR VEHICLES.**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. A new § 7146.1 is *added* to Chapter 7, Title 16, Guam Code
Annotated, to read:

**“§ 7146.1. Transfer-on-Death Designation of Beneficiary for
Motor Vehicles; Transfer on Ownership.**

1 (a) The owner or joint owners of a motor vehicle may apply
2 to the Department of Revenue and Taxation (hereafter the
3 “Department”) to issue a certificate of title in beneficiary form for the
4 motor vehicle which includes a directive to the Department to transfer
5 the certificate of title for the vehicle upon the death of the owner or
6 upon the death of all joint owners to a beneficiary named on the face of
7 the certificate of title.

8 (b) A request made pursuant (a) above must be submitted on
9 an application made available by the Department and accompanied by
10 the fee required for issuance of a certificate of title.

11 (c) If the requirements of this Section are met, on the death of
12 the sole or all joint owners of a vehicle owned in beneficiary form, the
13 vehicle belongs to the surviving beneficiary, if any. If there is no
14 surviving beneficiary, the vehicle belongs to the estate of the deceased
15 owner or of the last co-owner to die.

16 (d) A certificate of title in beneficiary form may not be issued
17 to a person who holds an interest in a motor vehicle as a tenant in
18 common with another person.

19 (e) A certificate of title in beneficiary form must include, after
20 the name of the owner or after the names of joint owners, the words
21 “transfer on death to” or the abbreviation “TOD” followed by the name
22 of the beneficiary.

23 (f) During the lifetime of a sole owner or before the death of
24 the last surviving joint owner, the signature or consent of the
25 beneficiary is not required for any transaction relating to a motor
26 vehicle for which a certificate of title in beneficiary form has been

1 issued; and the certificate of title in beneficiary form may be revoked
2 or the beneficiary changed at any time by:

3 (1) Sale of the motor vehicle with proper assignment
4 and delivery of the certificate of title to another person, or

5 (2) Filing an application with, and paying a fee to, the
6 Department to reissue the certificate of title with no designation
7 of a beneficiary or with the designation of a different beneficiary

8 (g) The interest of the beneficiary in a motor vehicle on the
9 death of the sole owner or the death of the last surviving joint owner is
10 subject to any contract of sale, assignment, or ownership or security
11 interest to which the owner or owners of the motor vehicle were subject
12 during their lifetime.

13 (h) Except as otherwise provided in (f), the designation of a
14 beneficiary in a certificate of title in beneficiary form may not be
15 changed or revoked by will, any other instrument or a change in
16 circumstances, or otherwise changed or revoked.

17 (i) The surviving beneficiary may secure a transfer of
18 ownership for the vehicle upon presenting to the Department all of the
19 following:

20 (1) The appropriate certificate of ownership.

21 (2) A certificate under penalty of perjury stating the
22 date and place of the owner's death and that the declarant is
23 entitled to the vehicle as the designated beneficiary.

24 (3) If required by the Department, a certificate of the
25 death of the owner

26 (j) For the purposes of complying with the provisions of this
27 Section, the Department may rely on a death certificate, record, or

1 report that constitutes *prima facie* evidence of death of an owner of a
2 motor vehicle.

3 (k) The transfer on death of a motor vehicle pursuant to this
4 Section is not testamentary and is not subject to the provisions of
5 Guam's probate laws.

6 (l) In the instance a vehicle is owned by multiple owners, a
7 transfer on death designation shall become effective only when each
8 owner has signed a single transfer on death designation to the same
9 beneficiary(ies), and each owner has died without revoking the
10 designation or naming a new beneficiary.

11 (m) Definitions:

12 (1) "Motor Vehicle" means a motor vehicle as defined
13 in § 1102 of Chapter 1, Title 16, Guam Code Annotated.

14 (2) "Beneficiary" means a person or persons designated
15 to become the owner or owners of a motor vehicle on the death
16 of the preceding owner or owners

17 (3) "Certificate of title in beneficiary form" means a
18 certificate of title of a motor vehicle that indicates the present
19 owner or owners of the motor vehicle and designates a
20 beneficiary.

21 (n) Public Information Disclosure Requirement. Within
22 ninety (90) days following the enactment of this Section, the
23 Department of Revenue and Taxation shall develop, publish, and make
24 available to the public, informational materials summarizing the
25 provisions of this Section and the process for obtaining and recording a
26 certificate of title in beneficiary form. These materials shall include, at
27 minimum:

1 (1) A plain-language summary of the rights and
2 responsibilities of vehicle owners, beneficiaries, and lienholders;

3 (2) Instructions for submitting and recording a transfer-
4 on-death beneficiary designation; and

5 (3) Notice that any existing lien or security interest
6 remains enforceable against the vehicle.

7 The Department shall post such information on its official website,
8 make printed copies available at its Motor Vehicle Division (MVD) locations,
9 and distribute the materials to any applicant requesting a certificate of title or
10 transfer under this Section.”
