**AN ACT TO *AMEND* §§ 3104 AND 3110(b) OF CHAPTER
3, TITLE 3, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, AS ENACTED
BY PUBLIC LAW 38-32, RELATIVE TO ADJUSTING
VOTER TIMES OF REGISTRATION AND THE TERM
OF APPOINTMENT FOR REGISTRATION CLERKS.**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that the Guam Election Commission depends on registration clerks to support voter registration efforts ahead of elections. Under § 3110 of Chapter 3, Title 3, Guam Code Annotated, as enacted by Public Law 38-32, registration clerks currently serve until forty-five (45) days before a general election.

The Commission has since identified that a shorter appointment period would better reflect its operational needs and improve efficiency. Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to amend § 3110 to reduce the term of appointment from forty-five (45) days to twenty-one (21) days before a general election, allowing the Commission greater flexibility while continuing to ensure timely access to voter registration services.

1 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that the Guam Election Commission
2 recommends that the time of registration codified in § 3104 of Title 3, Guam Code
3 Annotated, be amended to fifteen (15) days from ten (10) days, to ensure consistency
4 across all registration deadlines. This amendment will ensure that volunteer, online,
5 and motor voter registration will all close twenty-one (21) days before an election,
6 while district registration at the mayors’ offices and the Guam Election Commission
7 will close fifteen (15) days before an election. It is therefore the intent of *I*
8 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* to ensure consistency by also amending § 3104 of Title 3,
9 Guam Code Annotated.

10 **Section 2.** § 3104 of Chapter 3, Title 3, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby
11 *amended* to read:

12 **“§ 3104. Times of Registration.**

13 Fifteen (15) days prior to any election, the registration rolls shall be
14 closed, and no further affidavits of registration shall be accepted by the
15 Commission.”

16 **Section 3.** § 3110(b) of Chapter 3, Title 3, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby
17 *amended* to read:

18 **“§ 3110. Qualifications of Registration Clerks; Term of**
19 **Appointment.**

20 (b) Any elector appointed as a registration clerk shall serve a limited
21 term, which shall begin from the date of appointment until midnight on the
22 day that is twenty-one (21) days before the next election. The Commission
23 shall promulgate policies and procedures to carry out the intent of this Section.
24 The Commission may also establish other terms of appointment, consistent
25 with the intent of this Section, for special elections, plebiscites, initiatives and
26 any other non-general elections as they deem necessary to allow for voter
27 registration to be conducted by duly appointed registration clerks.”

1 **Section 3. Severability.** If any provision of this Act or its application to any
2 person or circumstance is found to be invalid or inorganic, such invalidity shall not
3 affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without
4 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are
5 severable.

6 **Section 4. Effective Date.** This Act shall be effective upon enactment.
